

Flora D. Baker, 96, Mattoon, died Sunday, March 8, 1987, at her home.

The former Flora Phillips was born Oct. 28, 1890, in Crandon, daughter of Miles and Minnie Phillips. She married Irvin Baker, in Mattoon, July 4, 1942. He died Aug. 8, 1964. She was previously married to the late Lester McAuly and the late George Cook.

Mrs. Baker was a graduate of the former Stevens Point Normal School. She was Sunday school superintendent and treasurer of the Church of the Nazarene, Mattoon. She enjoyed rug weaving.
