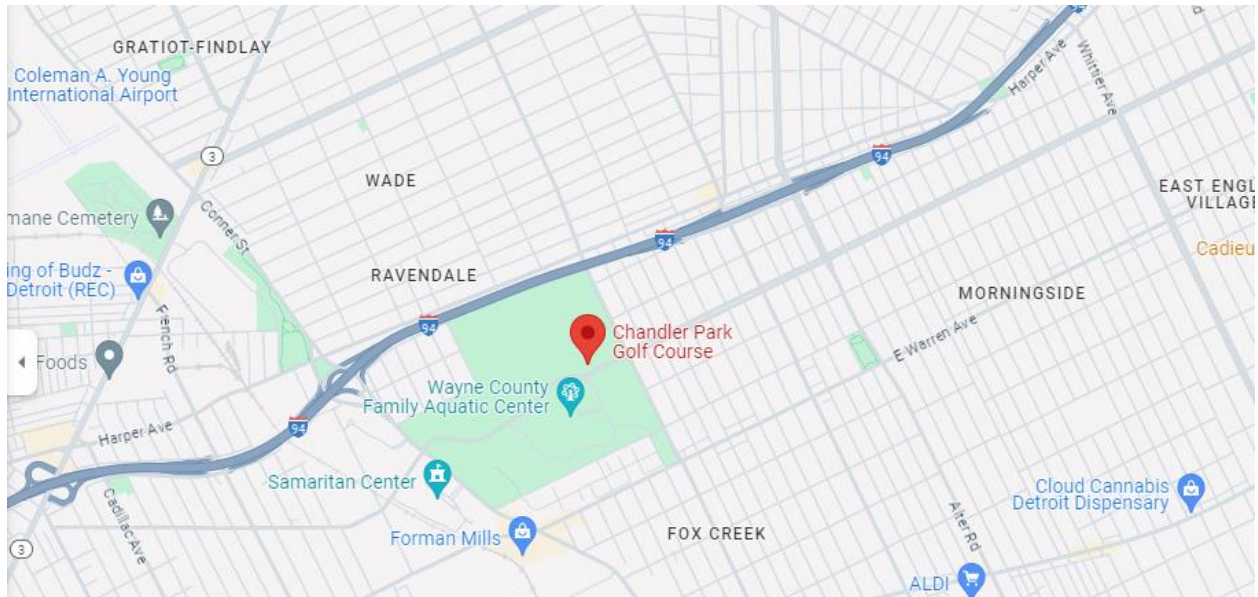

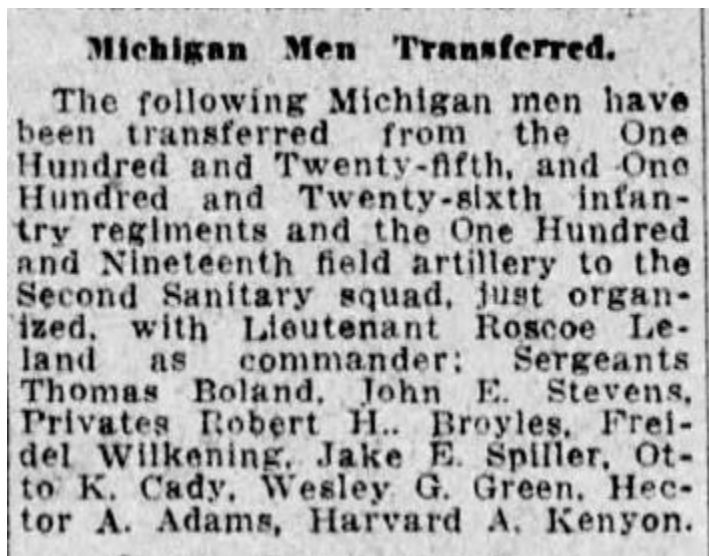

Detroit Journal Transmits Roster of Those Who Were on
Cunard Liner Sunk in War Zone Tuesday
Night.

DETROIT, Feb. 8.—The Detroit Journal Friday received from its Washington correspondent a list of persons aboard the liner Tuscania. The list includes soldiers and civilians and does not designate the companies to which the men belonged. Eighteen men were from Detroit. The remainder of the list follows:

One "Fine Boy" Missing.

Mrs. W. A. Cargett, 56 East Montcalm street, when informed that the name of Thomas P. Boland, whose address was given as 56 East Montcalm street, was included in the list of those on the Tuscania, fervently remarked, "He was too fine a boy to be taken away like that. I couldn't believe he perished."

