



Hunt Fatal to Youth, 19

Dayton Anderson, 1378 E. Seventh street, St. Paul, was fatally injured late yesterday while celebrating his nineteenth birthday on a hunting trip with three friends.

He was struck by a charge from a .22 caliber rifle, which one of the friends, Harold Cartier, 18, 916 Clarence street, St. Paul, was dismantling in Anderson's car after having shot a squirrel. The bullet struck Anderson in the chest.

Anderson was placed in the car of Roland Dufresne, 23, 1331 Stillwater avenue, St. Paul, and taken to a physician at Hugo, Minn., who advised them to rush him to Bethesda hospital.

At St. Paul city limits the car was stopped for speeding, but the police car then escorted the other machine.

Anderson was dead, however, on arrival at the hospital. He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Anderson, and one sister, Lois.

Howard Proulx, 23, 1326 Stillwater avenue, St. Paul, was another member of the hunting party.

Dayton Anderson was shot in the chest on his 19th birthday by a .22-caliber rifle being dismantled in Dayton's car by one of the three friends who had joined him on a hunting trip in Anoka County MN to celebrate his birthday. The friend was Harold Cartier, age 18, 916 Clarence St., St. Paul MN. Cartier had just shot a squirrel.

Dayton was placed in the car of friend Roland Dufresne, 23, 1331 Stillwater Ave., St. Paul. The friends took him to a doctor in Hugo MN, who told them to rush Dayton to Bethesda Hospital in St. Paul MN. After the police stopped them at the St. Paul city limits for speeding, the police provided an escort to the hospital, where Dayton was pronounced dead on arrival. He was survived by his parents, Albert Harold Anderson & Myrtle Irene (Williams) Anderson, and sister Lois Anderson (later Mrs. Russell Laub). On 22 October 1940, his parents cancelled the invitations to 19 guests to celebrate Dayton's 19th birthday and instead made funeral arrangements.
