CLEW IS TRACED

Stranger Said to Have Called
at Monks Home.

SEATTLE, Nov. 30.—(P)—Mrs. Florence Fithian Monks, wealthy widow who was murdered for her diamonds in her town house at 723 12th Ave. N., last Tuesday, was asked by a stranger several weeks prior to her death: "Do you live here all the time alone?" and the widow replied, "it is none of your business" and shut the door on her unwelcome questioner.

This information was furnished police detectives Monday by Mrs. Louise Blaker, niece by marriage of Mrs. Monks. Mrs. Blaker, and her husband, Ernest Blaker, a truck-driver, live at 715 N. 89th St., outside the city limits.

"Mrs. Monks told us that this man was a dark, round-faced fellow who came to the door with some kind of a paper which had Mrs. Monks' name on it and as she was about to close the door he asked her if she lived there alone and she told him it was none of his business and shut the door on him," explained Mrs. Blaker. "We then warned her it was dangerous to stay alone in the house all the time, but she laughed at our fears."

Portland Detective Leaves

Whether the man mentioned by the Blakers could have murdered Mrs. Monks for her jewels, police say frankly they do not know. The man may come forward and explain that his question was an innocent one.

But from Detective Chief Charles Tennant down, those working on the case are satisfied the murderer knew the widow lived alone. The death of Mrs. Monks has all the features of the mystery deaths of three women in Portland recently, and, following conferences with Detective Archie Leonard of the Portland police force last Saturday, the police announced here that the man sought by Portland officers is "very likely" the same man who killed Mrs. Monks.

The Portland detective returned

home yesterday after satisfying himself of the similarity between the three mystery cases there and the Monks case. Before leaving Detective Leonard pointed out that the Seattle police have at least something definite to work on, a fingerprint, which was more than Portland detectives had. The fingerprint, which was found on a black handbag, had been photographed and preserved by police for future use.

The widow's missing jewelry, consisting chiefly of diamonds, is also a vital link in the case, and until some trace of them is found detectives can do nothing but check on various persons who have been reported seen with Mrs. Monks and about whom the widow's friends were unable to give an account which would clear them from the classification of "suspects."

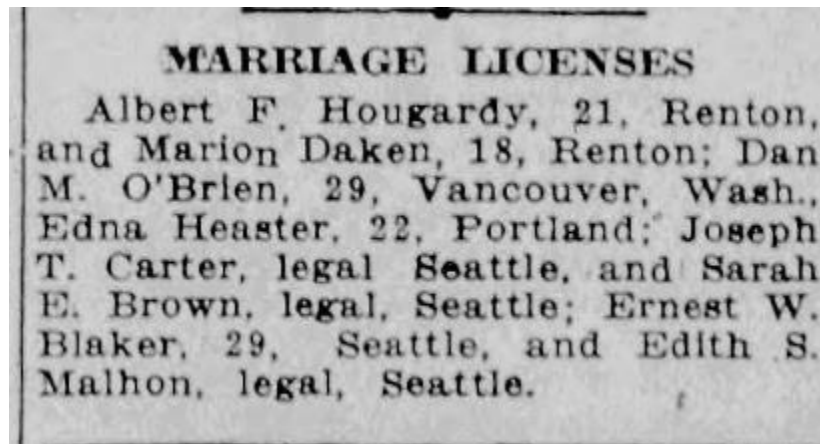

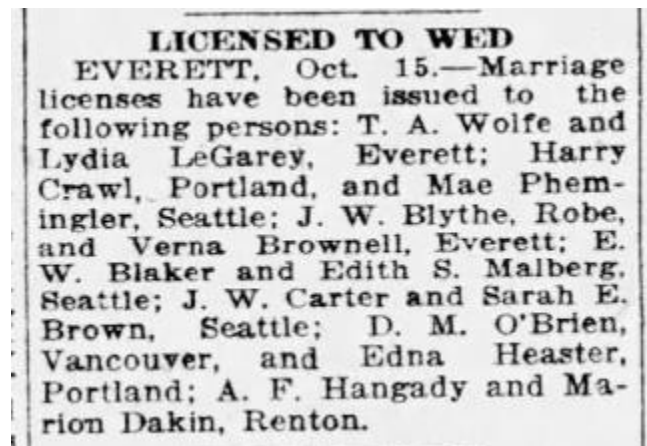

Portland Underworld Plays Santa—To Self

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 22.—(U.P.) — Portland's underworld played Santa Claus to itself last night with five robberies reported to police in one hour. Loot ranged from \$1,200, reported stolen from a fruit-stand operator, to \$10 taken from the proprietor of a beer parlor.

Mrs. Charles MacPherson was held up in a service station and \$15 taken from her. She thought the gun the robber was holding looked phoney, so she grappled with the intruder, who dropped a toy pistol before making good his escape.

Two men robbed a food store of \$122 and escaped after tying the proprietor's hands behind him. The owner of another food store reported two men had held him up and robbed him of about \$150, while he was on his way home.

