

Washington, Feb. 8.—Seventeen men from Virginia were passengers on the transport Tuscania, which was sunk by a German submarine. Up to an early hour this morning the names of only twenty of the survivors had been received by the war departmen out of about two thousand who have been rescued. The names of none of the Virginians appears among the first twenty survivors. The Virginians on the ill-fated transport were:

Hames of Nine Additional Survivors Given Out by the War Department.

(By George H Manning)

Washington, Feb. 9 .- A partial list received by the war department today of the survivors of the disaster which befell the transport Tuscania, carrying American troops to France, which was torpedoed in British waters several days ago gives the names of n he Virginians from among the 17 whose. names were mentioned in these dispatches on Friday morning as being aboard the vessel.

The nine survivors, whose names are given, are:

Charles E. Delp. Mouth of Wilson; Frank H. Carroll, Norfolk: Harvey P. Holland, Buena Vista; William D. Hammer, Knoll; John W. Holland. Wilmingto .. William S Miller, Ur-bana, and Howe D Willis, Rapidan.

made, are:

BURIED IN SCOTLAND

Three Virginians Among Soldiers Lost From Tuscania.

The following are the Virginians reported as being lost from the Tuscania and buried on the Scottish coast:

Walter L. Brown, Pera, Amherst county.

Gerald K. Clover, Hopewell. Winston A. Hartsook, Rapidan.

Of the 164 American dead buried in Scotland it was not possible to identify 33. They had nothing on them by which to determine who they were. Of the names of the 131 soldiers sent from Scotland, only 122 have been definitely located on list of men whose names appeared on the passenger list, but who have not been reported as survivors.

VICTIM OF TUSCANIA NEPHEW OF MRS. SPILLAN

Walter Brown, who was with the 20th engineer corps, 6th battalion, U. S. army, and a passenger on the Tuscania, is reported among those lost.

Mr. Brown was a nephew of Mrs. W. Spillan, of this city. He was a native of Amherst county and a son of Mrs. Spillan's sister.

Since the sinking of the Tuscania, Mrs. Spillan has been anxiously watching the papers, hoping he might be among the rescued.

While the family is greatly distressed to learn of his death, they are thankful that his body was recovered and accorded a military burial in the little Scotch village.



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
