Rites Are Held For Dude Blagg

Ruel (Dude) Blagg, a resident of the Weatherford community for 66 years, died Saturday morning in Southwestern Memorial hospital. He was 71.


A veteran of World War I, he had been ill for the past year and a half. He spent considerable time in the veterans hospital in Okla' & City and later was in a cal nursing home.

Born in Ardmore, January 2, 1891, he came to Weatherford with his parents in 1896. The family homesteaded on a farm and he grew up there and continued to farm until he entered the army in October of 1917. The troop ship taking him overseas was torpeodoed but he escaped without injury. He was discharged from the army in August of 1919 and resumed farming north of town. He retired from farming in 1946 and since that time had made his home in Weatherford.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday afternoon from the Lockstone funeral home chapel. Rev. Doug Manning, pastor of the First Baptist church, conducted the service. Burial was in Greenwood cemetery.

Surviving him are two sons, Bill of Weatherford and Earl of Fort Collins, Colo.; a sister, Mrs. Viola Wilson of Lone Wolf; a brother, Ed Blagg of Pueblo, Colo.

DRAFTED MEN TO LEAVE (THURSDAY) TODAY Sirty-eight Selected Men Go From Custer County To Mobilization Camp

Sixty-eight men are to report to the local board at Clinton this Thursday morning at 8 o'clock for military duty. The men will leave sometime (Thursday) today for a mobilization camp.

The third contingent of the national army is moving this week to the sixteen cantonments throughout the country and approximately one-half of the 687.000 selected men have already been mobilized. Quotas now ready to leave home vary greatly. ranging from seventeen to forty percent of the full state quotas, with a general average of from twenty-five to thirty percent.

Sixty-eight men leave Clinton as the second quots of Custer county.


Clinton's citizenship turned out enmass at about 4 o'clock Thursday afternoon, the stores wore cloced, and the boys escorted to the Frisco depot in autos. The Clinton band made music and a patriotic address was delivered by Judge Palmer just before the train arrived at 5 o'clock to carry the soldier boys to Camp Travis. When the train pulled out flags, handkerchiefs and hats were waived midst a great demonstration by the large crowd which, had gathered to do the selected boys honor.





Dude Blagg Struck By Car On Highway

Ruel (Dude) Blagg, 66, was injured Friday afternoon when struck by a car on U. S. Highway 66 about three miles east of Weatherford.

Blagg sustained a serious cut on one leg from the knee to the ankle and one bone was cracked. He also suffered a sprained wrist and bruises. After being treated by a local doctor he was taken to the Hinton hospital.

Elagg had ridden a Greyhound bus to a point three miles east of town enroute to his home. After leaving the bus he was walking north across the highway when he was struck by a car driven by John Gates, of Butler, Gates was driving west.

Police Chief George Miller said Blagg was struck as he neared the north side of the pavement. Gates, driver of the car, brought Blagg to Weatherford for treatment.

Organization of a post of Veteerans of Foreign Wars was completed in Weatherford Wednesday night with 36 original members.

The post is to be known as the Blagg-Hamburger post.

Harry F. Ladusau, department commander of Oklahoma, assisted by a staff team from Garber conducted the installation work E. T. Quinlan was named commander of the local post. Other officers chosen were: W. H. Winters, senior vice commander; E. H. Driskill, junlor vice commander; M. D. Smith, quartermaster; Nelson Brintle, officer of the day; Howard S. Hair, chaplain; A. L. Bishop, 'judge advocate; H. L. Roberson, Joy Roush and Rankin Williams, trustees for terms of 6, 12 and 18 months, respectively.

M. D .Smith was named adjutant.

Meet Tuesday


The post will meet Tuesday, May 25 to complete the organization and to name the various committees necessary for conducting the de ... i work of the order.

This may be Thomas Wesley Claunch, born 26 Dec 1891 Johnson Co. TX, died 7 May 1977, buried in Olympus Cemetery, Grove, Delaware Co. OK. On 14 Sep 1912 in Caddo Co. OK he had married Valna or Velna or Zelna or Velma Bond. She was born 20 Jul 1892 OK & died 9 Oct 1955 in Clinton OK. They divorced in Sep 1946 in OK. She is buried as Velma Swazy, F: 16438484.

Thomas Claunch's son Claud/Claude Merle Claunch was born 16 Mar 1947 in Exeter CA & died 15 Jun 1991. The maiden name of Claude's mother is listed as Green on his CA birth record.

In the 1961 KS County Census, Thomas W. Claunch (age 69), wife Edna M. (56) & son Claude (13) lived at 3557 South St. Francis, Sedgwick, Ridgeway KS. In the 1940 census, Ruel & Edna are married; in the 1950 census, he is divorced.

Notes:

He and his two brothers William & Charles were in France in the Army in WWI. Charles was a casualty, dying about a month before the Armistice.

Pre-war:

Ruel Blagg (mostly as Dude Blagg) appears often in the local newspaper – visiting friends (but not family visits), hunting, having accidents, picking cotton, having mumps (Jun 1911).

Letter (copied above) to brother Joe. Signed "old shorty" (as he is 6' 5" tall).
