Warren A. Blackman, 82, former Missoula resident, died Monday in Tucson, Ariz. He was born Sept. 20, 1890, in Britton, S.D.

Mr. Blackman moyed to Arizona from Missoula in 1959 after the death of his wife, Martha. He served in World War I and was a retired selfemployed auto mechanic.

He was a member of Missoula Lodge 13, AF&AM and Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie 32. Mr. Blackman is survived by his son, Warren A. Blackman, Jr., Moses Lake, Wash.; his daughter, Mrs. Dorothy Jensen, Tucson; two brothers, Milton, Portland, and Everette, Walport, Ore.; three sisters, Mrs. Edna St. Claire, Toledo, Ore.; Mrs. Gertrude Olson, San Bruno, Calif., and Mrs. Adna Law, Los Gatos, Calif.; five grandchildren, and three greatgrandchildren.

ONE MONTANAN FROM TUSCANIA IN HOSPITAL

Washington, Feb. 24.—Sixty-three American survivors of the torpedoed troop ship Tuscania were reported to the war department today as recovering in Irish hospitals from the effects of injuries or exposure. The dispatch said none of the cases were serious, and that it was expected all the men soon would be discharged.

All of the 63 had previously been reported saved, and the presence of many of them in hospitals had been recorded in press dispatches, although today's dispatch brought the first official list of those in hospitals. Among them is Warren A. Blackman of Oliver Gulch. Mont., who is in the hospital at Larne.


LITTLE BOY LOSES LIFE IN THE BAYOU-

Notes: From lengthy records on the Find A Grave records of his parents: The family story is that the first Blackman was a British soldier in the Revolutionary War under General Cornwallis. After the war, he returned to the new U.S. to live.

Warren's paternal grandfather, Zenas Blackman, was a corporal in the 8th Minnesota Regiment, Co. D., who died at age 31 at Fort Pomme de Terre, Grant Co. MN, killed by Dakota Native Americans in the Dakota Conflict of 1863 (F: 41738809). Zenas's son Lester did not like the man his mother married after his father died. The family moved from SD to MT in 1895, with Lester & his son Warren driving a covered wagon. Lester's children Gertrude, Ellen & Wayne came on the train with their mother Lottie. Lester then rowed his family across the river in a rowboat. When his wife Lottie reached her new dugout home, she sat down & cried. The couple had 11 children, 3 of whom died young.
