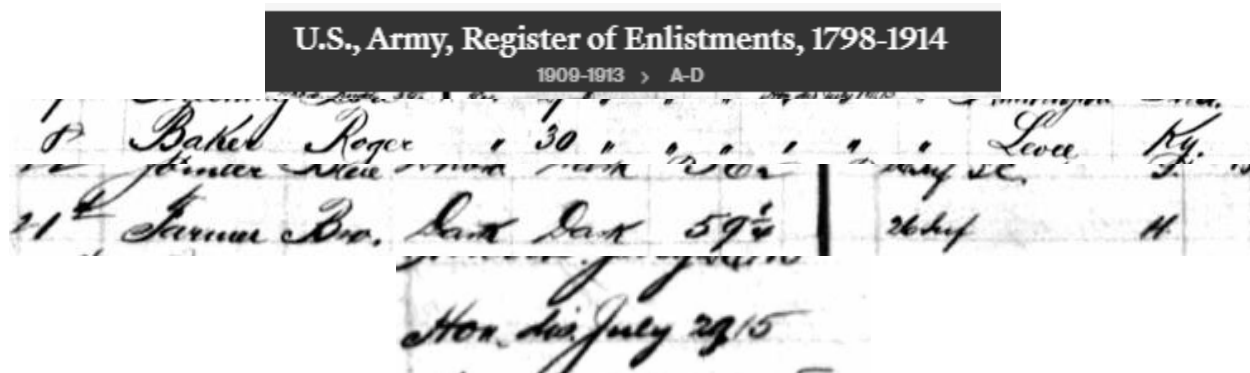

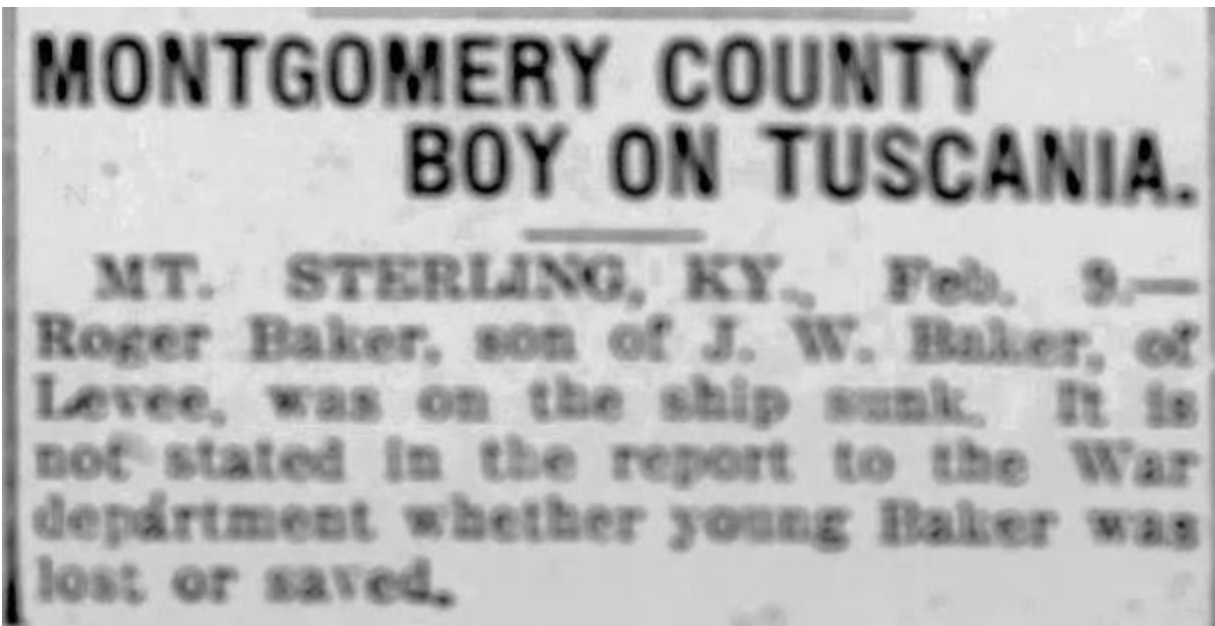

 Three Are Missing**

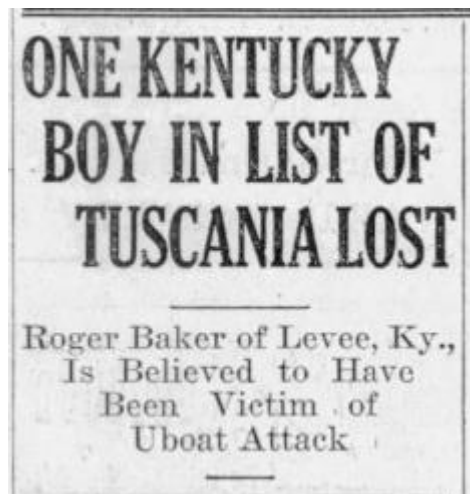
WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Three of the six Kentuckians on board the troop ship Tuscania when she was sunk by a German U-boat have been saved, according to the incomplete list of survivors cabled to the war department. They are William C. Phoebe, of Leitchfield; Carl R. Overstreet, of Bradfordsville, and Otto Phillips Hodge, of Grants Lick.

The Kentuckians whose fate is still unknown follow: Francis C. Caldwell, of Campbellsville; Carl B. Pennebaker, of Rock Haven, and Roger Baker, of Levi.

ESTIMATES OF LOSSES

English and American Reports
Still Vary In Numbers
As to Missing.