The informal shopping of three others was interrupted by deputy sheriffs who stated they found Dallas Comeford, Kenneth Miller and Willard Copeland allegedly holding up a food store. Two of the men were in the store and a third was in parked car, the motor running.

Judgment To Co-Op

A GRANDVIEW grape co-op has been awarded a \$1,119.96 judgment against one of its members who broke his 1949 contract by selling his crop to Church Grape Juice Co., Kennewick.

Defendant in the suit brought in Yakima county superior court was W. R. Copeland of Granger. The plaintiff was Yakima Valley Grape Growers association.

Judge Ian R. MacIver held the association's by-laws permitted it to operate on an annual pool basis. It was not required to pay cash for the grapes at time of delivery. Copland was bound by the by-laws, the judge held.

A CROSS-COMPLAINT was dismissed. Copeland had sought to collect an alleged balance owing for his 1948 crop. The judge held the 1948 was not yet closed because a suit was pending against Welch Grape Juice Co., to collect the alleged balance of the purchase price.

Church was dismissed from the case. MacIver held the evidence did not show the Kennewick processor had maliciously induced Copeland to violate his contract.

Memories Of Ada Saville's Life

Posted Dec 1, 2013 by Lesley Luth

In 1999, Ada's niece Irene Rowbotham Cooper wrote down what she remembered about her aunt:

"I guess I was the only one in the family who was around Auntie Ada. She lived in Long Beach, California and I lived in Burbank, California and we quite often went to see her and to check up on her. She had a little house on Gaviota Ave. with some little rentals in the back.

My first memory of Auntie Ada was at Union Station (train station) in Salt Lake City when she arrived in America from England. I remember the great big room with the benches and meeting Auntie Ada for the first time. I wasn't quite sure of the year until one time when I was talking to her, she said that when she first met me she said, 'How old are you?' I answered, 'Five,' and she said 'It must be nice to be five.' That would have been 1925. She was married to Levi Day and I really liked him. He was jovial, lots of fun and very nice to Keith and me. They went on to live in Long Beach where Levi had a good job with Edison Electric which he kept until retirement.

I remember they came to visit at least once to Salt Lake City. Levi had a lovely big car and would take me for a ride. I suppose the rest of the family went along, too. We stopped for a sandwich or some ice cream and he was always so friendly and nice to the waitresses.

Uncle Levi wanted children very much, but Auntie Ada couldn't have them, so they arranged to adopt a child. All the papers were signed and they were going up the front steps to pick up the baby when Auntie Ada decided she didn't want to be responsible for a child and turned around and went home. It must have been quite a blow to Uncle Levi and it wasn't long after that that they were divorced. Auntie complained a lot about how Levi embarrassed her with his overly-friendly ways and loud voice. I felt bad about it and missed him. He married another lady some years later. She had four children and he helped her raise them.

Auntie Ada loved to dance and soon found another man and married him. I think his name was either Smith or Campbell. Around this time we moved from Salt Lake to southern California. I was married by then. We kept in touch and when she was about 65, she was in an automobile accident and hurt her knee. She had recently buried a husband, William Blaker, and was living alone with her dog. Auntie always loved dogs and really indulged them. When we checked up on her, she was still in bed, still suffering from her knee injury. One of her tenants was taking care of her and getting her groceries. She finally had to go to the hospital where she stayed for several months. We went back and forth and finally found a nursing home for her.

The nursing home gave her therapy and succeeded in getting her to walk again. It wasn't long, though, until I heard from a nice lady who was visiting another patient that someone had been racing down the hall in his wheelchair and had knocked her down. So, she was bedridden again. That same lady wrote me regularly about her condition and I sent Ada clothes and the Hershey bars that she so loved.

By this time, we had moved to Phoenix and were not able to see her as often, but when we visited California, we always went to see her. She had appointed me her Conservator and when her money ran out, it was necessary to sell her home. The nice lady continued to write me and to write letters for Ada. One day Ada got really sick and had to go to the hospital. She died February 8, 1982.

She had given me her burial instructions and I had brought home the dress she wanted to be buried in. It was one of the dresses she loved to wear when she went dancing. That dress was in the closet of our home for years and whenever we traveled, I always reminded the children where Auntie's dress was, just in case she died.

We went to Long Beach and she had a very nice funeral. She was buried in a lovely spot in Westminster Memorial Park in Orange County. During the service, the minister called her "dear heart" and said some nice and appropriate things. Auntie had not attended a church, so the funeral home provided the minister.

I always appreciated Bess, my cousin Thomas Beverly's wife, because she wrote such nice letters to Ada and I'm sure Ada appreciated her, too.

Mother told me that Ada was the youngest child in the Saville family--one sister was born after her, but she died within the year--and she was much doted upon by her mother and father.

I think that just about covers the memories that I have."

Ada had dark brown hair, blue eyes and stood 5' 2 1/2" tall.

