In addition to the Pittsburghers known to have been aboard the ill-fated Tuscania when that liner was torpedoed by a Hun U-boat Tuesday, three more names were learned today:

Charles Lee Thompson and Marvin W. Alcock, former employees of the Westinghouse interests here, were aboard the transport. Both are members of the Twentieth Engineers and well-known throughout this section. Thompson is a graduate of Endeavor High School and later studied engineering in Cornell University. He was a member of the University Band and after leaving school returned here to engage in the lumber business. He enlisted in the forestry service. For two years Thompson was a member of the Tionesta baseball team.

Roy K. Brown, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. K. Brown, entered training in December at Columbus, later being sent to Washington, where he finished his military studies in the American University.

Washington, Feb. 11.—The war department today is making earnest effort to clear up definitely the list of the missing on board the torpedoed Tuscania. The figures still stood at 113, but there is strong possibility this would be changed when definite lists are complete. One thousand eight hundred thirty-two names of survivors have been made public, leaving 345 to come.

On the ill-fated transport Tuscania, Forest county was represented by four sons, two of whom "so far have not been reported among the survivors." Though 345 Sammies are reported as missing, 200 are believed to be in hospitals. The men from Forest county still missing, but whose death is not confirmed, are:

Corporal Clea Bagerstok, 20th Engineers, Marienville; mother, Rilla Bagerstok.

Private Charles L. Thompson, Endeavor; father, C. G. Thompson.

The other two Forest county lads aboard the transport and reported among the survivors, are Private Marvin W. Alcock, of Endeavor, and Private Chester H. Jones, of Endeavor.

Letters have been received from all three of the Endeavor boys who were on board the Tuscania when she went

down. When the explosion occurred Private Marvin W. Alcock slid down a rope on to the deck of a torpedo boat destroyer and was safe, while Privates Charles L. Thompson and Chester H. Jones were both thrown into the sea and were picked up later and taken to shore by the life boats. Not one of them seems to know anything about Corporal Bargerstock who was lost.--'Honesty Vindicator.

DEPUTY BRAVES GUN TO ARREST TERRORIST

Leader of Roadhouse Marauders
Captured at Riverside Resort.
Dancers Terrified.

Special to the BUFFALO EVENING NEWS.

JAMESTOWN, Sept. 5.—Terrifying the patrons of four roadhouses in the town of Carroll and other villages along the Frewsburg road, and finally offering armed defiance to a police officer, M. W. Alcock, Endeavor, Pa., was arrested Sunday night by Deputy Sheriff Douglass Kropf of Celeron.

Kropf disregarded a loaded pistol Alcock leveled at his head as well as the threats of half a dozen of Alcock's companions. The arrest took place in the New Inn, a dancing resort at Riverside. Alcock was brought to the local city jail and will be arraigned Tuesday before a justice of the peace at Carroll.

Alcock led his gang in a series of invasions which threw terror into more than 100 persons. In each of the four resorts he entered he drove both patrons and custodians into the night. Sheriff Kropf visited each of the places before he finally caught up with his quarry. In each roadhouse, it is alleged, Alcock brandished his loaded pistol.

TITUSVILLE MAN DIES IN CRASH

Third Fatality in Three Days Occurs Near Scene Where Boys Met Death.

TITUSVILLE, April 22.—The third automobile fatality in three days, Marvin Wayne Alcock, 41, of 306 West Spring Street, died of a fractured neck while in an ambulance en route to Titusville Hospital, following an early morning accident on Route 27, Pleasantville-Titusville highway.

The car driven by J. G. Longstreth, 55, of Route 1, Townville, crashed into a concrete wall, within a mile of the scene where two Colestock High School youths met almost instant death on Monday afternoon.

Longstreth was driving a 1936 Chevrolet coupe and was traveling toward Titusville. Alcock was a passenger in the car.

Reports from Titusville Hospital later Wednesday indicated that the condition of Longstreth, who suffered numerous cuts and bruises, as well as internal injuries, was "not so good."

Alcock was a former resident of Endeavor, where his mother, Mrs. Jerome Arters, now resides.

