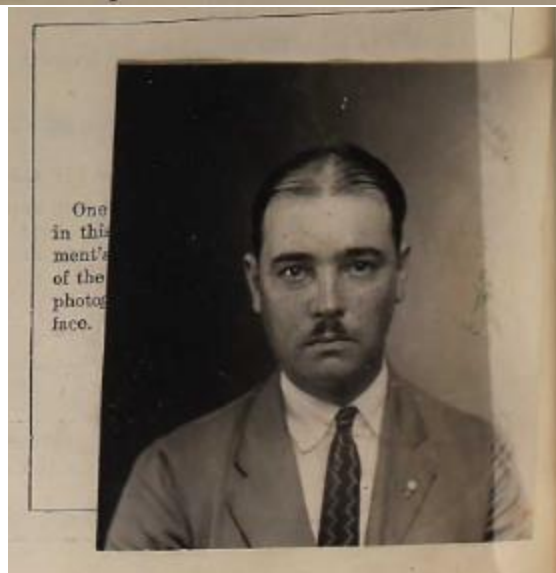

Many Friends At Rites For Wynne Abel

Services for E. Wynne Abel, former Port Chester resident who died Tuesday at the Kingsbridge Road Veterans' Hospital, Bronx, were held yesterday in a New York City funeral home, with the Rev. Ernest F. Neumann, minister of Summerfield Methodist Church, Port Chester, officiating. Interment was in Greenwood Union Cemetery, Rye. The funeral was conducted by C. Warren Flint, of Port Chester, a cousin, who is associated with the Ossining firm of S. C. Kipp, Jr., and Son. Numerous Port Chester relatives and friends of the Abel family attended.

Mr. Abel, who left Port Chester in 1924, had resided in London Terrace Apartments, 24th Street, New York City. He had been in poor health about a year but did not become seriously ill until six weeks ago, and was confined to the hospital less than 24 hours. Death was caused by complications.

On Torpedoed Ship

Born in Port Chester 46 years ago, Mr. Abel was the son of Bernard Abel and the late Marion L. Flint Abel. He was educated in the Port Chester schools and private schools in Dobbs Ferry and Hackettstown, N. J. He went overseas during the World War, as a member of the 213th Aviation Squadron, aboard the *Tuscania*, British ship carrying American soldiers, which was torpedoed Feb. 5, 1918.

When the ship was struck, Mr. Abel slid down the side on a rope and managed to grasp a lifeboat. On the same ship were George Donnelly, Oliver Flood, the late Frank O'Toole and the late Michael Katz, all of Port Chester and all of whom escaped. Mr. Abel was wounded in action in France, served until the end of the war and then returned to the old Abel homestead at 22 Sound View Street.

He was associated with J. W. Pfeiffer and Son, at Washington Market, New York City, in the buying and selling of wholesale fruits and produce. In his youth he had belonged to the old First Congregational Church of Port Chester and later became a member of Mamaro Lodge 653, F. & A. M., the Duo Dec Club and the Harry Howard Hook and Ladder Co.

Beside his father, Mr. Abel leaves his wife and daughter; two sisters, Mrs. Eleanor Burke, of Madison, N. J., and Mrs. Doris Bolster, of Port Chester; an uncle, Clifford H. Flint, and an aunt, Mrs. W. F. Moger, both of Port Chester.

Harp and Charles Mead of Greenwich, and Oliver Flood, E. Wynne Abel, Frank O'Toole, Michael Katz, and George Donnelly of Port Chester. A cablegram was received from Abel by his father, Bernard Abel, this morning, which read as follows:

DRANABEL, Feb. 7, (11 A. M.)—Arrived safely in Ireland. WYNNE.

PORT CHESTER BOYS MEET IN FRANCE.

The following letter from Corporal Herman Raphael, of the 650th Aero Supply Squadron, American Expeditionary Force, France, tells in an interesting way of his meeting with another Port Chester boy while in camp. His friends in Port Chester will be glad to learn of young Raphael's promotion to the rank of Corporal. The letter follows:

France,
July 26, 1918.

Dear Mr. Blain:

I am getting the Items regularly every week and certainly do enjoy reading them. It is one of the finest things that has been done for the fellows of Westchester County, giving them the choice of their town newspaper, and Mr. William Boyce Thompson should be remembered by every county soldier in the service. I made good use of the application blank which was sent to me. There was a New Rochelle fellow in our squadron and he wrote for the New Rochelle Press.

I ran into a Port Chester boy the other day by a strange coincidence. It was lunch hour and we were engaged deeply in thought with a portion of roast beef and mashed potatoes in our squadron mess hall. About twenty new fellows who had just arrived, stopped in for dinner and I recognized one of them at once. It was no one else but Wynne Abel, of Sound View street, and there was at once a good old Port Chester handshake. He said he and the rest with him just came in on a trip from ———. They were all from the 231st Provisional Squadron that came over on the Tuscania, the boat which had such a bad ending.