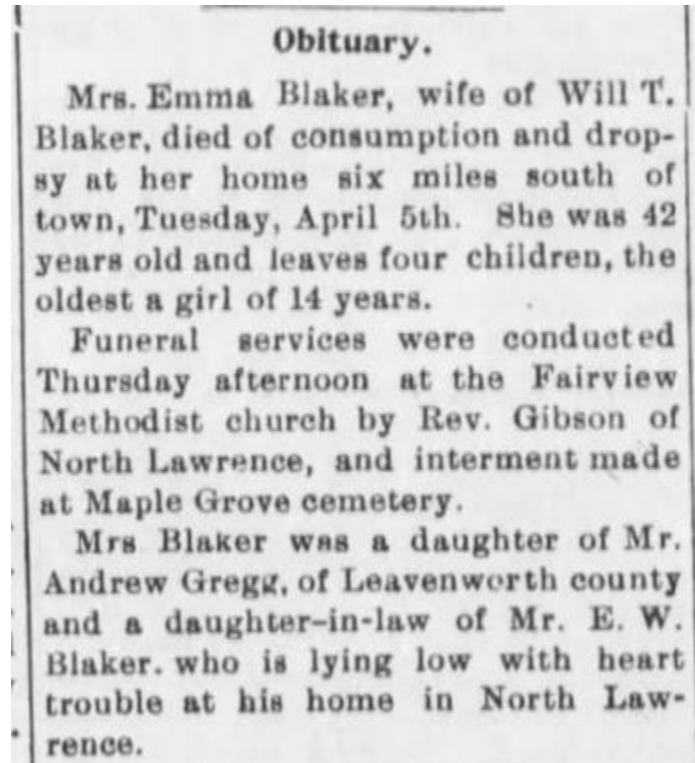

Ruth married a man named Hamby between the 1920 census & Oct 1936 when she married Ernest Blaker as Ruth Hamby.

Was a widow at the time of her death; had been married to Paul V. Hughes. He has been hard to trace definitively.

In the 1940 census for Long Beach, Los Angeles CA, Levy (or Levi) Day (47 England, machinist at an electric power plant) lived at 2736 Cedar Ave. with wife Ester C. Day (31 NE) & her son/his stepson, Robert Volland, 17 CA.

In the 1952 Long Beach CA city directory, Wesley A. & Ada S. Campbell lived at 455 Gaviota Ave. He was a pipefitter, NA&ND. In the 1957 Long Beach CA city directory, Wesley & Ada continued to live at 455 Gaviota Ave.; no occupations are listed.

Ada's sister was Elizabeth Saville, b. 3 May 1889 England, d. 20 Nov 1986 Hamilton, Ravalli MT. Elizabeth married Alexander Kasky (1893-1970, F: 59611468). Elizabeth Kasky is buried in Riverview Cemetery, Hamilton, Ravalli MT, F: 59611506. Her MT death record also identifies her as the daughter of Briton Saville & Emma Hyde.

According to "Memories of Ada Saville" posted on Ancestry.com on 1 Dec 2013 by Lesley Luth. These were memories of Ada Saville written in 1999 by her niece, Irene Rowbotham Cooper. Irene recalled that as a small child she would visit Ada at her "little house" on Gaviota Avenue, Long Beach CA, which had "little rentals in the back." Irene recalled meeting Ada for the first time at Union Station in Salt Lake City UT when Ada arrived from England, ca. 1925. Her husband at the time was Levi Day. "I really liked him. He was jovial, lots of fun and very nice to Keith and me," said Irene. Levi & Ada lived in Long Beach CA where Levi worked for Edison Electric until his retirement. 'Uncle Levi wanted children very much, but Auntie Ada couldn't have them, so they arranged to adopt a child.' With all the paperwork completed, Levi & Ada were climbing the steps of a house to pick up the baby "when Auntie Ada decided she didn't want to be responsible for a child and turned around and went home. It must have been quite a blow to Uncle Levi and it wasn't long after that they were divorced. Auntie complained a lot about how Levi embarrassed her with his overly-friendly ways and loud voice. Levi remarried & his new wife had 4 children he helped raise.

"Auntie Ada loved to dance and soon found another man and married him. I think his name was either Smith or Campbell." Shortly after Ernest Blaker died, Ada was in a car accident which injured her knee. She required a hospital stay of several months, and then moved to a nursing home. With therapy, Ada learned to walk again, but then another patient in a

wheelchair knocked her down in a hallway, making her bedridden again. Irene was the conservator of Ada's estate and once her funds were depleted, Irene had to sell her house. "One day Ada got really sick and had to to the hospital. She died February 8, 1982. She had given me her burial instructions and I had brought home the dress she wanted to be buried in. It was one of the dresses she loved to wear when she went dancing." Irene recalled, "Mother told me that Ada was the youngest child in the Saville family – one sister was born after her, but she died within the year, and she was much doted upon by her mother and father."
