


Irvin Bodwell, 62, Services Today

Celsius served in the Texas Rangers, Co. C., 10 Dec 1873 – 6 Mar 1874 & in Co. B, Mar 1878-Apr 1878. He is also listed as a Civil War veteran. He also served as a US government teamster in the wars with the Comanche & Kiowa in 1874-1875. He gave his occupation as "cowboy" while in the Rangers. – His name appears as Oliver Putnam Bodwell on his TX death certificate.

in the 1930 census, Grant Bodwell Jr., age 39, is living with his father C.P. Bodwell Sr. in Cass Co. TX. Grant Jr. is listed as C.P.'s son, while a woman named Annie May Bodwell, age 37 b. TX is listed as C.P.'s daughter-in-law. First her status is listed as "wife" – then "daughter-in-law" is added. There are 2 children, a boy named Ra--- Bodwell (12 TX) & a girl Willie Lee Bodwell (9 TX0. First their status is written as "son" and "daughter" then "gr" is added to make them grandson & granddaughter. Annie Mae's year of birth, place of birth & her age do not match those of Zetta's, who is listed as Grant's wife in the 1920 & 1940 censuses. Zetta cannot be located in the 1930 census. Because of the use of Jr., might this be Grant's brother Celsius Putnam Bodwell Jr. instead?