The accident happened at 1:40 a. m., according to Officer J. A. Gancas, of the State Motor Police. He found that the car had swung off the side of the road, traveling about 120 feet on the berm before it hit the concrete wall, and then crumpled up. The accident occurred near the foot of a steep down grade, and there was evidence that the automobile was traveling at a high rate of speed at the time.

Joseph Lewis, 17, and Laverne Fenton, Jr., 16, Colestock High School students, critically injured in Monday's fatal wreck on the highway at East Titusville, grimly held onto life at Titusville Hospital today. Meanwhile, the city mourned the tragic deaths of John E. Paulich, 16, and Bruce Gilson, same age, honor student of the junior class.

The impact of their car against a concrete wall was so terrific that it was an hour before Gilson's body was extracted.

Several blood transfusions have been administered to Lewis, who has a multiple fracture of the right leg, fractured right ankle, head injuries and lacerations and is suffering greatly from shock. Fenton, driver of the car, suffered a severe pelvic injury and lacerations. Lewis's condition was reported today to be somewhat better than that of Fenton.

Funerals of Paulich and Gilson will take place on Thursday. Members of the Colestock High School faculty and many students pay their tribute of respect to the well-liked young men, visiting the funeral establishments where their bodies lay, on Tuesday evening.

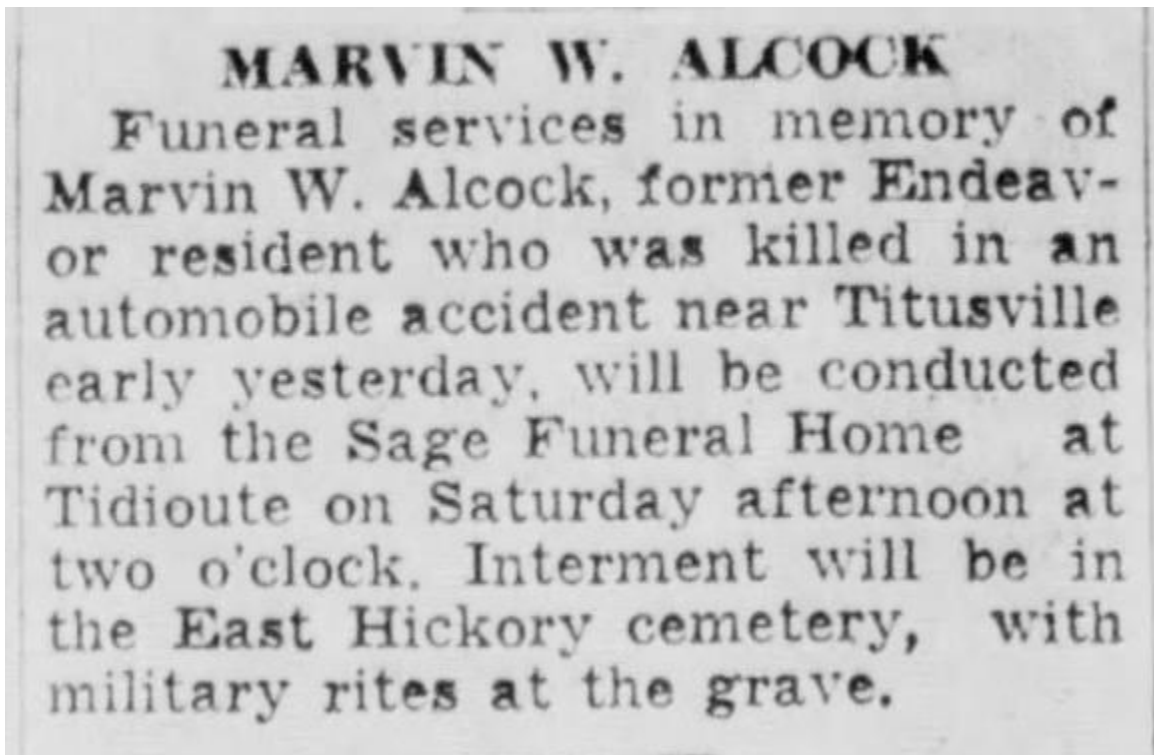
