SERGT. A. F. AUSTIN IS SAFE.

Former Kansas Side Boy Among Tuscania Survivors.

Mrs. J. H. Baird, 2923 the Paseo, received word yesterday from her father, D. W. Austin, Catesby, Ok., that her brother, Sergt. Arthur F. Austin, was among the Tuscania survivors. Sergeant Austin was born on the Kansas side, but had lived recently in Oklahoma. He was a member of Replacement Detachment No. 1 from Camp Travis, Tex.

A telegram was received by the relatives of Arthur S. Austin, near Catesby, who was one of the Ellis county boys aboard the Tuscania when it was sunk , that he was safe. Young Austin enlisted about eight months ago.

"Shattuck (OK) Monitor" Thursday 14 Feb 1918 p 3

Home folks received a letter from Frank Austin Tuesday stating that he was all right. This is the first word they had received from him since he sailed on the Tuscania, excepting a telegram his father received, stating that he was one of the survivors. This is good news to his many friends around Speermoores.

The United States suffered her first serious soldier loss since war was declared against Germany last April, in the sinking of the big English steamer, Tuscania, by a German U-boat off the coast of Ireland on Tuesday night Feb. 5th. Indications are that 113 American army officers and soldiers were lost by the sinking of the vessel. The survivors were taken off in boats and landed on nearby friendly shores. 2,179 American officers and men were aboard the vessel. There was many a sad heart when the news was received here. On Sunday it was learned that Frank Austin of this place, was on the doomed vessel, and it was thought that he might be among the lost, but a telegram received Sunday afternoon stated that he was among the survivors. A later telegram confirmed the first.

OBITUARY

Daniel W. Austin was born October 22, 1852 in Norway, N. Y. and departed this life January 20, 1935 in Laverne, Okla. at the age of 82 years, 2 months and 29 days. He spent his boyhood days in N. Y., moving to Hannibal, Mo. in 1869.

He was united in marriage with Miss Anna Kolb of Hannibal, Mo. on April 22, 1875. To this union six children were born.

He moved to Kansas City, Kansas in 1884 where he lived until 1901 when he came to Speermore, Okla. taking a homestead here at that time.

Two children having preceded him in death, he leaves in bereavement his wife, Mrs. Anna Austin of Speermore; one son, Frank Austin of Laverne; three daughters, Mrs. J. H. Baird of Kansas City, Mo., Mrs. Edward McDonald of Chicago, Ill., Mrs. John Pulis of Laverne; 11 grandchildren; 2 great grandchildren, and a host of friends.

When a young man he united with the Methodist Church at Hannibal, Mo. Upon moving to Kansas City, he joined the Presbyterian church where he served as an elder. He remained a member of that church to his death.

As long as men shall honor the virtues of reverence to God, fidelity of the home, and devotion to high ideals—just that long will the memory of Daniel W. Austin be cherished in the hearts of the many who knew him here.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday afternoon from the Speermore Baptist church where a large assembly of friends and relatives had gathered to pay a last respect to the one whom they had honored for so many years. Rev. Hebard of Laverne spoke words of comfort to the sorrowing assembly. Music was furnished by a mixed quartet composed of Mrs. Ben Douglas, Mrs. John Barber, R. S. Wyand and D. C. Spencer with Miss Louise Austin at the piano. The body was laid to rest in the Speermore Cemetery. Barber Mortuary had charge of funeral arrangements.

Mother:

Beaver County lost a pioneer resident in the death of Mrs. Anna L. Austin, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. John Pulis, of Laverne, February 22nd, 1942, aged 88 years 6 months and 26 days.

Her husband, Daniel W. Austin, to whom she was married April 17, 1875, preceded her in death 7 years. Previous to this time they had lived on their farm at Speer-moore for over 30 years.

Since her husband's death she made her home with her daughters and for almost three years has been with her daughter, Mrs. John Pulis of Laverne. Although in declining health for some time, she was only critically ill about seven hours.

She was born in Dubuque, Iowa, and was the daughter of Andrew and Christina Kolb. Her father was a Presbyteran minister of which church she was always a member.

She had five children, Mrs. J. H. Baird, Kansas City, Mo; Mrs. E. W. McDonald, Chicago, Ills; Mrs. John Pulis and Frank Austin of Laverne, and David Austin, who passed away in Topeka, on August 19, 1923. She also leaves a brother, Henry W. Kolb. Hannibal, Mo. and 12 grandchildren by whom she will be sadly missed.

Mrs. Austin by her even temperament and kind ways endeared herself to her family and a wide circle of friends.

The funeral services were conducted by C. L. Moser, at the Baptist church in Laverne, February 24th at 2:30. Burial was in the Speermore cemetery.
