Temple Boy Loses Life on the Tuscania-The fate of George A. ALTWEIN of Temple
who was aboard the Tuscania when it was sunk by a German submarine Feb. 5, has
been definitely settled and the war department has advised his parents, Mr. an Mrs.
Fred W. ALTWEIN of this city that their son is officially reported among the missing.
George ALTWEIN was twenty-one years of age, his birthday occurring June 3rd, just
two days prior to the date of registration for the draft. A difference of three days in
his birth was the difference between life and death, for had his natal day occurred
that much later he would not have been within registration age and the tale might
have been different. He had resided here since he was three years of age and was
well known to many people. He was in the first contingent sent to Camp Travis. Of
the eight Bell county boys who were on the ill-fated transport, seven escaped injury
and death. ALTWEIN being the sole sacrifice. (Note to File: SS Tuscania: On the
evening of February 5th, 1918, a German U-boat sent the Tuscania to the bottom of
the North Channel Sea)

Temple, Tex., Feb. 11.—Two of the eight Bell county boys aboard the torpedoed transport Tuscania had not been heard from up to a late hour today. They are George A. Altwein; parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred W. Altwein of Temple, and Bernard H. Ray, parents, Mr. and Mrs. S. J. Ray, near Heidenheimer. Both men left here with the drafted contingent from Camp Travis in September and in December were ordered to a camp in New Jersey. Those officially reported as safe are Robert L. Holley, Harry Ellison and Lewis H. McCann of Temple, and William C. Mann of Salado, George W. Dunlap of Little River and Milton T. Blankenship of Rogers.

MANY TEXANS ON NEW LIST OF DEAD FROM TUSCANIA

By Associated Press.

WASHINGTON, March 30.—Today's casualty list contains fifty-five names, twenty-five of them soldiers lost in the sinking of the Tuscania. These were reported as missing at sea, but have been positively identified by finger prints taken from the bodies.

The list is divided as follows:

Killed in action, 2; died of wounds, 4; died of disease, 14; died of accident, 2; died, cause unknown, 1; wounded slightly, 7; previously reported missing at sea, not reported dead, 25.

The only officer named in today's list was Lieut. Howard H. Davis, who was slightly wounded.

The report lists cases which obviously show terrible abuses of the pardons and paroles system.

"The stated purposes of the Texas Penal Code is to protect the public and punish the offender," the report said. "At the rate convicts have been turned loose from the penitentiary during the past few years, it would seem that neither of these purposes is being achieved."

A typical case reported by the committee follows:

"Arthur H. Altwein, white male, was sentenced to 20 years for murder with malice from Milam County on Aug. 4, 1936. The records show that while a trusty he was found drunk while driving an automobile. On May 14, 1942, he was given a six months reprieve and on Nov. 11, 1942, he was returned to prison as a parole violator. On Nov. 4, 1944, he was assessed 93 hours solitary confinement for drunkenness and fighting—yet, on Jan. 15, 1945, two months after this last offense, he was given a six months reprieve which, on July 14, 1945, was extended one year."
