

MILLARD BROOKS, RETIRED TEACHER, OF BRUNOT DIED

Millard Francis Brooks, 73year-old retired teacher of Brunot, died Sunday in Jefferson Barracks, Mo., after an eight year illness.

He was born June 14, 1893 in Patterson and had been a resident of Wayne and Iron County most of his life. He graduated from Greenville High School and attended Southeast Missouri State College at Cape Girardeau and the University of Missouri at Columbia. On May 25, 1921 he married Glaydis Elily Jones. He had been the superintendent of several schools in the Southeast Missouri area, the last school being Des Arc. He was a member of the Brunot Christian Church and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Chapter in Piedmont. He was an elder in the t church. He was a sergeant with | i the 100th Aerial Squadron in I World War and spent 1 months in France. Survivors include wife. his three sons, Milburn S. Brooks, Brunot: Charles P. Brooks, Manchester; and Jones H. Brooks, Waterloo, Ill.; four brothers, Will Brooks, Piedmont; Eli Ellington: Charles Brooks, Lowndes; and Fred Brooks, St. Louis; one sister, Mrs. Henson, Piedmont; and 10 grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 10 a. m. tomorrow in the Coder Funeral Chapel. The Rev. Louis Jordan will officiate and burial will be in the Mountain View Cemetery in Des Arc. There will be special VFW graveside rites.

Coder Funeral Home in Piedmont is in charge of arrangements.

The names are now being sent across the water in a steady stream and as rapidly as possible are being compiled for publication. Not until the entire list is in will the War Department be able to check up and determine those who gave up their lives.

In the list of over five hundred names of survivors received so far, five men were reported from Missouri, one from Kansas, one from Oklahoma and none from Nebraska.

The five Missourians are: Paul Griffith, Nevada; Churchill B. Kouns, Tuscumbia; James W. Burke, Beeman; Alva L. Beall, Greencastle; Millard Brooks, Burnot.

Millard Brooks Escapes Tuscania Disaster

There was considerable rejoicing in Greenville when the Sunday St. Louis papers, gave Millard Brooks as one of the Tuscania survivors. His name had
appeared as one of those aboard
the ill fated transport, which was
submarined last week, and great
fears were entertained here that
he was lost.

Millard is a member of the 100th Aero squadron and was probably the only Wayne county boy on the vessel. It is thought however that other local boys were on transports accompanying the Tuscania as some had been ordered from Camp Funston to New York and thought to leave New York about the time the Tuscania sailed. Among these were Stacy ing and Webb White. The Tuscania loss is now placed at 304.

I received your most welcome letter today and was glad to hear that every one and everything at home is all right. I am fine and dandy and working all the time yet. Am in the aero-repair work section. We take all the crashes and where the machine is to badly broken up we put in new parts, make and ring up new machines of them. Its very interesting work and I enjoy versions at it.

Was giad to learn about the people around home waking up and getting a slice of those conds, for the poorer people should but all they possibly can so that the will not all fail into the hords of the very wealthy.

Glad to hear about the church work too. Tell all the folks "Hello" for me and that I am still trying my best to live the Christian life and am succeeding by the help of Jesus, our dear Savior. I have felt the divine presence several times since I have been in the Army and have

had almost direct answer to prayers. Our temptations are terrible over here. I think worse here in England than anywhere else for we are more free to go where we please here than the boys in France and have more time of our own.

The crops look fine around here now. I guess you can tell about where I am by the post mark put on my letters. We couldn't hear anything when the last air raid was on in London but we knew it was going on.

Well, our boys are knocking the stuffin out of the Germans, if we can believe the papers, and I hope they keep it up. I guess you folks read lots of stuff in the papers now. There isn't any thing more to write about now so I'll stop for this time. Write as often as you can with all the news.

Mr. Smith says the public spirited people of the district also are making plans to raise funds necessary to construct a six room school building which will house the four classes which will have a total membership of 112 to say nothing of the pupils who will enter from the surrounding districts.

M. F. Brooks, who receives his degree at the Cape Girardeau Teachers' College this year, has been of chosen superintendent for the coming year. Mr. Brooks' was there year before last but did not teach this year because of his desire to attend college. Miss Arry Griffin has been re-employed as teacher of English and history. Two other members of the family will me employed in later.

Mr. Smith said yesterday that the high school course will include vocational agriculture and that federal and state aid will amount to \$1,600. The salary of the agricultural teacher will be \$2,400 a year and the person will be on duty the year around and work with those taking such work during the summer months by visiting the farms where they are employed. There is also some talk of a small demonstration tract being cared for by the class during the school months.

Great interest is being taken in the construction of the new building and boy students of the school have pledged themselves to dig the basement while others will haul the gravel for the foundation. Much of the other work also has been promised gratis by the friends of higher education.

The proposal for a four year high school by an increased fax levy was defeated at Tuesday's election by 78 votes.

The new post was chartered with fifteen members and elected Roscoe Mabrey as the first Commander.





On Sept. 17, 1954, he married Donna Kay Jones. She survives.





Notes:

It appears Millard was named for his father Isaac's brother, Millard. "Wayne County Journal & The Piedmont Weekly Banner" 3 Sep 1925 p 4 – Eli Brooks [Millard's brother] & Eli's father, Rev. I.L. Brooks of Brunot, left Patterson for Marine IL to attend the funeral of Isaac's younger brother, Millard Brooks.

