Born 18 Jan 1879 Baldwin, St. Croix WI. Daughter of Ole T. or E. Rolstad (1845-1892) & Anna Nelson (1847-1922).

Ruth married Ernest J. Nelson on 22 Sep 1897 in Barron Co. WI.

Ernest Nelson (2 Mar 1874 Sweden -30 Oct 1958 Barron Co. WI), was an automobile dealer in Barron, Barron WI, was the son of Nels Johann Anderson & Charlotte Carolina Jones.

The childless couple of Ruth & Ernest arranged to have three children of Ernest's sister sent from Sweden to the US to raise as their own. They were Carl Martin, Helga M. and Dagmar C. Anderson.

According to the declaration of intent to become a citizen of "Martin" Anderson, he came to the US from Gothenburg, Sweden, aboard a ship whose name he could not remember, arriving in NYC on 15 Jun 1902.

Helga M. worked at the Normanna Savings Bank. When it failed, she worked for the Bank of Barron WI.

Dagmar Anderson left Barron but would return yearly for a time & stay at a cottage on Poskin Lake that Ruth owned.

Carl survived the sinking of the "Tuscania" on 5 Feb 1918 but in Jan 1919 was hospitalized in France suffering from tuberculosis, where he died 15 Apr 1919. Originally buried in France, his body was returned to the US & buried in Barron, Barron WI on 10 Oct 1920.

Ruth & Ernest were married as of the 1920 census but divorced by the 1930 census. Ernest remarried Emma (1888-1963) & is buried in Orchard Beach Cemetery, Rice Lake, Barron WI, F: 126561345 with Emma.

Ruth & Helga lived together. Helga inherited the house after Ruth died. She never married. Ruth Rolstad Nelson died in Barron Co. WI on 12 Jul 1969 & is buried in Barron Cemetery, Barron, Barron WI, F: 11835964. She shares her tombstone with Helga
