CHARLES DANIEL ARENDELL

Mr. Arendell, 88 years old, of 1402 Berkshire Drive, West Palm Beach, died Monday, September 17, 1979. Mr. Arendell had been a resident of West Palm Beach since 1935, coming here from Atlanta, Ga. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of West Palm Beach; a Veteran of World War I and was a survivor of the torpedoing of the Troopship Tuscania in the North Atlantic.

He is survived by his wife: Jessie E. Arendell; and his son: J. Luther Arendell, both of West Palm Beach, Fl.; four sisters: Mrs. Mary Thompson and Mrs. Kate Stephenson, both of Birmingham, Ala. and Mrs. Cibbie McLaren and Mrs. Lurene Maddox, both of Atlanta, Ga.; a brother: Frank C. Arendell, also of Atlanta, Ga.; seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Possibility that Boyd E. Hancock, of Thomasville, was not on the transport is contained in a dispatch from The Journal's Thomasville correspondent, stating that Boyd is a member of the One Hundred and Sixth engineers, which is not given as one of the units on the Tuscania. He is the son of W. L. Hancock, a well-to-do farmer, and was going to France as a lumber inspector. He is twenty-seven years old, unmarried. He went to the colors under the selective service law last September, but about four weeks ago was home on furlough.

Dispatches from Jackson, Ga., state that Charles D. Arendell's family cannot be located there.

EIGHT GEORGIANS ON TORPEDOED BOAT

ONLY LIEUTENANT BOST OF ATLANTA HAS BEEN HEARD FROM; LIST OF THOSE ON BOARD.

Atlanta, Feb. 8.—That eight Georgians were on the torpedoed transport Tuscania, only one of whom is so far known to have been saved, was indicated by dispatches from Washington Friday.

Courtland S. Winn, Sr., received a telegram from Washington Friday from Congressman Brand, stating that the secretary of the navy had a partial list of the survivors, but that his son's name was not on the list.

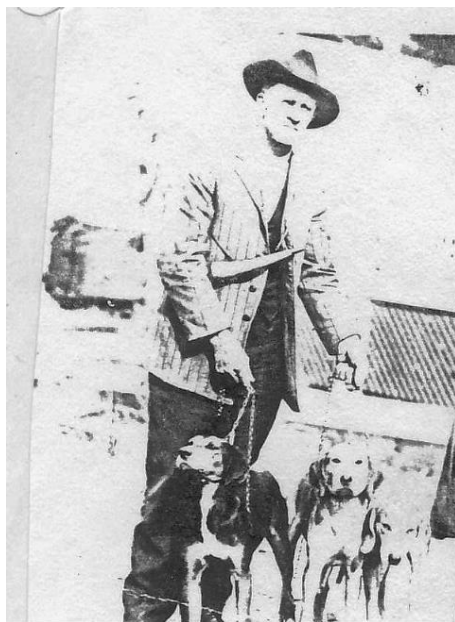

Negro Suspect Held By Police in Probe Of Arendell Murder

Oscar Bray, a negro, was arrested Friday night and held on a blanket charge of suspicion in connection with the investigation by the police of the murder of J. L. Arendell, night watchman at the plant of the Patterson Lumber company on Highland avenue.

The police say that on the night of the slaying Bray visited the home of Pearl Booth, a negress, who is being held on a charge of murder in connection with Mr. Arendell's death. Bray admits he visited the home of the negress and found her excited, but denies any part in the killing, police say.

Mr. Arendell was attacked and beaten with a hammer in the office of the lumber company on the night of November 9 and died an hour later. The night watchman's watch and a blood-stained hammer were found later at the home of Pearl Booth.

PEARL BOOTH WILL APPEAL SENTENCE TO ELECTRIC CHAIR

Attorney H. A. Allen, of defense counsel, Saturday filed with Judge E. D. Thomas the statutory motion for a new trial for Pearl Booth, negress, who was convicted Friday of the murder of J. L. Arendell, night watchman of the Patterson Lumber company, and sentenced to be electrocuted Friday, January 23, at the state prison farm in Milledgeville. Mr. Arendell was brutally slain several weeks ago.

January 19 was set as the date for hearing on the new trial plea.

The motion set forth none of the grounds on which a new trial will be asked. These will be embodied in a later motion, to be filed when the record of the case is complete.

The Booth woman, who had sat stoically through the two days of her trial, displayed no emotion when Judge Thomas sentenced her to die. After rising to receive the sentence, she resumed her seat, calmly opened a paper package and began eating a piece of cake. Later she walked steadily between two deputies from the court room to the jail.

After passing sentence, Judge Thomas complimented Assistant Solicitor Ed A. Stephens and the aides of the state for the manner in which the prosecution was handled, and also paid a tribute to the defense counsel, Mr. Allen, Louis Foster and J. O. Ewing, for the "admirable service" they had rendered in representing the accused woman as appointees of the court, "with no hope of compensation."