There are hundreds of articles on Newspapers.com – found by searching Millard Francis Brooks, Millard F. Brooks, Millard Brooks and with many as M.F. Brooks.

Pre-war:

Member of Christian Endeavor in Greenville MO Sep 1914

"Piedmont (MO) Weekly Banner" 12 Aug 1915 p- 1 – Millard returned home 8 Aug from St. Louis where he was attending automobile school.

"Wayne County Journal" (Greenville MO) 29 Mar 1917 p 4 – Millard recently closed a successful term of school near Piedmont. Then he came to Greenville to associate with his brother, W.D. Brooks, in a garage & automobile repair shop. He took a course in auto work in St. Louis some time ago & is a "competent and trustworthy mechanic."

Wartime:

"Greenville Sun" 30 Aug 1917 p 1 – Millard, who is stationed at Jefferson Barracks, spent Sunday (26 Aug) with relatives & friends & left Monday morning, driving back to the barracks through Brunot MO, where he visited the home folks.

"Greenville Sun" 20 Sep 1917 p 4 – with 127th Squadron at Kelly Field TX

"Wayne County Journal" (Greenville MO) 14 Feb 1918 p 1

"Millard Brooks Escapes Tuscania Disaster" – "considerable rejoicing in Greenville" when the Sunday St. Louis newspapers listed him as a survivor – "great fears were entertained here that he was lost." In 100th Aero Squadron, probably only Wayne Co. boy on board. Think some local boys were on accompanying transports as some had been ordered from Camp Funston to NY. Casualty count on Tuscania 304 [incorrect].

"Piedmont (MO) Weekly Banner" 14 Feb 1918 p 1 – Mrs. Leander Hanson [his sister Estella] had been sick from nervousness after hearing her brother Millard was on the Tuscania. "But is better now."

"Ironton (MO) County Register" 14 Feb 1918 p 5 – Millard of Brunot MO is Tuscania survivor. "Young Brooks was well known in this county having taught several terms of school in Iron."

"Greenville (MO) Sun" 14 Feb 1918 p 1 – "The people of Greenville were relieved of a great weight of anxiety and suspense" when he was reported saved. His parents live at Brunot. For several months prior to his enlistment, he lived in Greenville, where he was associated with his brother W.D. [William Donley] Brooks in the garage business.

"Ironton (MO) County Register" 28 Feb 1918 p 5 – glad to hear that cable was received by his parents Sunday morning (24 Feb) that he was safe & well. "He was a popular young school teacher and has a host of friends."

"Greenville Sun" 7 Mar 1918 p 8 – On the Tuscania, arrived & is somewhere in France. Sound & well according to letters received this week by relatives & friends in Greenville.

"Piedmont Weekly Banner" 27 Jun 1918 p 1 – a letter home from Leonard Lucy, of the 93rd Aero Squadron, to his parents Mr. & Mrs. O.C. Lucy noted: "I saw Millard Brooks of Brunot, about three weeks ago. He is O.K. Millard is the only boy I have met since in the Army I know."

"Piedmont (MO) Weekly Banner" 11 Jul 1918 p 5 – letter from London, England, dated 8 Jun 1918 [partially copied above] to Mr. I.L. Brooks of Brunot MO. "Dear Dad" – working in aero repair work section. He takes badly broken machines, replaces damage with new parts. Very interesting work & enjoys working at it. Glad to hear about home efforts to help the poor & other church work. Resisting the many temptations available to soldiers in England, compared to those in France.

"Ironton (MO) County Register" 3 Jul 1919 p 5 – arrived home from overseas last week. Escaped without injury on the Tuscania. Was with aero squadron & spent several months in England.

Post-war:

A few notices of sheriff's sale of real estate for delinquent taxes in Wayne Co. MO against Millard Brooks & 2 others (with the C.H. Jones apparently his father-in-law) – Jul 1930 & Feb 1931

There are numerous articles at Newspapers.com about his teaching assignments. A selection:

"Wayne County Journal-Banner" 26 May 1927 p 8 – Professor & Mrs. Millard Brooks of Brunot visited in Piedmont Saturday. They were on their way home from Hunter, where he

taught last quarter in the Hunter school, after finishing a term as principal of the Brunot school.

"Wayne County Journal-Banner" (Piedmont MO) 20 Jun 1929 p 8 – Professor Millard Brooks of Brunot visited his sister Mrs. L.H. Henson of near Piedmont last week. He taught in the high school of University City last year & finished the sessions last Friday. He is one of the state's outstanding educators.

"Greenville Sun" 3 Sep 1936 p 2 – Millard Brooks & Fred Brooks & their families returned to University City from Bruno. Fred is principal of the University City schools & Millard is a teacher in them.

"Wayne County Journal-Banner" 25 Aug 1938 p 1 – Millard is building 6 more terraces on his farm near Brunot to control erosion. He installed 2 terraces last summer.

"Greenville Sun" 22 Mar 1945 p 1 – the superintendent of Des Arc Public Schools was elected superintendent of Greenville Consolidated District school 1945-1946
