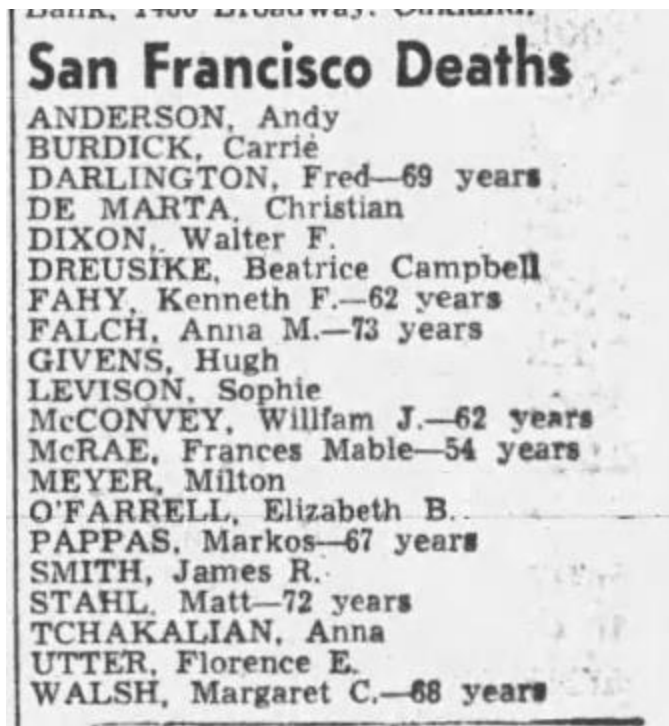

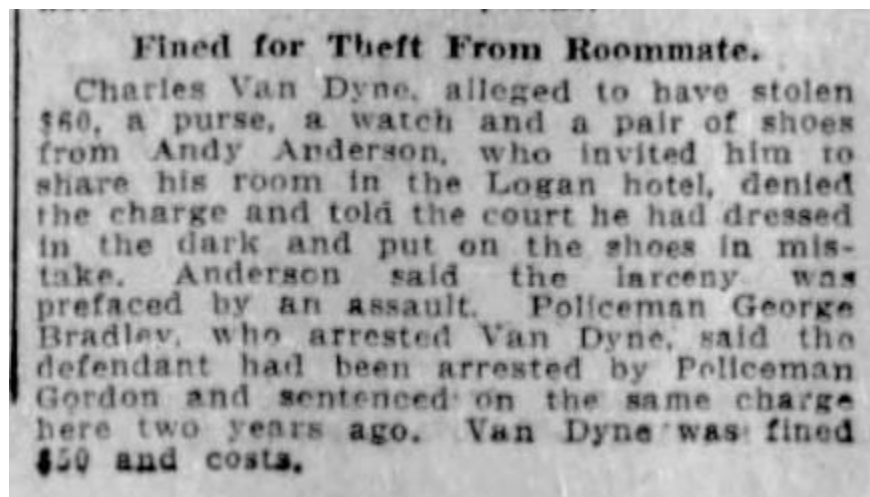

## GREAT NUMBER FOR TODAY

Three Different Parties Are on the  
Way Here From Montana to  
Take Up Service.

The enlistments yesterday at the army recruiting station numbered 157. Captain Kelso announced that 86 recruits were on their way from Butte, 44 on another train from Great Falls and Missoula, and 121 on another Great Northern train from Montana, who will be enlisted at the Spokane recruiting station today.

Naval Surgeon J. A. B. Sinclair yesterday examined more than 80 young men at the navy recruiting station, of whom 75 were enlisted.

Tonight a party of navy recruits will leave for the Coast in two special sleepers.

The total enlistments for the day at the two stations was 232, Spokane furnishing a considerable number.

## ANDY ANDERSON RETAINS TITLE; IN JAIL AGAIN

After a close and exciting campaign Andy Anderson, logger, has assumed the honor of being arrested more than any other man or woman in Spokane.

By his arrest this morning on a charge of drunkenness, his old favorite offense, he obtained the leadership, bringing his total to 65. Upon pleading guilty in police court he was given 10 days of immunity from arrest by remaining in jail.

Maggie Mills, who up to today has maintained a tie with Andy, has reformed, and so is no longer eligible. But Frank ("Pegleg") Johnson has an opportunity to contest the championship.

Being confined in the county jail, with several months yet to serve on a drunkenness charge, "Pegleg" has had no opportunity to keep up with Andy, and his record has suffered on that account. He now has but 63 arrests to his credit, and is running but a poor third.
