






Highway 70 Right-of-Way **Data Available**

Vigo County Surveyor and Engineer Claude E. Reese has received detailed information concerning Interstate 70 rightof-way properties from Austin Anderson, appraiser and negotiator for the Indiana State Highway Department.

The 60 pages of detailed plans concerning 56 parcels of land between the Illinois line and the Wabash river will be available in Reese's office for several days for study by inrerested parties.


