

SANBORNTON — Clarence H. Bradshaw, 83, of Sanbornton Road, army veteran of World War I, died in Lakes Region General Hospital Friday, after a brief illness.

A native of Wayland, Mass., he lived here since 1905.

He served in France and Germany in World War I. He was a 53-year member of Wilkins-Smith Post, American Legion.

He leaves two cousins, Lewis M. Atwell and Mrs. Annie Gates, both of Framingham, Mass.

Services were held last night in Wilkinson-Beane Funeral Home the Rev. David P. Picciano, pastor of Sanbornton Baptist Church officiated. Cremation was to be held at Harmony Grove, Salem, Mass., and the ashes buried in Lakeview Cemetery, Cochituate, Mass.

MORE SURVIVORS OF THE TUSCANIA ARE ANNOUNCED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20.—The war department last night announced the names of 44 additional roldiers who were rescued from the torpedoed liner Tuscania and that of one other man listed as missing, who, it has develops, was not on the ship.

Those not previously accounted for include:

Second Lieutenant Richard Warren, Waltham, Mass., and Privates Clarence H. Bradshaw, Haverhill, Mass., and George R. V. Cary, Springfield,

Edgar H. Taber, Providence, R. L. was also saved.

Only 74 American soldiers are now unaccounted for. Included in that number are the 33 unidentified dead buried on the Scottish coast.

BOYS SANG AS TUSCANIA SANK

Bradshaw Saved Rifle, His Pal the Flag

HAVERHILL, March 9.—The American soldiers on the Tuscania, which was torpedoed off the Irish coast, sang "Pack Your Troubles in Your Old Kit Bag and Smile, Smile, Smile," while the vessel was sinking, writes Clarence H. Bradshaw, one of the survivors, in a letter to his father, William A. Bradshaw of 45 Kingsbury avenue, Bradford district, received this afternoon.

Bradshaw, who is a member of the Sixth Battalion, 20th Engineers, says that he saved the only rifle from the ship and that his companion rescued the Stars and Stripes just as it was about to sink beneath the waves. He and his pal, who saved the flag, had their pictures taken together and will appear in the movies, which will be shown in the United States, he says:

Sept 23-Complexities in its constitution as a result of its merger two years ago with the United Shoe Workers of America. were ironed out today at the annual convention of the Shoe Workers Protective Union of America here at the Powers Hotel. Many important amendments were adopted. See Daniel F. Fitzgerald of Haverhill, Mass, in his annual report, says the Union gained 2000 members and organized two important locals, one in Newark, N J, and another in Brooklyn, during the last 13 re- n'ha. The finances of all locals and the national body are in a healthy condition he said. The Protective now contrus 11,000 shoe workers. Pres John D. Nolan's report con-tained a number of recommendations, including one for increased appropriations for organization work. stromed the importance of the union in stabilizing competitive conditions in in stabilizing competitive conditions in the shoe industry. There is no conflict with A. F. of L. shoe workers' unions, he maintained. Ellsworth Melanson of Salem, Mass, was chairman of today's sessions. Joseph J. Hanlon of Haverhill was vice chairman. Hanlon and Melanson are members of the constitution committee and Katherine Forsyth of Haverhill is serving as its secretary. Anna Bergeron and Thomas F. Collins of Haverhill are members of the grievance committee.

COURT LAYS BAN ON UNION'S FUNDS

Shoe Workers' Protective Head Is Enjoined

Writ Affects District Council 10 A of Havernill in Suit Here

A temporary injunction was issued by Judge Qua in the Suifolk Superior Court yesterday, restrairing John D. Nolan, general president of the Shoe Workers' Protective Union, from disposing of any property or funds of District Council 10A of Haverhill, except dues collected since Dec 10 last and dues to be collected. The injunction was granted on the petition of Clara Horsfall, Elizabeth Kelley, Mae B. Patriquen, Masie Manning, Eleanor M. (Mother) Rooney, Sarah T. Nabgle, Katherine Forsyth, Yvonne Lamere and Marion Smith.

In the bill on which the court took action yesterday Attorney Lowell A. Mayberry, counsel for the women, said that there are two notes, one for \$1500 and one for \$7500, in possession of Nolan. Attorney Frederick W. Mansfield, counsel for the latter, says there is no foundation in fact for that remark.

A cross bill has been brought against the women by Nolan. In this he asserts they have failed to obey the rules of the union and have caused considerable trouble as a result. Edward M. Dangle, as master, will hear issues in the case beginning Monday, to determine the facts and report back to the court for final action.
