## Park City Boy on the Tuscania

**Allen O. Abrahams Writes  
of Torpedoing and of  
Wreck of Life Boat on  
Rocks off Irish Coast--  
Five of His Mates Die in  
Making Landing.**

Soldiers on the deck of the Tuscania, sunk by a German torpedo several weeks ago, sang "The Star Spangled Banner" and fought at the efforts of Fritz trying to take the lives of Yankee boys, according to a letter describing the actions of the men written by Allen O. Abrahams, a member of the 15th Aero Squadron, who resides at 116 Bond street, this city. Abrahams writing to his brother and sister in this city gives a graphic description with all the details which proved to be thrilling and exciting.

### Falls from Deck

At 10 o'clock I fell from the deck of the Tuscania after the ship had been torpedoed, remaining in the water 20 minutes before being picked up by the life boat in which he was forced to stay until 1 o'clock in the morning, when he was landed. The land proved to be a rocky and cliff and several of the boys were dashed to death on the rocks attempting to land.

Summary due to difficulty of reading text in the original:

"Park City Boy on the Tuscania" – letter to his brother & sister in Bridgeport CT. Resides on Bond St. Now across the pond & am going after Fritz. [Germans] "He came near getting me first and he didn't." It was "quite an experience" but none of us were afraid. Torpedo hit at 5:55 p.m. & less than 5 minutes later men were on deck singing "The Star-Spangled Banner" and laughing at Fritz's efforts to take the lives of Yankee boys. He lost several pals and came near death when he fell overboard with several others trying to straighten block & tackle. In cold water about 20 minutes before picked up by a lifeboat. Since boat was not loaded, picked up quite a few lads. Drifted until 1 a.m. when saw land a few hundred feet away. Sea was rough & wind blowing hard, "but how we did pull for that shore when we sighted it." [Article headline identifies as Ireland, but it is Islay, Scotland] When they saw broken rocky coast with cliff, they tried to pull away "because we knew if we hit the rocks, it would be good night!" But within an instant, everyone was overboard & the boat in splinters. He was thrown against rocks a few times; "that took some of the bark off my anatomy." He succeeded in grabbing a rock & the next wave threw him on top of it. He was on the rock until noon on 6 Feb, and could see the other boys in the same position as him. A coast guard walked along the cliff top around noon & saw them, so he got some help, a rope & a horse. "He pulled us up, one by one, more dead than alive." Five men died in the attempt to land. Being "weak in the knees," he & the others stayed at the farm a few days, buried their dead & then started for England. In a rest camp now for a few days. "We are all

somewhat banged up but are doing nicely." Has lost everything but the pictures from home. Asked them to send anything they wish, as he would appreciate anything. "Send some chocolate, because I like that as well as Bull Durham and papers. Don't go buying all you see either. I got your last package, but all I have left is the diary." "I have a good grudge against the Kaiser now, for that cold bath." Treated well by people here, in good health, "quite contented."

## FEAR ABRAHAM'S WAS SHIP VICTIM

Newburgh, Feb. 11—Lists of the survivors of the Tuscania were coming through from Washington Saturday, and as The News was closed, approximately 200 of the names had been received. Among them as yet however, the name of Allen O. Abrahams has not appeared. Great anxiety is felt for the safety of the Maybrook youth, who was a member of the 15th Aero Squadron. His brother-in-law, John Canade, of Maybrook, came to Newburgh Saturday afternoon in the hope of more quickly getting information of the fate of the young soldier. Mr. Abrahams' name has apparently not yet been cabled to Washington, for aside from receiving the list as sent out by the department Oscar Abrahams, the father of the soldier, arrived in Maybrook Saturday morning, having gone from his home in Maywood, N. J., to be with the wife of his son, during the period of her anxiety.

## BRIDGEPORT BOY ON THE TUSCANIA

Allen O. Abrahams, of 416 Bond street, a member of the 158th Aero squadron, was a passenger on the ill-fated Tuscania when she was struck and sunk by a Hun torpedo. Abrahams writing to his brother and sister here gives a very interesting description of the scenes on board the sinking ship. He says the soldiers maintained perfect discipline, and sang the ~~Star~~ Spangled Banner before they were taken off in the boats. Abrahams fell from the vessel into the water after the torpedo struck, and was picked up by one of the life boats after being in the water 20 minutes.

He describes the rescue of his own boat crew over a high cliff from a rocky shore, the men being pulled up with a rope to which a horse was attached. Several of the boat's complement were killed getting a shore over the rocks. Abrahams of course lost all of his baggage except the clothes in which he was rescued.

