Funeral services for Arthur Perrin Brown, 58, of Roosevelt, L. I., were conducted Tuesday evening, Oct. 14, in Roosevelt, and interment was made Wednesday afternoon in Rose Hill Cemetery, Matawan.

Mr. Brown, the son of Mrs. J. Perrin Brown, of Califon, and the late Mr. Brown, was born in Matawan Township, and attended the Keyport schools. His parents owned a home on Lloyd Rd., in Matawan Township for many years. He died suddenly on Saturday, Oct. 11, 1952, while riding in an automobile with his wife. He was a veteran of World War I and served in the U. S. Navy. Mr. Brown was a survivor of the USS Tuscania, which was sunk by enemy fire.

Surviving besides his mother, are his wife, Hazel; two daughters, Mrs. Dorothy Gamber, of Lebanon, Pa., and Mrs. Katheryn Steiner of Los Angeles, Calif.; a son, Arthur P. Brown Jr., stationed in Korea; seven grandchildren; and three sisters, Mrs. David Walsh and Mrs. Marcus Coon, of Califen, and Mrs. John I. Snyder of New Rochelle, N. Y.

### **Local Boys on Torpedoed Boat.**

Thomas Welsted, a Matawan boy, is reported to have been on the transport Tuscania, which was torpedoed off the Irish coast with over 2,000 American troops on board, mostly from Michigan and Wisconsin. Various reports of the number of lives lost have been received, from 268 to less than 100, and whether Mr. Welsted was among the rescued has not as yet been reported.

Arthur P. Brown of Keyport, son of Perrin Brown formerly of near Oak Grove, is another of the local boys on the torpedoed boat and his fate is as yet unknown.

**Hear from Son.**  
 Mr. and Mrs. Perrine Brown, of Beers street, Keyport, received a cablegram this morning informing them that their son, Arthur P. Brown, of the 213th Aero Squadron, had been saved. He was a private in the aviation service.  
 Young Brown resided with his parents in Keyport on a small farm in Beers street. He was employed, prior to his enlistment, in the office of a broker in New York city. He commuted daily to New York.  
 The young man was well known in the borough, having been prominent in the affairs of the younger set.

Arthur P. Brown of this place was one of the boys on the Tuscania, which was sunk by a German submarine last week. Mr. Brown sent a cablegram to his father, J. Perrin Brown, saying he was safe.

Word has been received by Mrs. S. L. Goodwin, of Madison avenue, from her niece, Mrs. A. T. A cablegram was received telling of Mr. Brown's safe arrival in France.

J. Perrin Brown of Raritan township made his will March 7, 1921, appointing his wife, Arabella Brown, executrix and bequeathing her all of his estate for life with authority to use such of the principal as she may desire. After the death of Mrs. Brown the remainder of the estate is to be equally divided among his children: Mary C., wife of David Walsh; Bertha, wife of Marcus A. Cook; Nellie, wife of John Snyder; Stella, wife of D. Burt Coon; Arthur P. Brown and Marion Brown, in equal shares. In a codicil to the will, executed February 1, 1924, he bequeathed \$100 to his daughter, Bertha, wife of Marcus A. Coon, to be paid to her immediately after Mrs. Brown's death.

## SURVIVOR FROM TORPEDOED SHIP RELATES EVENTS

**Arthur Brown, Keyport,  
Aboard Tuscania When  
Attacked Off Coast Of  
Ireland In 1918**

### RESCUED BY TRAWLER

An interesting letter recalling the experience of a Keyport man in the first World War was unearthed recently in this publication's office files. The letter was written by Arthur P. Brown, son of J. P. Brown, of Keyport, who was aboard the Tuscania when she was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland early in 1918.

