**Another Arkansan Who
Was Lost on Tuscania**

Fordyce, Feb. 25.—Claud Bradley, age 27 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. D. W. Bradley, living several miles from this place, perished aboard the transport Tuscania, sunk off the Irish coast. He enlisted as a corporal in Company M, Third Arkansas National Guards, at Fordyce last August, and after being sent to Camp Beauregard, La., was transferred to the 20th Engineer Corps at Washington. Corporal Bradley is the first one from Dallas county who has given his life in foreign service. An appropriate memorial service will be held at this place in his honor.

FORDYCE CO. OFFICERS AT FORT LOGAN H. ROOTS

Fordyce, July 17.—(Special.)—Captain J. Byron Atkinson of the Fordyce Company of the Third Arkansas Regiment and nine of his officers are attending the training camp at Little Rock for the officers of this regiment. The company was mustered into service June 9, and since that time the guardmen have been drilling regularly at nights, with one platoon at Rison, one at Camden and one at Fordyce. Preparations for Federal examination and the mustering into the service of the United States August 5 are now in progress.

of whom are yet reported as survi-
vors, according to the Washington
dispatch.

Nathan B. Short, of Stephens, Ark.,

FOUR ARKANSANS TUSCANIA VICTIMS

**Late Reports of Disaster In-
clude Men Who Enlisted
From This State.**

In the list of Tuscania victims given out yesterday by the War Department, four Arkansas men lost their lives when the Tuscania was sunk by a submarine off the Irish coast. They are: William E. Bennett, Rogers; Nathan B. Short, Stephens and Claude Bradley of Swaty. Sterling E. Collon of St. James, listed as a passenger, was also lost when the boat was sunk, according to the report.

According to the Washington report, Claude Bradley of Swaty, several miles below Princeton, was also lost in the Tuscania tragedy. Efforts to get in touch with relatives at that place were made by the Gazette, but his family could not be located.

FORDYCE MEN FORM LEGION

Fordyce, March 19.—About 30 ex-service men attended an American Legion organization meeting which was held in the A. O. U. W. hall. Jack Forsythe was elected post commander and William Acruman post adjutant. The post will be called the "Claude Bradley Post of the American Legion."

A vote was taken on the bonus questions and about two-thirds of those present were against a cash bonus, but the majority favored a plan whereby the government would make long term loans of money to service men, with which to buy homes or farms. These loans would be secured only by the property purchased and the payments to be arranged in small amounts, to come due yearly.

The meeting was called by Captain Byron Atkinson, for the purpose of organizing a Legion post and taking up the bonus question. Major Friedman of Pine Bluff, who is assistant adjutant general of Arkansas, attended the meeting and assisted in the organization.

Another meeting will be held Friday night at which time the organization will be completed. Several more officers are to be elected and a constitution and by-laws will be adopted. All service men are invited to be present and become charter members of the Claude Bradley Post.

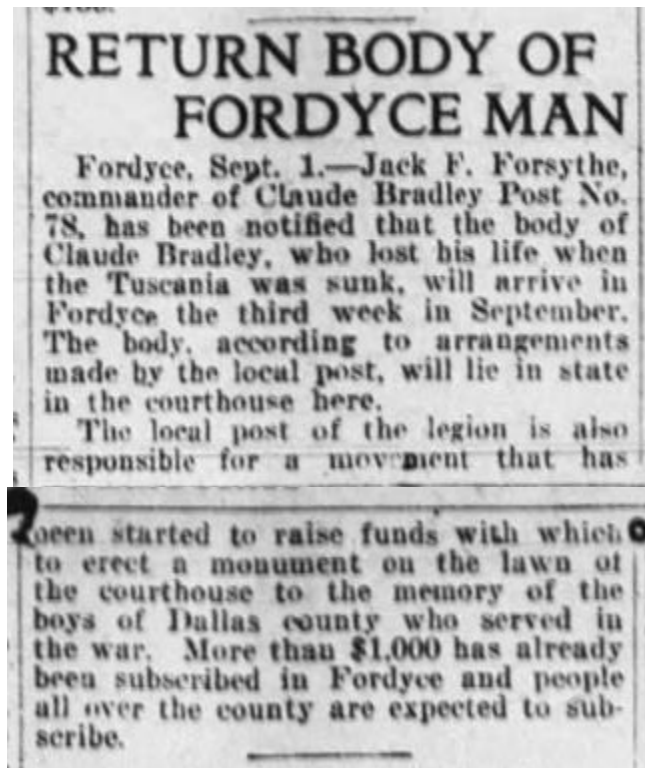

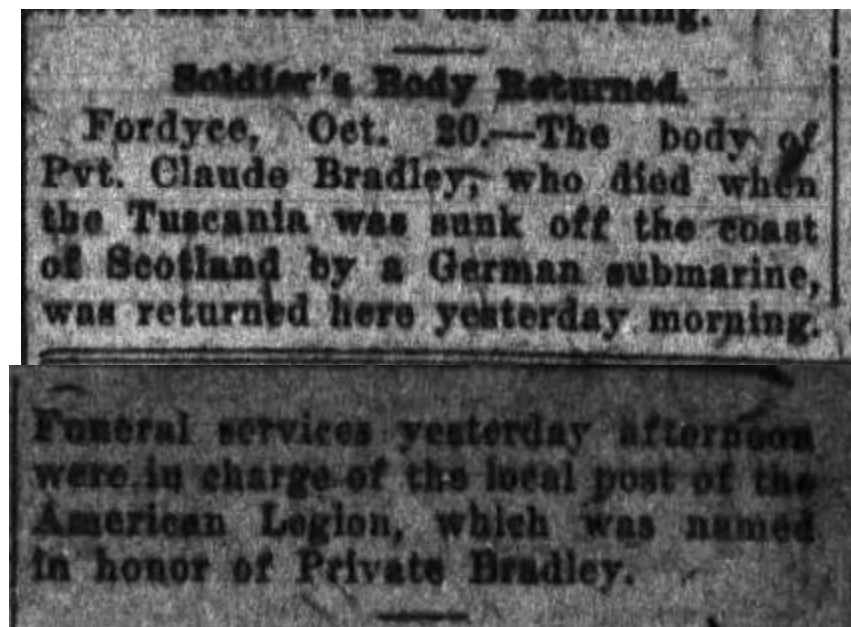

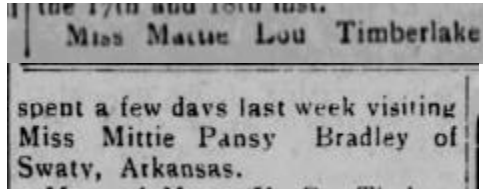