The case went to the jury at 3:45 o'clock Friday afternoon, after two days had been consumed in the presentation of state's evidence and arguments of counsel. The defense offered no testimony and the defendant was not placed on the stand.

Two hours later the jury returned a verdict of murder without a recommendation, which automatically carries the sentence of death.

Mr. Arendell was attacked while on duty at the lumber plant one Saturday night, brutally beaten into insensibility, robbed and left to die. His skull was fractured in several places by blows from a blunt instrument and his eyes were gouged from their sockets with a steel paper file.

A blood-stained hammer, with which Mr. Arendell's skull is alleged to have been fractured; a watch, which Mr. Arendell carried on the night of the murder, and medicine which disappeared from a medicine chest in the office of the lumber company were found in the Booth woman's home.

'Guilty' She Says, Gets Life Term

ATLANTA, Ga., Nov. 3.—Pearl Booth, the negro woman who was convicted of the brutal murder of J. L. Arendell, nightwatchman for a local lumber plant, and who was sentenced to die in the electric chair, pleaded guilty here yesterday and a consent verdict was taken, stipulating that she serve a life term in the state prison. The court of appeals reversed the lower court and an agreement was reached between Solicitor General Boykin and defense counsel, on the contention that the woman did not do the slaying but waited outside as a 'lookout.'

Bert Donaldson, attached to the solicitor general's office, left Tuesday to return to Atlanta a negro whose name was given as Mance Bray, and who is under arrest in a Florida town in connection with the investigation of the slaying of J. L. Arendell, aged night watchman at the plant of the Patterson Lumber company, two years ago. It was said at the solicitor's office that Pearl Booth, negress, who admitted complicity in the slaying, accused Bray of killing Mr. Arendell.

Indicated for murder, the Booth woman was sentenced to be electrocuted, but later, after being granted a new trial, entered a plea of guilty, and was given life imprisonment. At that time, it was announced that she contended that a man committed the murder while she stood watch.

Solicitor's Assistant Denies Trying to Link Arendell-Ax Murders

Assistant Solicitor Ed H. Stephens Saturday afternoon denied the report published in an Atlanta afternoon newspaper that he had addressed a letter to the chief of police of Birmingham asking that Birmingham authorities send a detective here to interrogate Pearl Booth, negress, who has been sentenced to die for the murder of J. L. Arendell, in connection with the notorious Birmingham "ax murders."

"I know nothing of such a letter," he said. "I have not written to Birmingham regarding this matter and so far as I know no one in the solicitor's office has writteen. As a matter of fact, it has been called to my attention that the Booth woman already had been arrested here when the last of these Birmingham murders was committed."

The Booth woman, through her attorneys, on Saturday filed formal motion for a new trial. The new trial plea will be heard January 10. The electrocution is set for January 23.

Mr. Arendell was slain while on duty as night watchman at the Patterson Lumber company, on Highland avenue, several weeks ago.

ARENDELL MURDER TRIAL OPENS WITH TRUNK TESTIMONY

Pearl Booth, negress, went on trial Thursday before Judge E. D. Thomas on indictment charging her with the murder of J. L. Arendell, aged night watchman of the Patterson Lumber company, on Highland avenue, brutally slain while on duty several weeks ago.

The first effort to connect the Booth woman with the crime was made in the testimony of Walter Patterson, president of the lumber company, who testified that a bottle of medicine and some bandages, which were found in the negro woman's trunk, according to officers, had disappeared from a cabinet in the lumber company's office on the night of the murder. Prosecuting officers stated that evidence would be introduced to show that the blood-stained hammer, with which Mr. Arendell's skull was crushed, and the watch which he wore at the time of his death also were found in the negress' possession.

In the examination of T. D. Peyton, the first man to reach Mr. Arendell after the crime, the defense made its first effort to show that the Booth woman was not connected with the murder. Mr. Peyton testified to Mr. Arendell's death-bed statement, in which he said the watchman told him that the crime was committed by four white men who drove up to the lumber company's office in an automobile.

Another witness examined at the

opening session was Mrs. J. E. Game, Mr. Patterson's daughter, who testified that she discovered the crime when she stopped by the lumber company's office early in the evening to get a letter. She said she then called Mr. Peyton who, in turn, called the police and hospital.

About fifty witnesses were called by both sides and it was indicated that the trial probably will be continued into Friday. Judge Thomas adjourned court at 1:30 o'clock for lunch, reconvening at 2:30 o'clock for the afternoon session.

Intensely interested as a spectator at the trial was Mrs. Arendell, widow of the slain watchman, who was dressed in deep mourning and was surrounded by members of her family and friends. She was seated just behind the prosecutor's table. The prosecution is being conducted by Assistant Solicitor General Ed A. Stephens, assisted by Plennie Miner, special investigator, and City Detectives Campbell and Cowan. The Booth woman is representing by Attorneys H. A. Allen, Louis B. Foster and J. O. Ewing, who were appointed by the court.