Brown, who sailed from New York to Halifax and thence to Ireland, recounts the voyage as being uneventful until Feb. 5. On that day land had been sighted in the afternoon. The Keyport man had retired to his bunk early in the evening and was in the process of writing home when a terrific explosion hurled him to the floor. Brown, who retained his presence of mind, got to his feet, donned overcoat and life-belt and started topside. The ship was listing heavily to starboard and it was with great difficulty that he reached his assigned position and waited for the lifeboats. To add to the tragedy, the lifeboat was

shattered to bits when it struck the water. The lieutenant in charge, then detailed 12 men to go to the top deck in search of another boat. Brown, who was one of the 12 describes the sequence of events thus:

#### Sight Of Confusion

"Such a sight of confusion as met my eyes I never dreamed of. The lifeboats were over-turned and wrecked in every direction from the force of the explosion. A lot were useless. Finally we managed to get a sound boat on the davits and lower her to the water. By that time the ship was pretty low in the water and sinking rapidly.

"As soon as the required men had gotten in, the crew was called. We were on the top deck and so we had to slide down a rope. I landed half in the boat and half in the water but managed to crawl in, took my oar and we pulled away from the ship.

"We had our full number of men, nearly fifty, and then some. It was so crowded that we could hardly row, but we managed somehow. One of the ship's crew, a man we called "Scottie," took command at the helm. He steered a course straight for a lighthouse. We pulled for about 45 minutes, when we sighted a boat that was not moving. It proved to be a destroyer.

We were nearly to her when she sailed away!"

At this added misfortune, many of the men lost courage. Brown continued. Sobs and prayers filled the air. The course toward the lighthouse, which was about 15 miles away, was resumed. Finally, when all hope of a rescue had been given up, a small trawler came into view. She was one of the many used in sweeping mines, hunting submarines and picking up survivors. The remainder of the passengers of the ill-fated Tuscania were taken aboard and landed at the small port of Larne, in Ireland, at 6 o'clock the next morning.

At Larne the survivors were warmly greeted and medical attention as well as beds and food, provided.

In recounting this concluding event of his adventure, Mr. Brown wrote:

"They gave us soup, cheese, bread and butter and jam, and last, but best of all, hot tea. TEA, in capital letters, the best I ever tasted. Then we were put to bed—in real beds. The people were wonderful, and treated us like lords—couldn't do enough for us. We stayed there three days."

fingertip tulle veil fell from a crown of orange blossoms. She carried white roses.

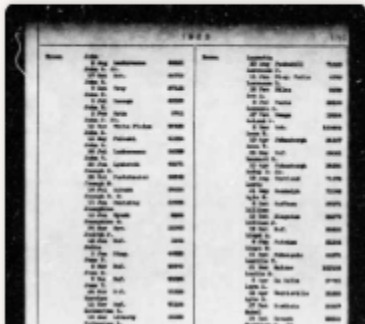

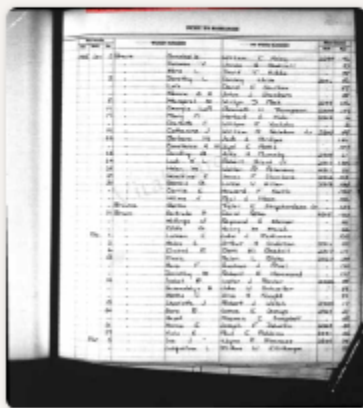

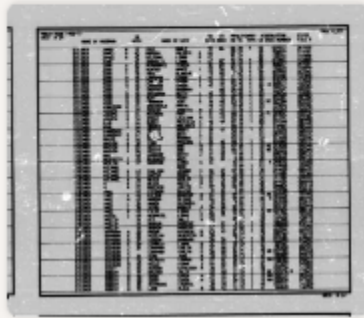

## **Dorothy Brown Gamber**

CANAL FULTON, OH

Dorothy Brown Gamber, 83, died on Friday, June 12, 2009, at the Chapel Hill Community in Canal Fulton, Ohio, where she had been a resident for four years. She attended Philadelphia Bible College where she met and married her husband, the Rev. Robert W. Gamber.

