Loyde F. Brunk

Longtime Vader resident Loyde F. Brunk, 96, died Nov. 11, 1992, in a Centralia nursing home. He was born March 17, 1896, in Dorchester, Neb.

He had been a resident of Vader since 1907, coming from Nebraska. He served with the Army engineers during World War I and was a life member of the Toledo Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Mr. Brunk worked for Long-Bell Lumber Co., retiring as a logger in 1957. He was a volunteer firefighter in Vader for many years.

On Dec. 28, 1921, he married Cecelia Connely in Vader. She died July 1, 1987. He was also preceded in death by his son, Leslie, Nov. 19, 1981.

Mr. Brunk is survived by a niece, Twila Bailey of Chehalis.

A military graveside service will be held at 1 p.m. Monday at Little Falls Cemetery in Vader. The Rev. Murray Hyde and the Toledo VFW will officiate.

Arrangements are by Cattermole Funeral Home in Winlock.



CENTRALIA, Wash., July 27.-(Special.)-Mrs. W. E. Brown, of Vader, is in receipt of a letter from her son, Willie, who was in the battle of Belleu wood with the marines. The young fighter says he came through with a whole skin. It was reported he had been wounded.

Loyde Brunk, of Vader, 20th Engineers, is working in a sawmill at Castetes, France, which, he writes to his mother, is operating night and day. The logs are hauled about two miles by wagon.

The soldier tells of a recent ball game between the Sixth and Eighth Battalions of the 20th Engineers, the Eighth winning by a score of 2 to 2.





Brief mention was made in our C last issue of the death of Henry Brunk at his home at Toledo, Washington, the particulars of which had not then been received.

On the morning of September 9, fir. Brank arose early with the intention of going on a short journey, and while in the act of dressing, he fell backward on the bed, helpless and speechless, from an attack of paralysis. He lingered until the following Wednesday morning, the 14th, when he passed away. The remains were brought to Dcrchester by his sons John and Fred, and buried in the Gilbert cemetery on Monday of last week.

Mr. Brunk was born in Albany county, New York, 67 years ago. For many years he lived near Dorchester and had a wide acquaintance in this county. About eighteen months ago he went Washington, where he invested in land and engaged in the mercantile business with his son-in law, former county treasurer J. H. Douge. He was thrice married, first to Miss Elizabeth Heeran, by which union he had seven t children, four of whom are now living, John and Fred Brunk, Mrs. Nellie Douge and Mrs. Della Wintermute. After the death of his first wife he married her sister, who also died some time before he left Nebraska. Shortly after arriving in Washington, he married Miss Emma Stewart, who survives him. Mr. Brunk had many friends and acquaintances here by whom his unexpected death is deeply regretted.
