




Rites Set for Ralph Wescott

Prominent Shawano Figure Died Tuesday After Active Lifetime

Special to Press-Gazette
SHAWANO, Wis. — Funeral
services for Ralph R. Wescott, 57,
member of a prominent pioneer
Shawano family and a resident of
the city for many years, will be
held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon
in the chapel at Woodlawn cemetery. Mrs. Wescott died suddenly
in the Shawano Municipal hospital at 7 o'clock Tuesday evaning.
The Rev. Donald Keuper will officiate at the services.

Known as "Chi," Mr. Wescott was born May 23, 1894, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Dayne Wescott. He was a retired army officer, holding the rank of major, and had served as a police captain and lawyer. He had been ill for several years and hospitalized the past three weeks.

The family had been making its home on the north beach of Shawano lake since returning to Shawano at the close of World War II.

Grandson of Settler

Mr. Wescott also was the grandson of Charles Wescott, who in 1843 became the first white settler in Shawano.

He had a varied and colorful career. He enlisted in the army shortly after the United States entered World War I in 1917, joining Shawano's famed Company F. Before embarking to France, however, Ralph and three other members were transferred to a 32nd division truck company and were aboard the ill fated troop transport Tuscania, sunk by German torpedoes off the coast of Ireland in 1918.

At the close of the first war, a Wescott applied for and won a Scommission in the reserve officers v corps and was made a major in the quartermaster corps at the outbreak of World War II.

Was District Attorney

After the first war, Wescott had a served for several years as a police captain on the West Allis police force at State Fair park while studying law nights at Marquette university.

He returned to Shawano in 1920 y to take over management of his father's insurance agency and to establish his law practice. He also finished out his father's term as city clerk and was elected district attorney of Shawano county in a 1932.

He served one term as Chef de Gare (commander) of the 40 et 8 and was a member of the local American Legion post. He also twas highly active in civic and community affairs, a member of the Presbyterian church, past master of the Shawano lodge, F. and AM, and a member of the chapter of Royal Arch Masons, serving as high priest of the group to one year.

Surviving are Mrs. Wescott, the eformer Theresa Featherston, who married Mr. Wescot in 1920; one pson, Dayne, now with the army at Ft. Riley, Kas.; a brother, Ward, Crandon; and four grandchildren. A daughter, Mrs. Sheldon Schmidt pdied in 1948.

Sunday Drive Bang-Up Job For Man and His '60 Auto

STURGEON BAY (PG)— A Milwaukee man and his 1960 automobile had a bang-up time in Door County Sunday afternoon.

Paul H. Buettner, 63, was involved in two accidents in about two hours. The mishaps occurred about 17 miles from each other and the second sent the driver to Algoma Hospital with head cuts.

Buettner's car forced one driven by Mrs. Rojah Notz, 25, Sturgeon Bay, Rt. 1, off Highway 42-57 about a quarter mile from the city limits at 1:45. The woman's car went onto the shoulder of the road where it was hit by Buettner's car. Left sides of both cars were damaged. Buettner was traveling south and Mrs. Notz north. The Milwaukeean posted a \$16

bond on a charge of operating his vehicle on the left side of the road.

At 3:48, Buettner went 480 feet on the edge of the road when attempting to round Fairland Curve near Brussels. He stopped when hitting a car parked near the Sinclair Service Station. The parked car. owned by Anthony J. Dier, 18, Brussels, was listed as a complete wreck and the right side of the Buettner car was damaged. Buettner was taken to the hospital by Door County police ambulance.

Buettner said he was blinded by the sun before going off the curve.
