One killed, five hurt bin five area wrecks

ESCONDIDO — A 23-year-old Rosamond man was killed and five other persons hurt in five North County traffic accidents Wednesday.

Killed was Jerome Louis Ortega, a barber at Edwards Air Force Base. Injured were Mrs. Margaret Rudolph, 34, of 836 Birch St.; Ronald Amago, 35, of 240 W. 10th Ave.; Verna M. Buckmaster, 65, of Route 2, Box 2115; James Condon, 21, of San Diego, and Bernard R. Schroeder, 37, of Riverside. All five suffered minor injuries.

Two Injured

Mrs. Rudolph and Schroeder were hurt in the accident in which Ortega was killed at 12:45 p.m. on Highway 395 on the San Luis Rey River bridge 15 miles north of Escondido.

A California Highway Patrol report said Ortega was south-bound attempting to pass another car when he collided head-on with the pickup truck driven by Schroeder. The truck was knocked into the opposite

lane where it collided with the car driven by Mrs. Rudolph. Ortega was ejected from his car on impact. A dog in Ortega's car also was ejected and killed.

Patrolman Dal Clary said a Ramona man had witnessed Ortega driving erratically. Clary said the witness, Fred Renfroe, had stopped at Bible Land north of Fallbrook to telephone the CHP because Ortega's driving had been forcing cars going both directions off the road. He said Bible Land had no telephone and a man at the next place at which he stopped refused to let him use the telephone even when he offered to pay. Clary said if Renfroe had been able to use the telephone, the accident may not have happened.

Lost Control

Mrs. Buckmaster sustained minor cuts and bruises when she fell out of a car at 9:30 p.m. No other information was available at noon.

Amago was hurt when he lost

control of his car on Valley Boulevard near Bear Valley Road at 8:10 p.m. Highway Patrolman Ralph Sipes said Amago was driving too fast for the road. The car left the road and slammed into a telephone pole. Amago was westbound.

Condon was hurt when his car collided with a car driven by Jessie Willie Jr., 21, of Pico Rivera. A CHP report said Condon was northbound on 395 at 8:45 p.m. when Willie drive his eastbound car from a stop sign on Highway 78 into the path of Condon's car.

She was born in Barron, Wis., and had lived in Escondido since 1958. She was a member of Emmanuel Faith Community Church.


She is survived by daughters Joan Vinje of Escondido, Patty Felphberg of Bakersfield and Lor-

He was raised to be very independent, as his father died when he was young.

Erick married his high school sweetheart, Verna Patricia Buckmaster, and worked very hard to create a life for them and their children during their 61 years together.

Erick enlisted in the United States Air Corps in 1946, served three years teaching math, and used the GI Bill to obtain two bachelor's degrees, one in civil engineering and the other in geology. These degrees enabled him to find employment with Shell Oil Company where he rose through the ranks during 33 years of service to finish as a senior staff reservoir engineer. Erick helped develop the method for steam injection extraction in the Bellridge Field in California which was used to help extract the heavy crude oil found there. His ideas saved money and time in many other difficult drilling areas such as the Athabasca Tar Sands Oil Shale Fields in Canada.

Upon retirement in Bakersfield, Erick devoted many hours to family genealogy and gardening.

Erick Fehlberg is survived by his wife, Patty; four children, 10 grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. His children include Steve Fehlberg, Laurie Fehlberg, April Mitchell, and K.T. Irwin. 