Boland, who is listed as a sergeant with Sanitary Squad No. 2, Thirty-second division, is not a relative of the Cargett family, but was regarded in the Cargett home as an adopted son. His own parents died when he was a young boy, and as far as he knows he has no living relatives, Mr. Cargett said.

Sergeant Boland is 29 years old. He was born in Ireland, and was taken to Toronto, Canada, by his parents, when he was only 2 years old.

JUST GOLF

PUBLIC course golf of mid-summer proportions was played in Detroit Thursday, when the Rackham and Belle Isle layouts were opened for the first time this season.

The attendance at the big Rackham course was slightly in excess of 500, while at Belle Isle close to 400 rounds were played. In the meantime another column of golfers was parading the other city-owned course, that at Palmer park, which was opened Saturday.

Those not familiar with golf may not grasp the significance of these figures. They mean that close to capacity crowds were entertained, from early morning until sundown.

Some idea of the turnout at Rackham can be gained from the fact that from nine o'clock on there was a long lineup of players awaiting their turns to tee off. Waits of from an hour to an hour and a half were necessary from then on until quitting time.

The first rounds at Rackham were played by a threesome comprised of Richard Yates, of Pine Lake, one of the better known of the district's younger golfers; John Reindel and Willis Jones. They didn't waste any time in starting, getting away around six o'clock.

Both Rackham and Belle Isle are in excellent condition for this early in the season. Six of the fairways at Rackham were torn up much of last season in order to place drainage pipes and close the ditch which traverses the layout. The work has been completed and three of the fairways have already been leveled. The same will be done on the other three at once.

Play was free at Rackham yesterday, but starting today the same charge as last year will be made. One dollar will be charged for 18 holes, \$1.50 for all day and 50 cents for twilight golf, that is late afternoon play.

Maurice Rubenstein again is manager at Rackham. He was the city's first public course manager, starting when the Belle Isle course was opened in 1922. Tom Holand has returned as the Belle Isle manager and Frank Harris is in charge at Palmer park.

GOLFERS OPEN CITY COURSES

*All Five Layouts Are
Now in Play*

Golf is in full swing for the first time this season on the five City-owned courses as a result of the opening on Friday of the Rackham and River Rouge layouts. Palmer Park was in play all winter, as was the first nine at Chandler Park, while the second nine at Chandler and the Belle Isle course opened last week-end.

Lured by the warm weather and a sun of mid-summer proportions, good sized turnouts were reported at Rackham and River Rouge, both eighteen-hole layouts and the City's major courses. Fairways are in good condition, and if the present weather continues, these courses, as well as the others, will attract many more linksmen over the week-end.

A veteran staff of managers again directs play on the City's courses. In each case the same manager is back on the job. Maurice Rubenstein, the real veteran of the lot, again is at Rackham. F. W. Harris has charge at Palmer Park, L. L. Klatt at River Rouge, T. P. Boland at Chandler, and E. M. Ramsay at Belle Isle.

Began at Belle Isle

Rubenstein has been with the City golf department ever since the Belle Isle course, the first of the City-owned layouts, was opened in 1922. He was transferred to Rackham when play began there in 1925, and has been there ever since. Harris came to Belle Isle a few months after Rubenstein and continued there until Palmer was opened.

Boland also received his early training on the little Belle Isle course, starting there in 1925 and moving over to Chandler in 1929. Ramsay has been the Belle Isle manager since Boland left there.

The City's official golf family will have another addition on May 1, when Leo Conroy will resume his duties as professional. Conroy, who has been with the department since 1926, again will instruct at Belle Isle, Palmer and Chandler.

Fees Are Unchanged

The same fees are being charged this season. The charge is 25 cents for nine holes at Belle Isle, Palmer and Chandler, with an additional fee of 25 cents for those who desire to play the full 18 holes at Palmer and Chandler. Double starting times are assigned to avoid waits at the tenth tee after completing the first nine.

At Rackham the charge is \$1 for all day play, with a special twilight rate of 50 cents after 4 o'clock. This charge includes use of the locker room and shower. At River Rouge the fee is 75 cents with a twilight rate of 40 cents.

To facilitate starting and avoid delays for golfers after their arrival at Rackham, a larger building has been opened adjacent to the first tee. Supplies also may be purchased there.

Starting with a handful of survivors in 1919, the organization, which has a potential membership of 2,500, numbers nearly 1,000, according to Lester W. Piot, of 19950 Andover.

