Walter Alexander, 86, route 1, Rushville, died Friday night at the Atchison hospital shortly after arrival.

Funeral services will be held Monday at 2 p.m. at the Sawin-Dyer chapel with the Rev. Robert McKinzie, Lewis and Clark Baptist church, officiating. Burial will be in Mt. Bethel cemetery near Weston.

Fleming-Jackson-Seever American Legion Post No. 6 will conduct the flag-folding ceremony at the grave. Members of the family will receive friends from 7 to 9 tonight at the Mortuary.

Mr. Alexander was born near Rushville and lived on the same farm all his life. He was a member of the Sugar Creek Christian church, IOOF lodge at DeKalb and was a member of the American Legion.

He served in the Army during World War I, and was with the infantry in Germany and France. He was the first tobacco grower in Platte county.

About 20 years ago he retired from active farming. His favorite sport was baseball and he enjoyed watching the Cardinals and the Royals.

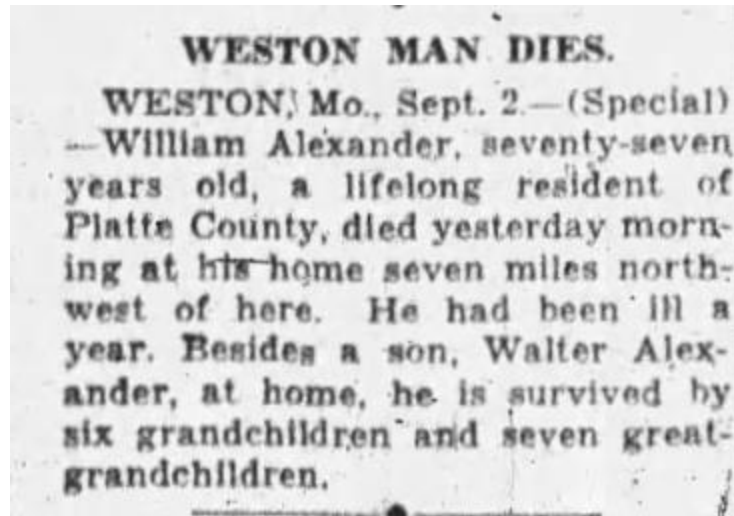

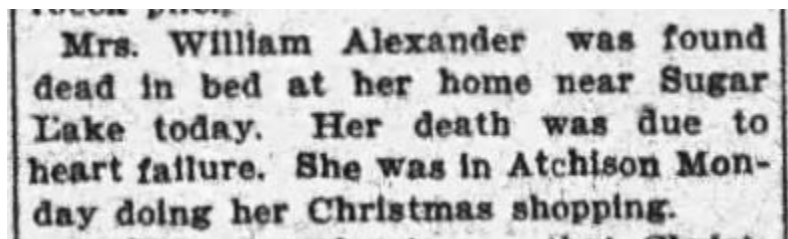