A gentle soul, she dedicated her life to her family and her church, serving as a valued partner in her husband's several pastoral charges in Pennsylvania and Ohio. The Gambers served at Faith United Church of Christ in York from 1964 to 1970. She was the administrative assistant to Joseph J. Kelley, Jr. who served as Director of the Pennsylvania Chamber of Commerce and as Pennsylvania Secretary of the Commonwealth. She was honored with the Governor's Award for Excellence for her efforts in revising and streamlining Pennsylvania's primary election procedures.

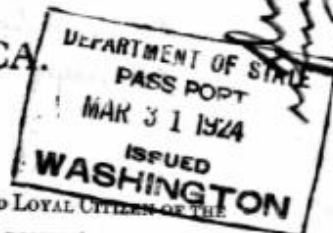

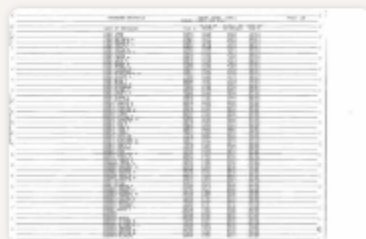

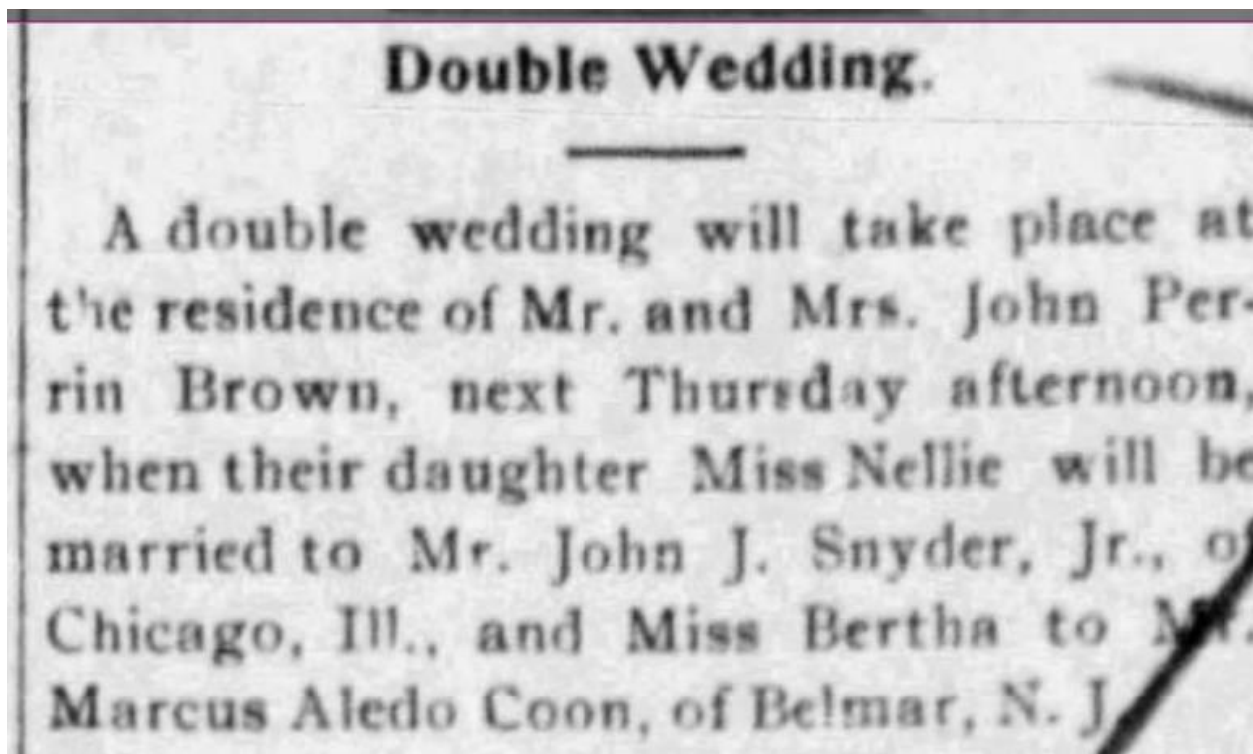

### Unlucky Was Friday for Several Members of Oldwick Family

Whitehouse. — Friday was an unlucky day for the family of Marcus A. Coon, who operates a stone crushing plant near Oldwick. His son Petrin, seventeen years old, has a young hunting dog and he went out with the intention of discharging a .32-caliber revolver to see if the dog was "gun shy." He was transferring the weapon from one hand to the other when it went