I had a good talk with Abel and he related the whole story of the sinking of the Tuscania and of his narrow escape. Abel says that Michael Katz, Frank O'Toole and George Donnelly are still with him and are all in good health. Abel himself looks fine and says he never felt better in his life.

I have been promoted to the rank

of corporal and am chief clerk in the engineering office. We are very busy working almost every night, in order to keep up with the demand for planes that have to be towed out.

This last drive has put an awful crimp in the German army and just tell them all, I'll be back next spring.

The New York guests caught the last train to the city. Wynne was recently discharged. He returned from France in a casual company, coming by way of the Mediterranean and making a stop at an African port. When the Tuscania was torpedoed he had a narrow escape, but fortunately was not injured.

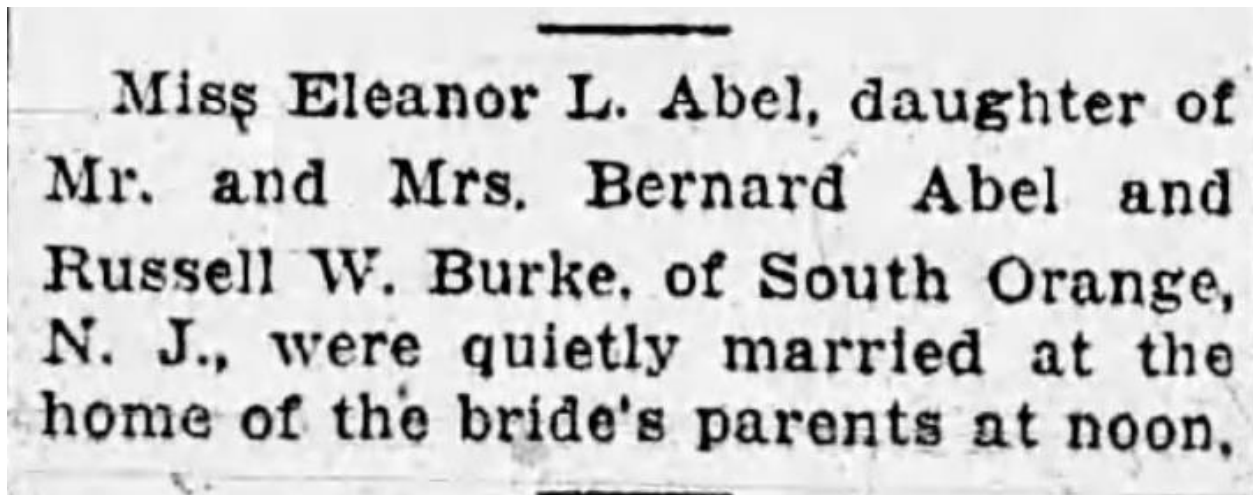

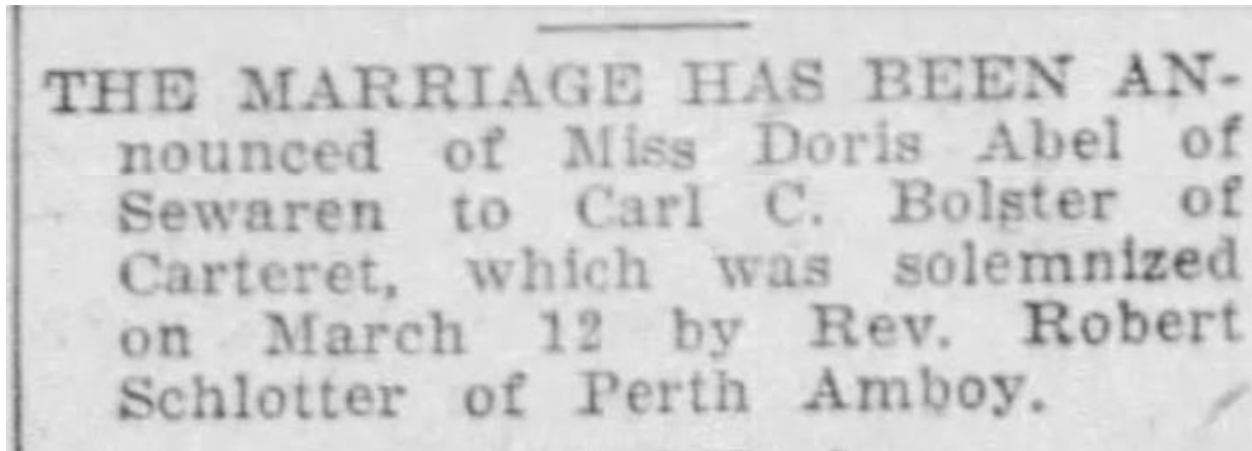
