

Mrs. Terrell was born Oct. 21, 1942, in Sherman, Texas, to Grover and Sylvia Bond. She grew up in Gordonville and graduated from Whitesboro High School in 1959, only 16 years old, and was salutatorian of her class. She moved to Dallas and attended Draughons Business School and in 1960 went to work for the federal government, working in V.A. administration. In 1970, she transferred to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and retired from that department this year, after some 25 years of service.

In addition to her career away from home, Mrs. Terrell worked with her husband of 32 years in their home, raising not only their one son but five nieces and nephew as their own.

She was a loving wife, mother and sister, and will be deeply missed in the lives of her family.



Beloved wife and mother, Wanda Coley, passed away on Saturday, February 8, 2014 at the Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital-WNJ in Sherman, TX from complications following surgery.


