

Frank Luke Memorial To Bear Names Of Arizona's War Dead

Gold Star mothers of Arizona have been asked to co-operate with the Frank Luke, jr., memorial committee in securing an accurate and complete list of all Arizona boys who lost their lives in the World war.

A magnificent bronze statue of Lieut. Frank Luke, jr., is to be rected on the capitol grounds. While this memorial was planned primarily in honor of the "ace of aces," lasting tribute also will be paid to all sons of Arizona who lost their lives in the great conflict. To this end the names of Arizona's hero dead will be engraved on one side of the beautiful granite base supporting the statue.

The committee has obtained from the war department an official list of all persons who enlisted from Arizona and who died either in action or of wounds or disease in the war. This list does not include, however, former residents of Arizona who may have enlisted outside the state.

- Mary C. Baker Benton, Oct 1897 TX (according to 1900 census) Ancestry.com records have several versions of a family tree. In one, Mary Emma Baker was born 1 Oct 1897 & died 23 Aug 1989. Her tombstone uses the surname Baker. Evidence from the 1920 census for Justice Precinct 4, Hopkins Co. places a married Mary Benton & husband Jim Benton living with her father, Bill Baker. Mary Baker married 24 Mar 1918 in Hopkins Co. TX to James Daniel Benton, 10 Jan 1890 Monroe Co. TX 12 Dec 1929 Cumby, Hopkins TX. The son of Charles Eugeniu Benton & Elizabeth Adeline Crawford, James died of tuberculosis & is buried in Cumby Cemetery, Cumby, Hopkins TX, F: 119291742. Ancestry.com also links her to a marriage to a man named Johnson & links her to a grave for MARIE Baker Johnson. This woman was born 10 Oct 1897 & died 5 Dec 1967 & is buried in Earthman Resthaven Cemetery, Houston, Harris TX, F: 190657777.
