

Pairmont Lad has Thrilling Experionce when Ship Sinks

Ambrose Bullock, son of Mr. W. B. Bullock of Fairmont, N. C., was on the Tuscania when she was torpedoed near Ireland three weeks ago. The young man was reported among the missing and his parents had given him up for dead when they received a letter from him telling them of his thrilling adventure. The letter is taken from the Lumberton Robesonian:

SINKING OF THE TUSCANIA.

Son of Mr. W. B. Bullock of Fairmont Tells of His Experience on Transport Torpedoed By U-Boat.

The following letter was written to Mr. W. B. Bullock of Fairmont by his son, who was on the transport Tuscania, which was sunk early last month off the coast of Ireland by a German U-boat, more than 100 U.S. soldiers losing their lives: "Lorne, Ireland,

Feb. 7, 1918.

"Dear Father: "I am as well and safe as could be expected after what I went through with. I guess you have heard by this time of the perilous voyage of the S. S. Tuscania, which carried the U. S. troops. I was with them, but am saf: once more, thank God. I am enjoying myself fairly well, and am going to make the best of it all and take myself through safely so don't worry as for me

We were on water eleven days when the tide of the Irish sea, English channel and the Atlantic met, which makes a very rough sea, and a deep one. . I was waiting with a pal of mine for supper down on lower deck, when we heard a loud cannon-like sound, the report of a torpedo from a German submarine, which did the work. Immediately after she was hit the electric lights went out, and left us in pitch darkness. Then there was scrambling among 2,500 troops to get up on decks, where the life boats were. The fellows seemed to be very cool, so there was no panic. But in the meantime the big boat was listing to one side and sinking. The ropes for lowering the boats were no good and the crew must have been excited, for several life boats loaded with men were dumped over and dropped into the water. I saw lots of boys drowning, some of my own squadron, for all that were assigned to my squadron but one were smashed to pieces.

"I'll tell a man it was awful. At first I thought I had rather stick to the ship for awhile, but she began to sink very fast, and quite a bunch of fellows was still on board. The crew had gone and all the boats were gone, so it seemed that I was out of luck and I was about to give up, when I rushed to one side and spied one life boat filled full of men who had some difficulty in leaving the ship, so here was my last chance for my life, so I grabbed a rope and slid down to it.

Gee, but I was relieved!

"I saved one lad's life by telling to leave go of a rope and try to swim to our boat, the last one then threw him an oar and pulled him in. Then we had to get away from the ship very quick, leaving lots of boys begging for help, for the ship was pretty near down. We drifted around in the rough waves until half past eleven, when we were picked up by a patrol ship, which had received the wireless. At that time the sea was getting rough and the breakers were dashing high. When that vessel ran up along side of our little frail craft, it was the gladest moment of my life. The big husky British sailors pulled us aboard, and then the ship headed for some Irish port, where we landed about 6 o'clock the following morning and received the greatest welcome of our lives by the good Irish people. We were put up in the best hotels of the little city, and it seemed that the people couldn't do enough for us. "I don't know where we go from

here. Out of my squadron of 154 men I missed some there are 42 here. good friends. One of them was my diamend ring, but I should worry for that.

"Well, that is about all my story. Some experience, I tell you.

"With love for all, "Your son," "Private Ambrose V. Bullock, "158 Aero Service Squadron, "American Expeditionary Forces, "via New York."

After being mourned as dead by his relatives at home, a cablegram has been received by his father from Mr. Duncan Bullock, of Fairmont, who was aboard the Tuscania, when it was sunk by a German submarine, that he had been landed safely in Ireland. The war department had sent notice to his relatives that he was among the missing and they had given up all hopes for his recovery.

In his message to his parents, the Fairmont young man stated that he floated on the high seas for two days and nights before he was picked up. His life preserver proved to be true to its name, for he had never learned to swim.

CAR DISTRIBUTORS FOLLOW STOCKELL







FAIRMONT — William B Bullock, 93. retired farmer who had spent his whole life in the Fairmont area, died at his home in Fairmont yesterday afternoon. He had been in declining health for three years. He was the oldest man living in Fairmont and was the resident of this section, he was the last of the children of the late Mike Bullock and Caroline Byrd Bullock of Robeson county. He was a member of the Fairmont First Baptist church.

She was the daughter of John T. McKenzie (Find A Grave 15853787) and Sarah Ann Hasty. Her death was announced in the "Weekly State Chronicle" (Raleigh NC) of Thursday, 28 July 1887, page 1. She died 10 months after their marriage.

On 28 March 1889 in Robeson County, North Carolina. William married Martha Davis (1873-1914). Their 13 children were: Archie Clarence, Joseph Thurman, Albert Roland, Ambrose Vernon, John Bunyan, Mattie Belle, Arva Lucille, Clifford William, Fannie Lee, twins Ralph and Ray Howard, George William and Martha.

On 10 March 1915, William married Bessie McMillan (1880-1977). In May 1916, Bessie sued William for alimony and legal fees. A divorce was granted in Nov 1919. In the 1920 census, William reported he was divorced. Bessie was the daughter of Rev. Dougal Cobb McMillan and Annie Penelope Floyd. Their daughter Elizabeth Bullock was born 15 Aug 1916 in Fairmont Robeson NC. She married Andrew Jackson (Jack) Felton (1916-1980), F:

114671957) and died 2 Nov 2008 in Louisburg NC. She is buried in Eure Christian Church Center, Eure, Gates NC.

On 19 February 1922 in Dillon SC, according to "The Robesonian" (Lumberton NC) of Thursday, 23 February 1922, page 8, William married "Miss Harden," the daughter of Dave Harden of Bloomingdale, This was Navonia Hardin (1886-1925), the daughter of David R. Hardin and Hattie/Hettie Edwards.

Navonia died 28 January 1925, and by September 1925, the Lumberton NC newspaper reported on the activities of Mr. and Mrs. W.B. Bullock. William had married Theatus Viola Harrelson Joyner, whose first husband was Isaac Benjamin Joyner (1880-1958). Viola, as she was known, was the daughter of Jesse James Evander Harrelson and Nancy Jane Jordan. When she died on 3 April 1935 in Robeson County, North Carolina, her obituary in "The Robesonian" (Lumberton NC0 of Monday, 8 April 1935, page 3, noted that she had been William Bullock's fifth wife.
