LONG BEACH, Wash. (AP) A 6-year-old boy tossed a lighted firecracker into a five-gallon can of kerosene late Sunday. The resulting explosion resulted in his death a few hours later.

The boy was Rodney Boswell, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Mike Hawkins. They were visiting the boy's grandparents. Mr. and Mrs. Fred Burchtorf, when the boy went into the Burchtorf garage with his firecrackers.

The boy was rushed by ambulance to the Ocean Beach hospital at Ilwaco, where he died about 9 p. m. Physicians said he had suffered third-degree burns over 85 per cent of his body.