1832 NAMES OF SOLDIERS.

Only Kentuckian Among the
Not Known to be Ashore
Is Roger Baker.

The war department's Tuscania figures continue to differ from those of the British admiralty. The war department estimate Sunday was 210 persons missing, 113 of them American soldiers, while the British admiralty's figures put the loss at 166 missing, 147 of whom are American officers and enlisted men.

No official report has since reached the department to change the estimate that all except 113 of the men were saved, but the names have been coming in very slowly over the cables and there is no assurance as to when the list will be complete.

Most of the 345 soldiers unaccounted for come from Texas, the number from that state being 70. Other states having large numbers of residents unaccounted for are: Wisconsin, 40; Orego, 32; Oklahoma, 28; California, 18; Minnesota, 17; Washington, 16; Michigan, 10; New York, 15; Pennsylvania, 10.

The remainder are from twenty-five other states, including the following:

Kentucky—Roger Baker, Levee.

Illinois—Harry Carpenter, Pottomac; Henry A. Skinner, Rockford.

Ohio—Stanley R. Rugspurger, Dayton; Frank D. Reilly, Cleveland; Richard Ninehart, Columbus; Carroll Seully, Toledo; Gregg Gehring, Findlay.

Probably more than 200 of the men whose names appear on the record of unaccounted for are safe in Ireland and will be reported soon.

Captain MacLean, of the Tuscania, has submitted a report to his owners and to the board of trade and the naval authorities. He declined to make a statement for publication, remarking that the main facts of the disaster already had been fairly stated.

A young Irish lad, a resident of Glasgow, who acted as Captain MacLean's boy, was interviewed by the Associated Press correspondent. The boy said that after the torpedoing Captain MacLean looked to be the coolest man on board, giving orders as if nothing had happened to interfere with the ordinary ship routine.

"He was just like a father looking after his children," the boy said, "and repeatedly encouraged small parties who were hurrying to get into life boats."

The lad added that the captain's amazing coolness had a marvelous effect on the American soldiers.

ROGER BAKER PROBABLY LOST IN TUSCANIA DISASTER

Roger Baker, son of J. W. Baker, of the Levee, this county, is believed lost by the sinking of the transport Tuscania on last Tuesday. Although, all on board the ill-fated ship except 340 have been reported saved the name of young Baker has not yet reached the war department. Of this 340 yet unaccounted for it is believed about 200 more

will be reported saved and the many friends and relatives of the local boy are hoping that he may prove to be one of the survivors. The Tuscania was the first transport carrying American troops to be torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine and the disaster has brought distress and sorrow to many American homes.

■ Roger Baker enlisted in the army about three years ago and had made a splendid record. In making a report of his probable death and also of the wounding of a Mt. Sterling boy the war is being brought home to our citizens as never before. For a detailed report of the sinking of the Tuscania see page 6.

VOLUNTEERS TO GET VENGEANCE

**BROTHER OF TUSCANIA VICTIM
WAIVES DRAFT LIABILITY TO
AVENGE DEATH.**

MT. STERLING, Ky., Feb. 28.—Included in Montgomery County's final white increment of drafted men for the National Army, which left this afternoon for Camp Taylor, were two volunteers, Perry Baker, of Levee, brother of Roger Baker, who is believed to have been lost on the ill-fated Tuscania, and Charles Kerrick, of this county, who asked permission of the local draft board that their order number be waived and they be inducted into military service at once.

Baker said he volunteered in hope of an opportunity to avenge the death of his brother, and Kerrick was anxious to get into the army at once.

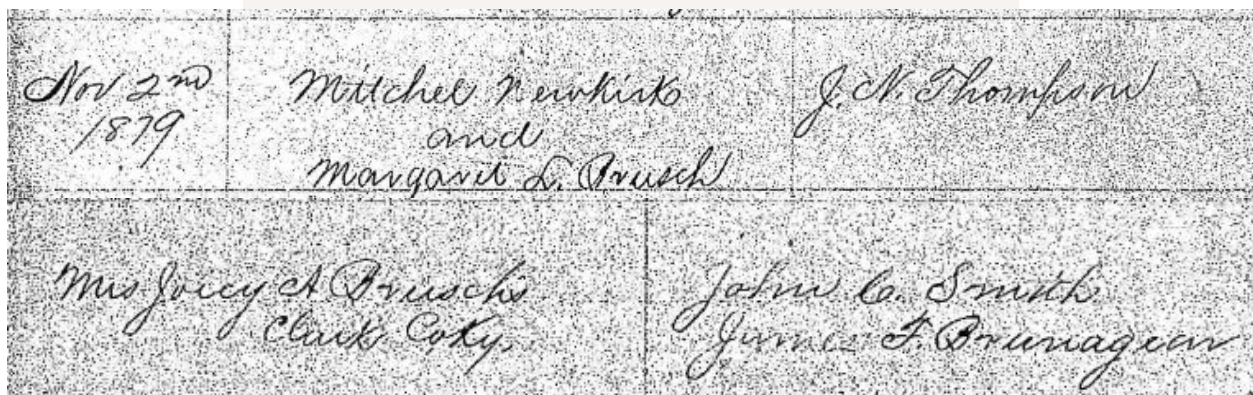

She was ill for several months following an operation. The funeral was held 20 Jan, with burial in the Balding [sic/appears to be Baldwin] graveyard. She has 5 living children: 3 sons & 2 daughters. One of her sons is in France in military service. A son, Roger, died on the Tuscania.

Died of liver cancer. According to her KY death record, she is buried in Baldin [sic/likely Baldwin] Grave Yard.
