

Tax Charge Figure Free On Bond

Henry J. Askew Jr., of 301 Tamworth Dr., was free on a \$1,000 personal recognizance bond Monday after being charged by Internal Revenue Service agents of "grossly overstating" deductions of \$50,584 for travel and entertainment on the 1958 corporate income tax return.

The president of the Browning Manufacturing Co., Inc., at 111 Humble Ave., Askew was arraigned before U.S. Com. Frank J. Baskin who set an examining trial for March 19.

If convicted of the charges alleged by IRS agents, Askew could receive a maximum penalty of three years imprisonment and a \$5,000 fine.

Askew "knowingly and willingly" filed the return under "penalties of perjury" in March, 1959, the IRS complaint alleges.

Resident Sentenced For Tax Evasion

AUSTIN —Henry J. Askew Jr. of Corpus Christi, formerly of San Antonio, was sentenced Friday by Federal Judge Ernest Guinn in San Antonio for income tax law violations.

Askew received a two-year sentence, with six months to serve, and the balance was suspended. He is free on bond pending appeal.

A federal grand jury in El Paso had indicted Askew in April, 1965, on six counts of income tax violations. Three counts of that indictment charged that Askew reported total taxable income for the years 1958, 1959 and 1960 of \$38,48, with a liability of \$9,332 when his corrected taxable income for the three-year period was actually \$77,045 on which there was a tax liability of \$23,200.

The other three counts charged that Askew filed false

corporation income tax returns for Browning Manufacturing Co. on which he claimed deductions totaling \$178,523 for the three years for travel and entertainment and that these amounts were falsely and grossly overstated.

Askew was first tried in San Antonio in August, 1967. The trial ended in a mistrial when the jury was unable to reach a verdict. Askew waived a jury for the second trial and Judge Guinn found him guilty.

Askew was a former owner of Browning Manufacturing Co. of San Antonio and La Crosse Trailer Sales of La Crosse, Wis. Askew also was formerly on the executive board of the Boy Scouts and on the board of the San Antonio Livestock Exposition. He had also served as chairman of the industry division for the United Fund in San Antonio.

Sentenced For Tax Law Violation

Henry J. Askew Jr., of Corpus Christi and a former San Antonio resident, was sentenced April 3 by U.S. District Judge Ernest Guinn in San Antonio for violating the federal income tax law.


