Both the Brown brothern wounded while in action on the Mitton was shot tern front right shoulder by a machine gun butlet the first day he went into battle nt Chateau-Thierry on July 18, 1918, the date of the disastrons drive. Fletcher Brown Was shot the muscle of the right leg on September 17 at St. Mildel and witho not entirely recovered from the wound, he enlisted in a motor truck commany at Camp Upton, New York, within a half hour after he received his honorable discharge from the service, He expects to return to the army on May 10.

Milton Brown trained at Camp Ten vis and was among the first to leav that camp for Europe, salling Januar, 22 on the Tuscania The ship was for pedoed near the frish coast, Brown was just going for his suppor when the forpedo stratck and the order was given to take to the houts He, will other soldiers, was fortunate enough to get in a skill in which he drifted about all that might and the following day when the skiff landed at Londonderry, Irrhand Altho exposed to the weather, he did not suffer any serious

Remaining in the logidial for three menths, he was then sent to the Argonne from where he faught for only two days before below gassed. DENTON, March 10. — Milton Brown was seriously burned at Pilot Point, Denton County, when the clothing on his arms became soaked with gasoline while he was repairing the engine of his automobile, and was ignited when he struck a match. The flesh on the arms was badly burned. He was taken to a Dallas sanitarium for treatment. Physicians said amputation of both arms might be necessary.







RITES MONDAY FOR FLETCHER BROWN

Funeral services for Fletcher Newton Brown, age 57, were conducted by Rev. O. L. Fontaine, Pastor, in the Methodist Church of Britton Monday at 3 p. m.

Mr. Brown was born in Barstrop County, Texas, being one of a family of ten children. His parents died when he was quite young, and his early youth was passed in various parts of Texas. He served his country in the army for eleven years, seeing action in France during World War I, where he was gassed and wounded.

Fletcher was well known and liked in this community in which he located when he came to Oklahoma in 1931. He is survived by one brother, G. L. Brown of Kansas City, Mo., who came back to Britton for the services.

Interment was in the Britton Cemetery, with Britton Funera Home in charge of the arrangements.
