*Fate of 3 St. Louisans on
Tuscania Not Yet Known*



VERNON BALDWIN...

No Word Has Reached Families
of D. S. Schwartz, Vernon
Baldwin and G. H. Lewis.

THE families of the three soldiers from St. Louis who were on board the transport Tuscania when it was sunk Tuesday night by a torpedo off the coast of Ireland, have not yet learned the fate of the soldiers. The War Department has announced that more than 100 of the 2177 soldiers on board perished, but the names have not been given out.

The three St. Louisans were Sergt. DeWitt S. Schwartz, son of George W. Schwartz of 5560 Cates avenue, Southwestern freight agent of the Vandalia Railroad; Private Vernon Baldwin, son of S. H. Baldwin of 3860 Juniata avenue, and Private

George H. Lewis, brother of Mrs. M. L. Prewett of 4461 Swan avenue.

Young Schwartz was a student at Soldan High School until two years ago, when he went to Akron, O., to engage in the lumber business. He enlisted in the field artillery April 7, last, and later was transferred to the Twentieth Engineers. Lewis and Baldwin were in the 158th Aero Squad.

Herman L. Bennett of Belleville, also a private in the 158th Aero Squad, was one of those on board.

V.A. Baldwin Rites Wednesday

HARBOR SPRINGS — Funeral for Vernon A. Baldwin, 74, will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday from the Gillian-Irwin Funeral Chapel, the Rev. David Crow of the First Presbyterian Church officiating. Burial will be in Lakeview Cemetery.

Mr. Baldwin died Feb. 1 at Lockwood-MacDonald Hospital following a long illness.

Born Oct. 7, 1895, in St. Louis, Mo., Mr. Baldwin was married to the former Corneilia Wager Jan. 8, 1942, in Petoskey.

He served with the Army Air Force during World War I and was a member of the First Presbyterian Church.

He is survived by his widow; one son, Neil, of Harbor Springs; one daughter, Mrs. Rene (Marsha) Menard of Murrayville, Ill.; and five grandchildren.

Friends may call at the funeral chapel from 3 until 9 p.m. Tuesday. The family has suggested those wishing to honor the memory of Mr. Baldwin may do so through donations to the First Presbyterian Church.

THREE ST. LOUISANS ON THE TUSCANIA SAFE IN IRELAND

**Relatives of Sergt. Dewitt Schwartz
and Privates Vernon Baldwin and
G. H. Lewis Get Telegram.**

Relative of the three St. Louis soldiers, Sergt. Dewitt Schwartz, 5560 Cates avenue; Private Vernon Baldwin, 3860 Juniata street, and Private George H. Lewis, 4461 Swan avenue, aboard the torpedoed transport Tuscania, have been notified of their safe arrival at an Irish port. The information was contained in a telegram from Senator Stone.

Sergt. Schwartz, formerly a student at Soldan High School, enlisted in the field artillery at Akron, O., April 7, and later was transferred to the Twentieth Engineers. Privates Baldwin and Lewis are attached to the 158th Aero Squad.

Will I. Jordan, 20-year-old son of Will Jordan, editor of Belleville and Pana (Ill.) newspapers, who also was aboard the Tuscania, has survived the disaster, his father was informed. Young Jordan was a member of the 100th Aero Squad. Two young Missourians, William G. Smith of Festus and Walter Alexander of Marshall, still are missing. Smith is an infantryman with the Camp Travis detachment, while Alexander is a member of the 100th Aero Squad.

Cornelia Marie Baldwin departed her earthly home on Dec. 11, 1996, at the age of 94.

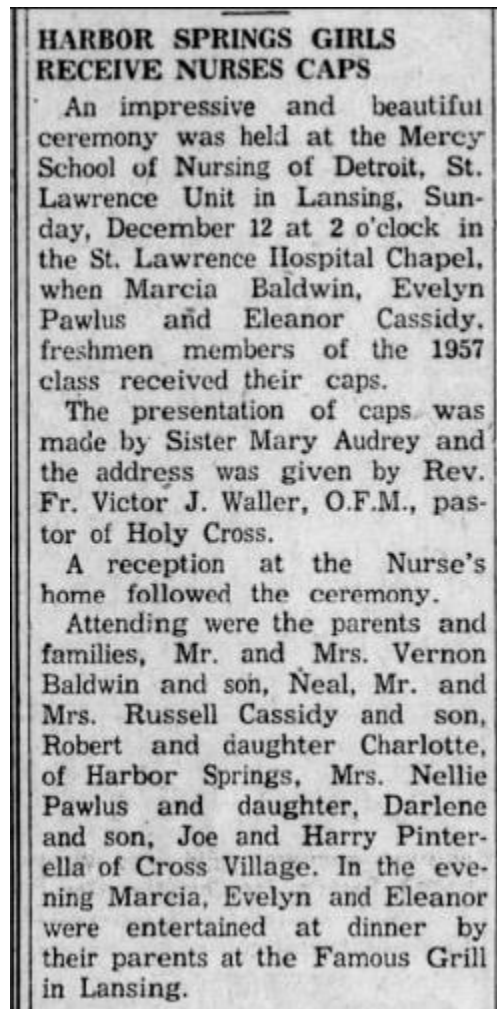

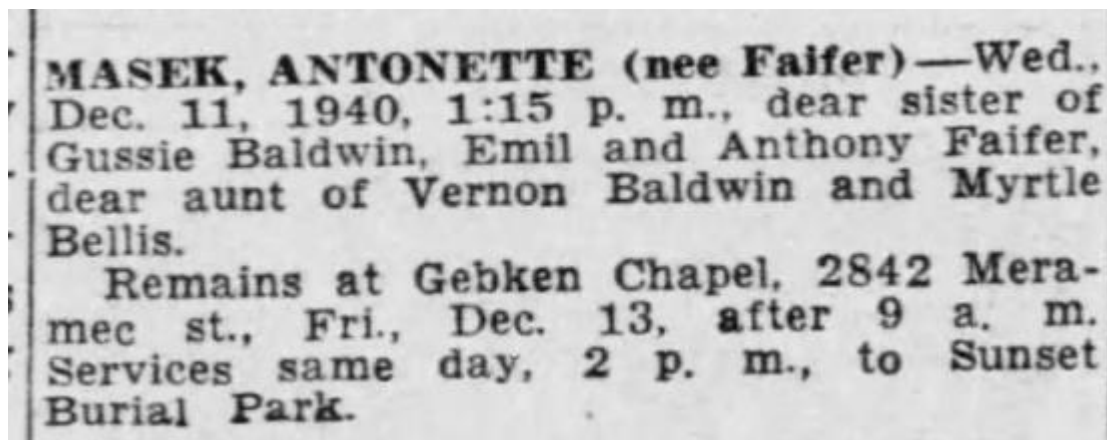
