#### Torpedoed at Sea

#### By Kathryn Brunmond

Two McLeod county men, Allyn Ahlers and Jos. Davy of Stewart, lived through a harrowing experience in World War 1 when their ship was torpedoed and sank.

They were aboard the Tuscania, a British vessel converted to a troop carrier. As it happened Davy was one of the more fortunate men assigned to the first life-boats and thus quickly reached a rescue destroyer but Ahlers was among the last to be saved.

Ahlers was a member of the 100th air squadron aboard the thip.

This is a squadron aboard the thirt. The carrier housed 2,156 American soldiers and airmen and 237 ship's officers and soamen plus two lone women, both English skew-ardesses.

The trip over was uneventful until they entered the Gulf
Stream where they were in the danger zone. From then on all
slept in their clothes with life-belts hung at the heads of their
bunks. Now the ships were zigzagging for safety. On February 4th the convoy was joined by 8 British destroyers to bring
them into Liverpool.

February 5th dawned dark and cloudy with choppy seas. But at 4 p.m. those aboard were cheered by their first sight of land - the high rocky shores of the Scottish coast. Now all thought they were surely safe.

The enemy struck amidships without warning at 6:45 p.m., the torpedo tearing into the engine room on the starboard side.

Another one instantly followed, killing all men on watch there and the engine room and adjacent stokehole quickly filled with steam and water.

# WAS ABOARD THE TUSCANIA

WRITES TO HIS SISTER.

#### TELLS OF HIS EXPERIENCES

Burvivors Given a Continuous Ovation on Their Trip Through Ireland—Escorted About Streets of Various Cities by Bands.

Aberdeen. S. D., March 13.—Special: Mrs. F. L. Christenson, an Aberdeen resident, has just received a letter from her brother, Allen Ahlers, a former student at the Northern Normal and Industrial school at Aberdeen, who was aboard the Tuscania when it was sunk by a submarine off the Irish coast.

Mr. Ahlers took a course in aviation in Texas and was transferred to Long Island to finish the course, getting a grade of §7, second highest of any member of his class, upon graduating.

Young Ahlers had been active in base-ball, basketball and other athletic activities at the normal, and in the aviation field studied mechanics as well as the art of flying and maneuvering an airplane. For this reason his services were in demand for the aviation corps as soon as he finished on Long Island, and he was sent to Europe on the Tuscania.

Writing of his experiences on the Tuscania and after his arrival in England, Mr. Ahlers says:

Have finally reached England and we are in an American rest camp here. Our bunch happened to be on the Tuscania, which was torpedoed off the Irish coast, and we were landed in Ireland. We traveled across Ireland by train from one end to the other and it certainly is the prettiest place I ever hope to see. We were surely treated royally there by There were fifty of us everyone. gether, all from our squadron, and we were escorted through the cities where we changed cars by bands and were met at stations by people with cigarets and lunches. We stayed a couple of days at two different English army posts and were given what extra clothes we need-I am wearing a British coat, overcoat, hat and leggings, and some of the fellows have complete English uniforms We lost all our equipment except what we had on or in our pockets.

We were hit at 5:45 p. m. I got out of it without even getting my feet wet. I got on a destroyer which pulled up along-side of us after they had bagged the sub. I could have gotten in a lifeboat, but thought I would rather take my chances on the ship because she was not sinking fast, and I am glad I did now, because the fellows in the lifeboats had a pretty tough time, and some of our fellows who pulled in yesterday and who were in the boat I had been assigned to, said they had been wrecked on the shores of Scotland and several of the fellows were killed when they hit the rocks.

killed when they hit the rocks.

I was on the Tuscania two and a half-hours before I got on the destroyer. We lost seventeen of our squad out of 154, but a couple of those missing there may still turn up, although most are accounted for.

We are in a dandy camp here. We are living in barracks, and are being fed as well as I expected, so have no reason to complain, and am feeling fine and having a good time. We have two dandy Y. M. C. A. huts here, and am in one now. We received new toilet articles today from the Red Cross. The weather is like spring here, and everything is green. The country is quite hilly and very pretty.

I was made corporal, dating from January 1, and am in charge of a squad of eight men, and do not have to do fatigue or kitchen work, and get \$6 a month increase besides 20 per cent extra for foreign work.



#### Notes: [from Find A Grave]

His parents moved from Red Wing MN to Stewart MN in 1903. His father John and John's brother Alfred formed a partnership to run the Ahlers Brothers general merchandise store in Stewart, which was still in operation at the time of Allyn's death, operated by his son Allyn Robert ("Bud"). Graduate Stewart HS.

Attended Aberdeen Normal in Aberdeen SD, where he was active in athletics. After completing the course in business education, he enlisted in the Army Signal Corps. His military training was at Kelly Field (San Antonio TX). He served overseas in England & France in WWI. He was one of the few survivors of the "Tuscania." [not accurate] After the war, he returned to Stewart MN where he joined his father in the family business.

When his father John died in 1930, Allyn took complete charge of the store & was joined in running the store in 1945 by his son Bud upon Bud's return from WWII. In 1967 ill health forced him to take a less active role in store operation He retired completely about 10 years prior to his death. Then a series of strokes confined him to his home.

On 21 Nov 1920 he married Esther Macheledt in Minneapolis; the couple made their home in Stewart. She worked with him in the store. The couple had one son & 2 daughters. He remained at home until he was hospitalized 12 Nov 1979. He was the first commander of the American Legion post in Stewart when it was formed. He was a member of the Stewart Town Band, for many years on the school board, and a charter member of the Lions Club & Stewart Businessmen's Association.

In 1958, the IGA Grocery Store in Stewart had been operated by the Ahlers family for 88 years.

The McLeod County MN historical documents note that three generations of the Ahlers family ran the Stewart store. The building was built in the 1890s. It was operated by the family until 1990 & "is now a house."

#### Wartime:

"Sioux City (IA) Journal" 14 Mar 1918 p 4 – Mrs. F.L. Christenson [sister Ruth] of Aberdeen SD got a letter from her brother Allen [sic] Ahlers, formerly a student at the Northern Normal & Industrial School in Aberdeen. He completed a course in aviation in TX, then went to Long Island NY to finish the course. He got a grade of 27, the second-highest in the unit. At Aberdeen he was active in baseball, basketball & other athletics. He was promoted to corporal 1 Jan 1918.