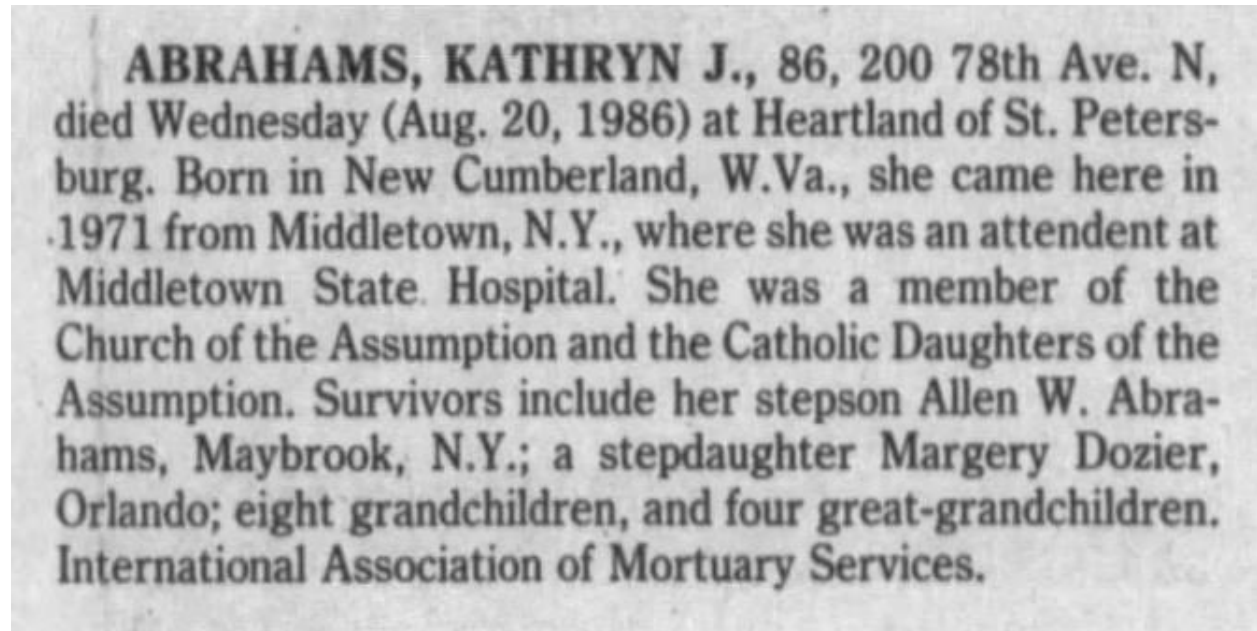

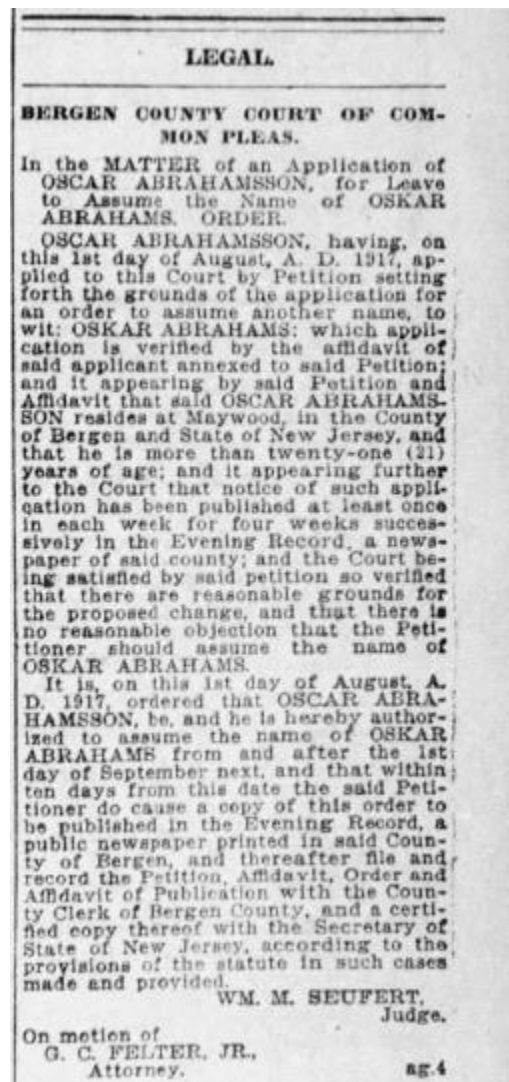

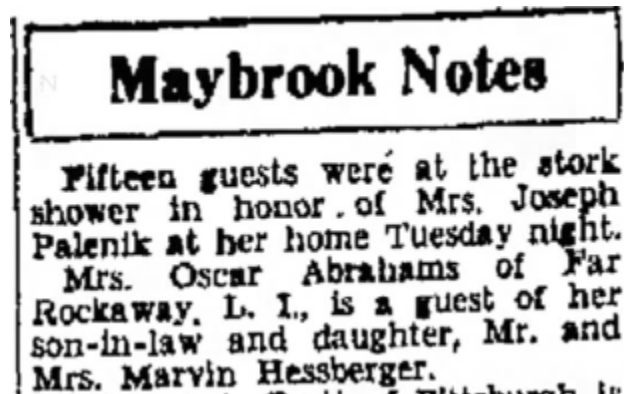

In the 1900 census for Poe, Hancock WV, Katherine J. Hare, born May 1900, not yet 1 year old, lived with her mother Bessie S. Hare (24 WV), the granddaughter of James & Anna Troup & niece of Robert A. Troup (age 11). Her mother said she had been married 3 years, had given birth to 3 children, only 1 of whom was living.

On 2 Aug 1919 in Beacon, Dutchess NY, Kathryn J. Hare married Mario Zapata/Zapatto. Mario was born in the country of Colombia in South America, the son of Olimpa Zapatto & Jesusita Sanchez, both born in South America. On their marriage license, both resided at 206 Liberty St., Newburgh, Orange NY.
