Lieutenant Buhmann's family here had no period of worryment about whether he was safe or not, because they didn't know he had sailed for Europe until the telegraphed message came to his wife that Lieut. W. C. Buhmann had landed safely. There was no indication in the telegram of where it came from.

The officer is a member of company F, the 6th battalion, 20th engineers. He was commissioned recently for duty in a special branch of foreign service, in a forestry regiment. His wife and three children and other relatives reside here.

ALL TAR HEELS ON TUSCANIA ARE SAFE

Seven North Carolinians on
Illfated Transport Num-
bered Among Survivors

Washington, D. C., Feb. 11.—An additional list of survivors of the Tuscania received by the War Department Sunday gives the names of three more North Carolinians who were rescued, these three men added to the four reported in these dispatchs of Sunday morning as being among the survivors, shows that all the North Carolina men on the Tuscania, torpedoed last week by the German U-boat, are safe. The three survivors reported Sunday are Milton Pittman, 210 North Ninth street, Wilmington; William C. Buhmann, Greensboro, and Macy Evans, R. F. D. No. 2, Stem. The four reported previously safe are Loomis M. Hales, Clayton; James W. Logan, Uree; Wesley Shell, Sugar Grove, and James Bigger, New Bern.

The names of about 800 survivors appeared in the list received by the War Department Sunday, which in addition to the 1,160 received on Saturday, includes almost all the Americans who escaped death on the Tuscania.

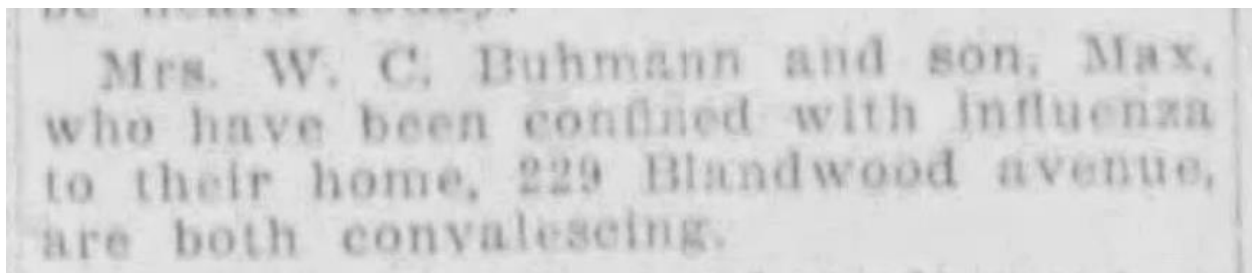

Bodhisattva, Arm Removed, Smiles Thanks

The Portland Art museum's Kuan Yin bodhisattva has a contented look these days.

The sacred carved wooden figure, one of the museum's masterpieces, has undergone an amputation. She lost her right arm a few nights ago. And Thursday, as the museum prepared for opening of the new Chinese gallery the next day, it seemed as though she winked at Tom Colt, the director, and Max Buhmann, registrar.

THE BODHISATTVA had worried Colt ever since he took over the job last fall. So the other night he and Buhmann sat down and studied the goddess in silence for 45 minutes. Then they went to work tapping with their art hammers. Before their night's work was done the right arm and drapery, a poor restoration of wood, clay and papier-mache, had gone to the trash pile.

"She is beautiful now," Colt declared. And the bodhisattva seemed to smile her thanks. The one-armed goddess is the Art museum's "Venus."

A STUDY of old records revealed that another expert some years ago suggested a new hand for the right arm which, the expert guessed rightly, "probably has been restored."

"That arm was a poorly done bit of restoration," Colt said. He figured it might have been done before the goddess was brought to this country. The arm had been hammered to the fine statue with two large nails. Drapery of papier-mache covered the job.

How many years the original right arm has been missing is unknown. The Sung dynasty bodhisattva is between 670 and 989 years old. It has been on loan to a San Francisco museum and was purchased out of the Ella Hirsch fund as a 1938 depression bargain.

Everything is genuine in the new Chinese gallery, including some beautiful jade, lacquer and ceramics taken from basement storage.

Doors of the Portland Art museum's newest gallery opened in the upstairs south Ayer wing during the weekend for the permanent exhibit of the museum's own remarkable ancient civilizations collection.

Two months of preparation went into the event. The greys of walls and blue of the cabinets are distinctive and set the stage for the rare beauty to be viewed there.

ON EXHIBIT are 182 pieces of ceramics and glass, 45 bronzes, 1300 scarabs and 7 sculptures. The Egyptian scarabs date from 2900 to 500 B. C.

The other works are mostly Greek with some Italic, Italiote and Roman and date from the 7th century B. C. to the 4th century A. D. Most are from the Sally Lewis collection.

INCLUDED in ceramics and glass are funeral urns, perfume flasks, athletes' oil vases which they attached to their wrists, drinking cups, wine urns, cosmetic boxes and plates. Among bronzes one finds jewelry, spearheads, pots and pitchers.

This exhibition has been the pet of Max Buhmann, registrar, who has filled four volumes of records on it. Working with him is Betsy Jones.