Those who met with Piot are Thomas P. Boland, of 2669 Coplin; Carlo Rosignoli, of 3869 French; Bernard E. Flicker, of Monroe, and Mack C. Rogers, of Flint.

Rackham Manager Was in Charge of City's First Golf Layout at Belle Isle

Maurice Rubenstein is on the job again as manager of the Rackham golf course, his twenty-first season with the city's golf department. He began as manager at Belle Isle in 1922, when the nine-hole layout, the first of the city-owned courses here, was opened. He took over at Rackham when play began there several years later and has been there ever since.

Missing, though, as the new golf season gets under way is Frank W. Harris, who had been Palmer Park's manager since 1924. Harris died last fall. Like Rubenstein, Harris began at Belle Isle the first year it was in operation. His first job was on the greens but after a few months he was transferred

KEEP 'EM WAITING

Jammed Golf Courses First Sign of Spring

As far as Detroit golfers were concerned, spring arrived Sunday—one day ahead of its official schedule.

The municipal golf courses have been open a week waiting for a rush. Sunday it came. All six links handled more play than in the entire previous week.

* * *

THERE EVEN were waiting lines. Manager Frank Dursek at Redford reported a 45-minute wait on the first tee during the peak period. A total of 155 golfers played Redford, which has only the first 14 holes open.

Dursek said that the course was dry.

Chandler did the biggest business, with 271 players touring the layout. Manager Tom Boland declared that the course had a few wet spots and that

the longest wait at the first tee was 25 minutes about 3 p.m.

Palmer Park reported 190 players. Rackham had an even 100. Rouge Park attracted 77 and Belle Isle 28. Palmer Park, Rackham and Rouge were reported in dry condition, but Manager Leo Klatt stated that Belle Isle still was soggy.

THE TOTAL PLAY Sunday at the six city courses was 821 rounds. In the previous seven days, there were 714 customers.

in the U.S., Border Crossings from Canada to U.S., 1895-1960



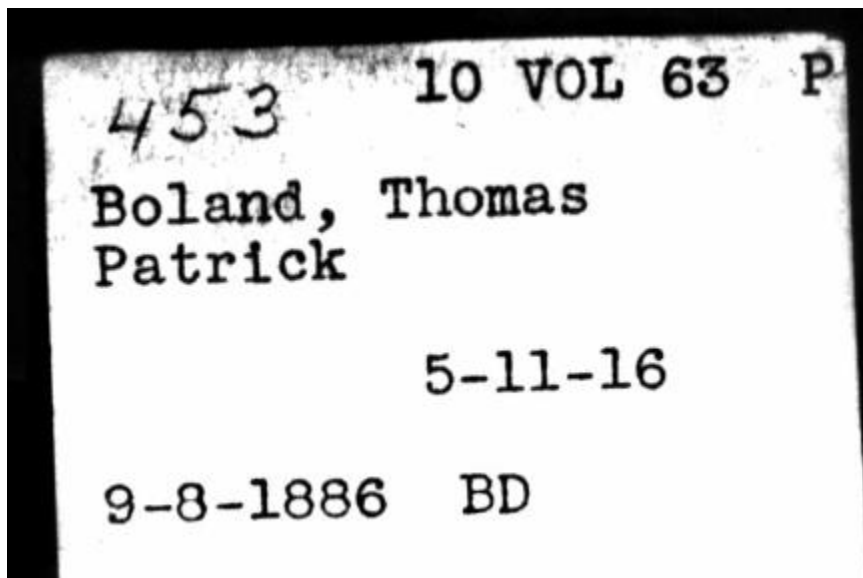

[Which was 1 of the 20 ships in the convoy that Tuscania sailed in]

"Detroit Free Press" 9 Feb 1918 p 1 – [Thomas had listed his "sister" – Edith (Mrs. W.A.) Cargett – of his next of kin on Tuscania, and then on his return home] Mrs. W.A. Cargett, 56 E. Montcalm St., when informed that Thomas Boland of that address was on the Tuscania said, "He was too fine a boy to be taken away like that. I couldn't believe he perished." Thomas is a sergeant in Sanitary Squad 2 and is not a relative of the Cargett family. He "was regarded in the Cargett home as an adopted son." His parents died when he was young [they were still alive when he was 14] and "as far as he knows he has no living relatives" [he had 8 siblings-]. He is 29 years old, born in Ireland, and was taken to Toronto, Canada, by his parents when he was 2 years old.
