## City has own version of a soldier's story

Private Benjamin Birmingham received quite a homecoming on Sept. 4, 1921. It was also his funeral.

He was the first Corpus Christi soldier to die in World War I. He was killed on June 6, 1918, but was carried as missing in action for a long time.

This probably explains the oversight in that his name does not appear on the markers or the American Legion Plaque at the top of the Bluff in front of Corpus Christi Cathedral, where the other Corpus Christi men killed in the Great War are honored.


Birmingham and his brother went to San Antonio and joined the Regular Army when the United States entered the war. They said they wouldn't feel like Americans if they didn't. They separated and were never to see each other again.

Benjamin made local news when his troop transport, the SS Tuscania, was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland early in 1918. He was one of the survivors.

The next report was that he was missing in action.

His mother prayed "that he had not made the supreme sacrifice, but rather was a prisoner of the Germans."

Another Corpus Christian, Ernest Gragg, a member of the Navy armed guard



aboard the steamship Lochester, went down when his ship was torpedoed. The first American Legion Post here, No. 81, was named for him.

Then the war was over. Cpl. Albert Birmingham wrote home. He said he had not seen nor heard from his brother, "Been." He spelled phonetically, saying he had "dune sum hard fitting, and on the next drive, we throwed a big broge (barrage) on Verdun. Ours, and blew me down some. We never stoop shutting at the eneny."

He said he was looking forward to dancing, asked his brother Ben not to sell his car until he could drive it and asked about his little black horse. And, "tell my girl that I still think of her."

He lived to old age.

The flags at City Hall and the Courthouse were lowered to half staff three years after Ben's death when the Army moved thousands of bodies from France

to this country.

A big crowd assembled for the funeral procession. It was led by the flag-draped casket on a caisson pulled by a Maxwell P. Dunne hearse, followed by a color guard, a Boy Scout band playing "Nearer My God to Thee," an honor escort, pallbearers and legionnaires in full uniform. Then came the Legion Auxiliary, the Rotary, the Kiwanis, the Elks Club and most of the rest of the town marching in silence.

At Rose Hill Cemetery, Pvt. Benjamin Birmingham, K Company, 23rd Infantry, was buried with full military honors, speeches, prayers, a 21-gun salute, taps and the playing of the "Star Spangled Banner."

The county, the Gold Star Mothers and the American Legion set up the Bluff memorial in the '20s. There is a monument with a plaque with all the World War I dead. There is another tower which was to have been an "eternal light." And small markers for each of the dead are spaced out along the Bluff, just below the bannister.

Birmingham's niece, Mrs. Alfred C. Smith, is trying to rectify the error made when her uncle's name was omitted.

I've had inquiries from various veterans' groups about restoring this monument. Now that the relatives who remember those men grow fewer in number, I'd hope some of them sponsor a remodeling program to coincide with the Bluff improvement project.


And while they're at it, maybe they can include the name of Pvt. Benjamin Birmingham, the first Corpus Christi soldier to die in World War I.





### Veterans Day services to honor local hero

ham will be honored during Veterans' Day ceremonies morning at Sherrill Park. Friday

Birmingham didn't set out to be a hero, but he was. The Corpus Christi resident went to San Antonio to join the Army. He was killed in France on June 6, 1918 - reportedly the first Corpus Christi resident killed in action in World War I.

He was buried in Rose Hill Cemetery, with full military honors, on Sept. 4, 1921.

Birmingham was initally reported missing in action and was carried as an MIA for some time. It may be for that reason that his name was omitted from the American Legion Plaque at the top of the Bluff in front of the Corpus Christi Cathedral.

That oversight will be rectified Friday. A marker will be dedicated to Birmingham for his service to his

The late Pvt. Benjamin Birming- country and that day will be declared Benjamin Birmingham Day by Mayor Betty Turner.

"The marker will be dedicated at Sherrill Park," said Al Cantu, chairman of the Mayor's Committee for Veterans' Affairs. "We ordered a bronze plaque with his name to be attached to the marker on the Bluff," he said, "but it didn't arrive in time for Friday's ceremony. That marker will be attached sometime in November.

The marker on the Bluff is a memorial established in the 1920s by the Gold Star Mothers and the American Legion. There is a monument with a plaque with all the names of local servicemen killed in World War. Small markers for each of the dead are spaced out along the Bluff, just below the bannister.

Cantu said a number of things are on the agenda for the program, : which is scheduled to start at 10:30

a.m

Thursday marked the 200 anniversary of the Marine Corps and they had asked for a few minutes on the program, Cantu said, so rep-resentatives of the Marine Corps will speak.

In addition, he said, former prisoners of war will be recognized. In many cases, Cantu said, former POWs had to submit requests to receive the recently approved congressional medal awarded to POWs. The result is that the bulk of these people were never recognized in the community. So we are allowing 10 to 15 minutes on the program for all who received the POW medal to be recognized."

County Attorney Carlos Valdez will be the keynote speaker during the ceremonies.

Following Valdez' talk, the commander of the South Texas Chapter of the 82nd Airborn Chapter, Cantu as chairman of the Mayor's Com-

mittee on Veterans' Affairs, and members of Birmingham's family will unveil the marker.

The Veterans Band of Corpus Christi is also scheduled to play patriotic tunes during the program. Cantu said approximately 40

members of the family may be on hand for the ceremonies.

The fact that Birmingham's name was omitted form the existing plaque was brought to Cantu's attention in June. Birmingham's neice, Dorothy Smith, and her husband Al had been working for two years to get recognition for her uncle.

"We've been working on it since June," Cantu said, "and Friday will be the day."

The Veterans' Day ceremony is sponsored by the Mayor's Committee on Veterans Affairs and the South Texas Chapter of the 82nd Airborn Chapter.

# A. J. BIRMINGHAM, PIONEER FARMER OF INEZ, PASSES AWAY

Funeral services were held at Ryan & Son's Chapel in this city at 4 o'clock Wednesday afternoon for Andrew Jackson Birmingham, 82, a retired farmer of. Inez, who died at Edna of apoplexy at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon while he was being conveyed to a doctor's office there shortly after he was stricken.





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

Benita is linked on Find A Grave to her daughter, Barbara Jean McGarity Denecamp (F: 186308985). - Social Security records a surname change to Roucloux in Oct 1966. Benita married Albert Austin Roucloux on 17 Sep 1966 in Guadalupe Co. TX. Albert was born 8 Jan 1922 in San Antonio, Bexar TX & died on 6 Apr 1989 in the same location. He was the son of Albert Roucloux & Lillie M. Mockert. - Buried as Benita McGarity in Mission Burial Park South, San Antonio, Bexar TX. F: 232235619

His TX birth record lists his parents as Andres Birmingham & Phelipita Duran. He is often confused in online family trees with Andrew M. Birmingham, who was born earlier and died in 1954. – Oliver married Etta Mae Smith (1881-1963). In the 1910 census for Justice Precinct 2, Refugio Co. TX, Ollie Birmingham (30 TX, parents b. TX) was a barber with his own shop. In his household was wife Ettie (28 TX), who have given birth to 2 children, 2 of whom were living. It was the 1<sup>st</sup> marriage for both. Ollie Mae (3 TX) & Dovice (1 TX) lived with them. – In the 1920 census for Cuero, DeWitt Co. TX, conducted 5 Jan 1920, Etta Birmingham (age 39 TX, father b. VA, mother b. TX) lived at 218 W.
