The Minneapolis Tribune today publishes the Army's Honor List of Dead and Missing for the state of Minnesota as compiled by the war department. This list of 6,462 names contains the latest and most complete data available on all army personnel who were killed or died, or became and remained missing between the president's declaration of unlimited national emergency on May 27, 1941 and the cutoff date of this report, Jan. 31, 1946.

The state of Minnesota contained 2.08 per cent of the population of the United States and possessions (excluding the Philippine islands) in 1940. Minnesota contributed 1.93 per cent of the total number who entered the army. Of the Minnesotans who went to war as members of the army 3.36 per cent failed to return. This figure represents 2.11 per cent of the army's total dead and missing.

On these pages, the names are listed alphabetically, by counties. The counties are in alphabetical order, also. The last name is listed first, followed by given names, the rank which the citizen held in the army, and three key letters which tell the cause of death. These letters mean:

Nereson Pioneer Woman Answers Last Summons

1941

Death claimed one of our early settlers Sunday morning when Mrs. Inga Anderson of Nereson entered her last rest. She had been ailing for over two years and during the last few days it was her prayer that she would soon be relieved of her suffering. Death was due to hardening of the arteries.

Inga Anderson was born in Oslo, Norway, Nov. 11, 1848, and came to America and settled in Mower county near Lyle when she was 16 years old. There she met her husband, Knute M. Anderson, to whom she was married in August of 1887 at Sioux City, Iowa. They lived for several years in Mower county, but in the fall of 1906 the family decided to homestead in Roseau county, and they moved to the homestead in Nereson in November of that year. Since that time Mrs. Anderson had lived on the same farm until her death.

Of eight children born to the Andersons three daughters are dead. Mr. Anderson also passed away 9 years ago. One daughter, Maud, lost her life in the great prairie fire of 1917. She was then 6 years old. Her clothing caught fire before help could reach her and she was badly burned. The others were Myrtle and Ora. Surviving Mrs. Anderson are the following sons and daughters: Mrs. T. M. White (Cora) of Austin, Omer Anderson of Washington, D. C., Dewey Anderson who lives on a farm near home, and Emily and Kenneth at home. There are also 10 grandchildren and 3 great-grand children. An adopted sister, Mrs. C. M. Anderson lives in Minneapolis.

The funeral will be held tomorrow (Thursday) at 2 o'clock p. m. at the Nannestad church with Rev. Victor O. Erickson of Roseau officiating. Burial will be beside her husband in the Nannestad cemetery.

Services for Mrs. Alma E. Anderson, 80, 3816 28th Av. S., who died Thursday, will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday at the Henry W. Anderson Mortuary; 3640 23rd Av. S., and at 2:30 p.m. at Pleasant Hill Cemetery, Moline, Iowa.

Mrs. Anderson was born in Risor, Norway. She was a member of Bethesda Free Church.

Survivors include five sons, Howard I., Clyde M. and Russell C., all of Minneapolis, and Merwin E. and Grant E., both of Portland, Ore., and four daughters, Mrs. Carl J. Knutson, Mrs. Clarence E. Rich, Mrs. Stan Larson, and Mrs. Alwood Lee, all of Minneapolis.