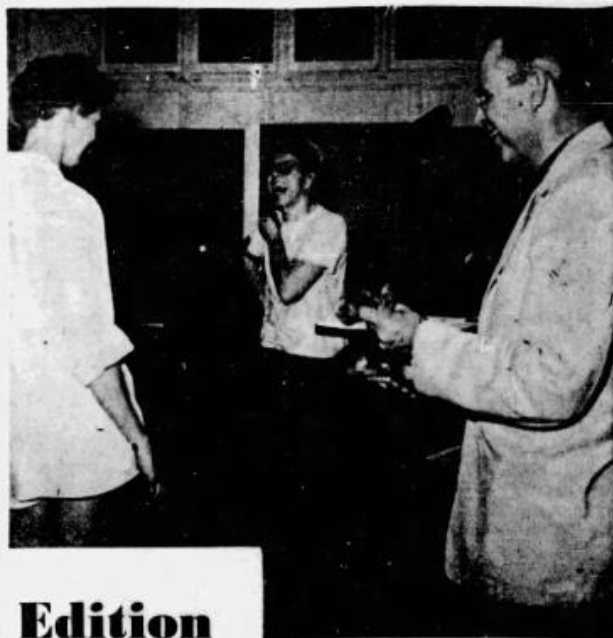

"A DAY With the Cow Column in 1943" has meant many a late night with pica rule and proof in 1952 for an enthusiastic group at Reed college. Jesse Applegate's eye-witness history of the early days of the Pacific Northwest is the first publication of a new, non-profit organization known as the Champoeg Press. Publication date is October 1.

The book by Plains-Crosser Applegate will be only about 20 pages long, and the edition will number only 225 copies. But behind its publication is all the work of putting together the equipment and the persons of a new and specialized printing organization.

It is not exclusively a Reed college project. It includes persons who work in the printing industry. Members of the staff are professionally active in the various arts of typography, calligraphy, book design, press work composing book binding—and in the fields of Northwest history, graphic arts, art history and literature.

Although the members of the staff are specialists, all expect to learn something of the variety of skills of the publishing art. It is more than likely that all will put their hands to most of the operations that go into the creation of a piece of good printing. They'll all get smeared with printer's ink.

Officers of the Champoeg Press corporation include Lloyd J. Reynolds, professor of art at Reed college, president; Dr. Dorothy Johansen, associate professor of history at Reed, editor; Rudolf Ernst, superintendent of book binding at the Metropolitan Press, secretary, and Dick Abel, business manager of Reed's student union, treasurer.

'Humanities' Topic Of Reed Exhibition

Large and handsomely executed reproductions of French paintings in the Enlightenment as seen from the point of view of a student of the humanities open the exhibition season Monday in Reed college faculty lounge.

Color reproductions of works by Watteau, Boucher, Fragonard, Chardin, Greuze and David are "shown in their relationship to the dominant ideas that caused the changes seen in the cultural attitudes of the 18th century," explained Max W. Buhmann, Portland artist, who conceived and arranged the exhibition for the college.

The exhibition is, in fact, an outgrowth of Buhmann's studies of humanities at Reed and is based on his thesis "Art and Humanity," the title given this exhibition.

IN ANNOUNCING opening of the exhibition season, Lloyd Reynolds, Reed professor of art, pointed to significance of the college presenting an exhibition which ties in with the education program and which will be used by students of the humanities this season.

In addition to the large color reproductions, six panels, prepared by Buhmann, will be displayed. Each,



with its smaller reproductions, brief biographies and "capsule" comments, serves as an introduction to the larger works. In explaining the purpose of such an exhibition, Buh-

Max Buhmann said: "The new concept of freedom which suffused the thinking of the 18th century played a major part in determining character of art of the period. That century saw the crystallization of the rational point of view in which man was held to be an important and integral part of the universe. The ideals of the age reached towards a realism in terms of human values and the contemporary world took on a new significance. Nature was

seen in a more intimate view, one which opened up vistas that gave promise of a fuller and more rewarding life for mankind."

REYNOLDS said the exhibition will continue through November and will be open to the public except when the lounge is used for other purposes. Open hours are 10 a. m. to 5 p. m. week days; also 7:30 to 9:30 p. m. Thursdays, and 2 to 5 p. m. Sundays.

Buhmann, a Reed graduate who studied at New York's Art Students league and the Museum Art school here, has exhibited in Portland Art museum's annual "Artists of Oregon" drawing and art school exhibitions this year.

Max William Buhmann, a Southwest Portland resident, died Saturday in a Portland nursing home. He was 80.

In 1951, he married Louise Aaron, who then was art editor of the Oregon Journal. She died in 1963.

Active in the professional art life of Portland, Mr. Buhmann mainly was a metal sculptor, but later became very interested in painting, particularly watercolors. He had exhibits at the Portland Art Museum and at Reed College.

A veteran of World War II, he served in the U.S. Army.

The only survivor is a brother, Harrison of Marathon, Fla.

F, 6th Battalion, 20th Engineers. He was commissioned recently for duty. His wife & 3 children & relatives are "here" (presumably Greensboro). His father & family lived in Siler City for some years, having moved there from SC in 1894. W.C. was in the sawmill business in WV.
