Less than a year ago he offered his services to his country and received his training at
Camp Travis, and embarked
from a New Jersy port on the
illfated transport, the Tuscania,
which was torpedoed by a German submarine near the Irish
coast. As the great ship settled, young Anderson jumped
twelve feet to a life boat and after hours of privation and suffering he was landed. After a
short rest he was hurried to
France, where he is now with
the great American hosts, who
are threshing the Huns.