off, the bullet going through the right hand at the base of the index finger. He was taken to the office of Dr. F. A. Apgar, at Oldwick.

When Perrin reached the doctor's office he found there his brother Burton, ten years old. 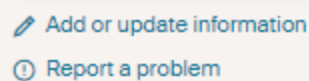

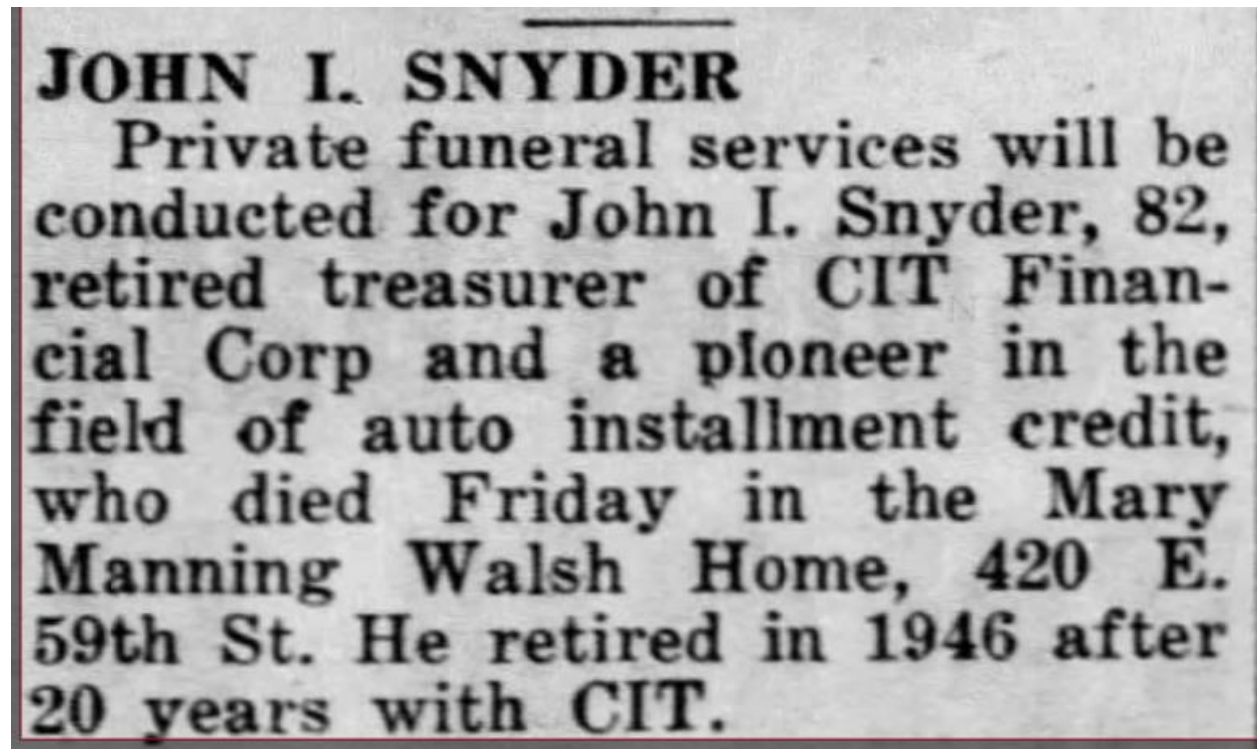
