

He was a World War I veteran in the Army and a retired postal clerk. He was a member of the Princeton Legion Post and the Green Lake-Ripon Masonic Lodge.







MRS. WILLIAM BUCHHOLZ PASSES AWAY AT AGE 77

Mrs. William Buchholz, 77, a resident of Oshkosh since 1924, passed away at her home, 471 Wisconsin avenue, Tuesday afternoon at 12:35 o'clock after a short illness.




