

In addition to the Pittsburghers known to have been aboard the illfated Tuscania when that liner was torpedoed by a Hun U-boat Tuesday, three more names were learned today.

Charles Lee Thompson and Marvin W. Alcock, former employes of the Westinghouse interests here, were aboard the transport. Both are members of the Twentieth Engineers and well-known throughout this section. Thompson is a graduate of Endeavor High School and later studied engineering in Cornell University. He was a member of the University Band and after leaving school returned here to engage in the lumber business. He enlisted in the forestry service. For two years Thompson was a member of the Tionesta baseball team.

Roy K. Brown, son of Mr. and Mrs. S. K. Brown, entered training in December at Columbus, later being sent to Washington, where he finished his military studies in the American University.

TUSCANIA SURVIVOR WRITES LETTER HOME

Duquesne Boy Calls Torpedoing of Ship a "Little Mishap"

Private Roy K. Brown of Duquesne, a member of the Twentieth regiment engineers, American expeditionary forces, who was a passenger on the ill-fated liner Tuscania, sunk off the th Irish coast Feb. 5 by a German torpedo, has written his parents, Mr. and Mrs. S. K. Brown, that he is to among the survivors. The letter, 1. written in England and dated Feb. 13, relates his experiences since leaving American soil. The letter in part follows:

Just a few lines to let you know that I arrived safely, but not until after a little mishap. We left our

camp in America Tuesday evening, Jan. 22, and set sail from New York on Thursday morning, Jan. 24. On the afternoon of the thirteenth day out—Feb. 5-at 5:45, a torpedo struck the starboard side of our ves-rel and there was some excitement. struck the starboard side of our ves-sel and there was some excitement for a time. However, we soon got on deck and the fellows cooled down a bit. That was when I felt most afraid, for we had a number of other transports along with us and as soon as we were struck they left us, for fear of being torpedoed in the same manner. manner.

Well, I thought sure we were left to look out for ourselves, but that was not the case. We could see land was not the case. We could see land on both sides—Ireland and Scotland—so we were not so bad off as we might have been. A good many of the men got away in life boats, but a number of the boats were overturned in the rough sea and these accidents were responsible for some of the loss of life. A hundred or more of our company, myself included, remained with the ship and were there for two hours. Then two submarine chasers pulled up alongside the illfor two hours. Then two submarine chasers pulled up alongside the illfated boat and quite a number of us got away in them, I among the others.

They took us to a small town in the northern part of Ireland, a landing being effected at 3 the next morning. The soldiers there had received word of the attack and had hot soup and tea ready when we arrived. This simple repast sure was release. welcome.

Most of the fellows lost everything they had, so when the Y. M. C. A. heard we were "broke" they put up sign at the canteen center reading. "Americans only: If you have no money don't be afraid to speak up, for we won't see you 'broke." We left that point on Sunday morn-

we left that point on Sunday morn-ing, Feb. 10, and continued our jour-ney to England. We had four more hours' dangerous traveling by boat, but we got across without incident and were mighty glad of it. Arriving near an American rest camp the next morning at 4:30 we were met at the morning at 4:30 we were met at the sistion by trucks and, after a half hour's ride landed safely in the camp. half

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HEARING TODAY FOR TRIO ACCUSED OF AUTO THEFTS

Suspicious of several youths who had inquired about road directions late yesterday afternoon, a West Shore resident notified the Harrisburg police and the arrest of three 19-year-old boys here, shortly afterward, cleared up the mystery of the thefts of two automobiles, one of them stolen in this city, and the other in Duquesne, a suburb of Pittsburgh.

The arrests were made at the eastern end of the Walnut street bridge, where Patrolman Keyes had been stationed to be on the lookout for

The youths gave their names as James McDonald and James V. Cavanaugh, of Braddock, and Anthony Chiodo, of Pittsburgh. They were scheduled for a hearing in police court late this afternoon.

* According to the police, the three were implicated in the theft of an automobile owned by Roy K. Brown, 12 Hamilton street, Duquesne, on Thursday. They are said to have experienced trouble with the brakes on the Brown machine, and to have abandoned the car in Lemoyne, after stripping the tires from the car and selling them for \$5.


