



### Sixteen Illinois Men Aboard.

There are known to have been at least sixteen Illinois men aboard the Tuscania whose homes were outside of Chicago. Four are members of the One Hundred aero squadron—Otto E. Bethard, Beardstown; Leland S. Radcliffe, Dwight; William P. Jordan, Pana, and Harry Carpenter, Potomac.

In the One Hundred and Fifty-eighth aero squadron are eight more—Sergt. Henry A. Skinner, Rockford; Maurice E. Peck, Rockford; Kendall H. Peck, Monticello; James J. Norris Jr., Olin; John A. Booth, Springfield; Fred O. Barger, Decatur; Corporal Guy W. Burnett, Eldorado.

In the Camp Travis detachment No. 1 overseas casuals were Elmer Jones, Nebo; Morton McKendrick, Marion, and McSapp, Hillsboro. Stanley E. Hill of the First sanitary squad was from Rockford. Leo N. Sauer of sanitary squad 2 was from Milwaukee.

# POTOMAC SOLDIER ON THE TUSCANIA.

Harry Carpenter, a farm hand who worked in and about Potomac for some time, was a member of the 100th Aero Squadron, aboard the Tuscania, sunk by a German submarine off the Irish coast. Carpenter entered at Danville last summer, at the same time as did Fred Taylor, brother of Ed and Bill Taylor, of Taylor Brothers, horse auctioneers. Taylor is now in France. Whether Carpenter was rescued was not known early Friday.

Other men from this section of the country were Kendall H. Peck of Monticello; John A. Booth of Springfield, and Fred D. Barger of Decatur, all members of the 158th Aero Squadron, and Mo Sapp of Hillsboro, Ill., Camp Travis detachment, overseas casuals.—Hoopeston Herald.

# Local U.S. Army Recruiting Station Helps 19 to Get Papers

Does Sun advertising produce results?

If you are in doubt, ask Sergeant Robert E. Surber, non-commissioned officer in charge of U. S. Army Recruiting with quarters in the St. Bernard Hotel.

Yesterday morning an item told that Sergeant Surber would be willing to take the finger prints and fill out the blanks for those ex-soldiers, sailors and marines who saw service during the war, and who are entitled to adjusted compensation. Today 19 one-time fighters for Uncle Sam appeared at the recruiting station, had their prints taken and their blanks filled out and went on their way rejoicing.

"I'm not swamped," Surber said last night. "I can take care of many more—and the War Department has the clerical force to handle many times the number of applications it now receives. It is surprising how few men have taken advantage of the compensation. Not more than 10 per cent of those eligible have their applications in Washington.

Former service men living in San Bernardino, or in any town in Southern California, are invited to drop in at the recruiting office and get "fixed up." There is no charge whatever for the operation, and no obligation. The first on the list, Sergeant Surber asserts, will be the first to receive their compensation. 



# Caroline Booth, Was Teacher At Cedar Vale

In her lifetime Caroline M Booth traveled the world but always spent summers in her hometown, Cedar Valo

Her years as a public school teacher and her generosity in establishing a scholarship for the outstanding senior at Cedar Vale High School led to her being one of five nominees for the town's outstanding citizen in 1980.

Mrs. Booth, 86, died Tuesday. Services will be at 10:30 a.m. Friday at the Miles Funeral Home.

At the age of 17, Mrs. Booth taught at the Lookout Valley School. She attended College at Kansas State University and took advanced courses at the University of Chicago. She also attended the Wichita Business College.

She worked for a brief time at a Wichita bank before moving back to Cedar Vale.

Her teaching career included a year at the Cedar Vale elementary school and three years as a teacher at the high school

In 1955, after she was married to Curtis Booth, she spent much of the year traveling or living in St. Petersburg, Fla.

She traveled to every state in the nation except Vermont, as well as through much of Europe.

Survivors include a stepson, Howard Booth of Chicago; a sister, Mrs. Josephine Gilliland of Leon, and a grandson, David Booth of Chicago.

A divorce was filed 14 Aug 1919 in Springfield, Sangamon IL. They had 2 children: Geraldine Myra Hickey & Charles Edward ("Bud") Hickey.
