



His next-of-kin was Mrs. Violet Brunslik of the same address; their relationship was left blank. - Edward had married Violet Verenda Hills on 12 Nov 1935 in Barron Co. WI. They divorced 15 Jun 1940 in WI, but she is living with him in 1942 and is listed as his wife in the 1950 census for Greenfield, Milwaukee WI. In that census, Edward Brunslik, 42 WI, plainer hand, machine manufacturer, lived at 10211 W. Greenfield Ave. with "wife" Violet (35 WI). – Violet Hills was born 20 Jul 1914 in Webster, Burnett WI & died 25 Mar 1992 in Dakota Co. MN. She was the daughter of Forest Hills & Hattie Gunn. Violet married Chester Leroy Vessels (1932-1999, F: 88444591) on 13 Sep 1972 in Grant Co. SD. She is buried as Violet Vessels in Pleasant View Memorial Gardens,

Burnsville, Dakota MN, F: 88444583. – Edward married <u>Geraldine (Jeraldine) Etta Bennett Erwin</u>. Geraldine Bennett was the daughter of Jesse Korbert Bennett & Mary Etta Noble, b. 29 Jun 1906 Perry, Dallas IA – d. 30 Jan 1988 Muncie, Delaware Co. IN, buried with her first husband, with the surname Erwin, F: 107986912 in the same cemetery as Edward Brunslik. – On 20 Aug 1925 in Lehigh, Webster IA, Geraldine Bennett had married Leslie Orland Erwin (1903-1952, F: 107986866). When her son Marvin C. Erwin married on 3 Jun 1961 to Judy Ann Cox in Richmond IN, she is listed as Mrs. Edward Brunslik of Hoquiaim WA. – Edward's cause of death was "drowning – cerebral concussion frontal contusion – abrasion" when he "apparently fell while fishing in the ocean, struck head and drowned" in the Pacific Ocean off Westport WA. His WA death certificate indicates he was cremated at Fern Hill in Aberdeen WA. - Buried in Union City Cemetery, Union City, Randolph IN. F: 107986962
