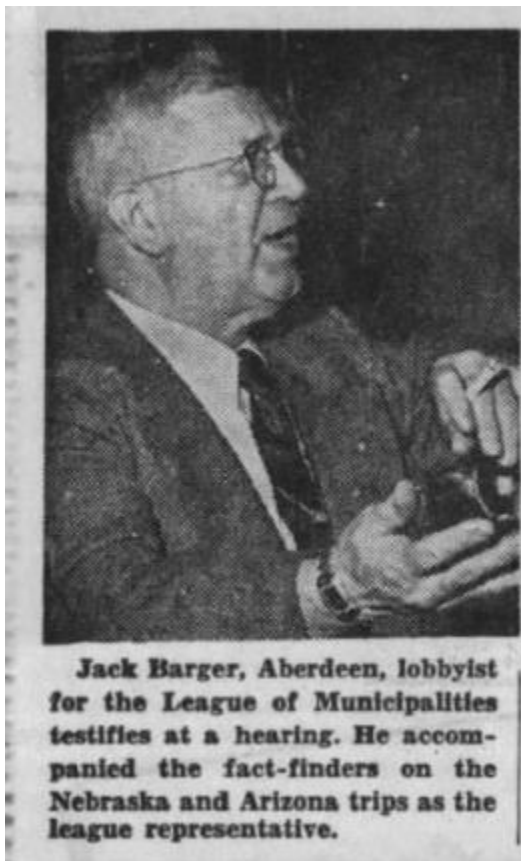

Gaylord Boy's Thrilling Rescue

Gaylord Boy Writes of His Thrilling
Experience While Crossing
The Atlantic

Sundays's Minneapolis Journal contained a number of interesting letters written by Minnesota boys among which is a letter written by Corporal John G. Barger of Gaylord, who was aboard the ill-fated vessel Tuscania. Thrown into the sea, adrift on an overturned life boat, ready to give up and finally rescued by an English destroyer is the thrilling experience he tells in the following letter:

"I had a very narrow escape and don't care to be that close to death's door soon again. Our ship was torpedoed at about 6 o'clock in the evening. About half of the boys had been to mess and either in their rooms or on deck. The rest of us were mostly lining up in the hallways waiting for the mess call. I had just gone downstairs after my knife, fork and spoon, and although I usually took off my overcoat and cap to go to mess, something seemed to tell me to keep them with me this night. I had just returned to the hallway when the torpedo struck. The explosion was not very loud—just a deep dull thud, but we all knew what it was. The explosion put out the lights and we were in absolute darkness for a few moments. But someone soon

rustled a few lights and the men all started for the decks in a very orderly manner. We had all been carrying our lifebelts with us for the last few days so everyone was equipped. S. O. S. and distress signals were immediately sent out and three of the English torpedo destroyers and a number of boats from the lighthouses near by, immediately came to our assistance.

"At the start of the voyage we had all been assigned to places on the ship where we would load into lifeboats in case of any trouble. I was assigned a place on the port side of the ship. We all got our places but they seemed to have trouble launching the lifeboats. The ship had been struck on the starboard side and was listing that way making the boats on the port side hard to launch, so a number of us were ordered up on the top deck to help launch these boats. While we were working on these boats a destroyer pulled up on the port side and took off a large number of men. We still continued to work on the boats.

"After a while another destroyer pulled up on the starboard side and we were told we had better get onto it. I went down to deck A to get into this destroyer.

"Found a rope which was fast to the destroyer and started my slide for life. Got about half way down the rope when it gave way and I landed in the 'deep blue ocean.'

"The destroyer had started to pull away and there I was dangling along the side of the ship.

"Finally got up on the bottom of a lifeboat which had capsized. This drifted out into the ocean. The big waves rolled all over it. I had a mighty hard time staying on top of it and was getting cold and numb and discouraged. I began to holler and try to get the attention of anyone who might be near. And finally when I was about ready to give up one of the destroyers loomed up near me.

"I called to them and they answered that they would come back and pick me up. They were the best words I have ever heard. They backed up and threw a rope to me. I tied it to my waist and they pulled. I went down into the water, and thought I was never going to come up, but they finally pulled me aboard. I was numb and wet so they took me down into the engine room and warmed me up and dried me out. We were taken to an English army camp and were treated fine. Anything they had was ours.

"We have lost a few of our boys but generally we got away pretty lucky. The boys are all stronger and better men and more determined to whip the kaiser."

Pierre, Feb. 6.—On Tuesday evening, starting at 7:30, there will be a "free-for-all" hearing on the local option liquor bill, after which the senate liquor control committee, which has the bill under consideration, will decide whether to report out the measure for action on the floor.

PRIOR TO NATIONAL PROHIBITION

At the opposition meeting Friday night objection to the bill was raised by Jack Barger, Aberdeen, representative of the League of Municipalities, on the grounds that liquor would color all other issues in an election.

He suggested that provision be made for special elections on the issue.

Want Soldier Vote

Barger said he also represented the executive committee of the American Legion, which feels that the liquor matter should be withheld until men in the service return to add their voice concerning the matter.

 Speaking of war veterans, we mustn't forget Jack Barger, of Aberdeen, lobbyist for the League of Municipalities. Jack was on the Tuscania when it was hit by a German torpedo on February 5, 1918. He was in the icy waters for several hours before being rescued by a British man-of-war.

Jack was first on the top of a lifeboat & then rescued by a destroyer – no one could survive more than 3 hours in the water that night – “Sioux Falls (SD) Argus-Leader” Wednesday 10 Feb 1943 p 8

Numerous articles in South Dakota newspapers in his role as executive secretary of the South Dakota League of Municipalities. He was known as “Jack Barger.”

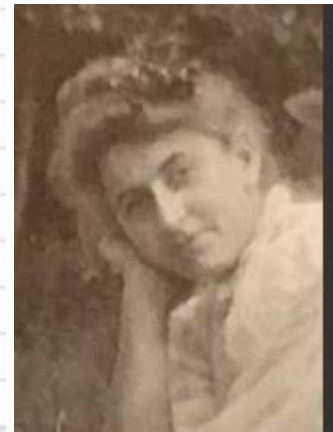
Mr. Barger ran a grain elevator in Linton for many years becoming associated with the First National Bank. He was serving as president and chairman of board when he retired at the age of 83.

BODY OF MAN AND WOMAN FOUND IN RUINS OF BURNED HOTEL.

Bodies of the woman and man taken from the Astoria hotel fire ruins, 321 Hennepin avenue, have been identified as those of Mrs. Margaret Hurley, and of Frank O'Brien, a bartender at 314 Hennepin avenue. The discovery places the total number of fatalities of the fire at four. The identifications were made shortly after the two had been taken to the morgue.

Several hours after the body of O'Brien, who is a roomer at the Allen hotel, Third street and Second avenue S., had been removed from the ruins, that of Mrs. Hurley was found.

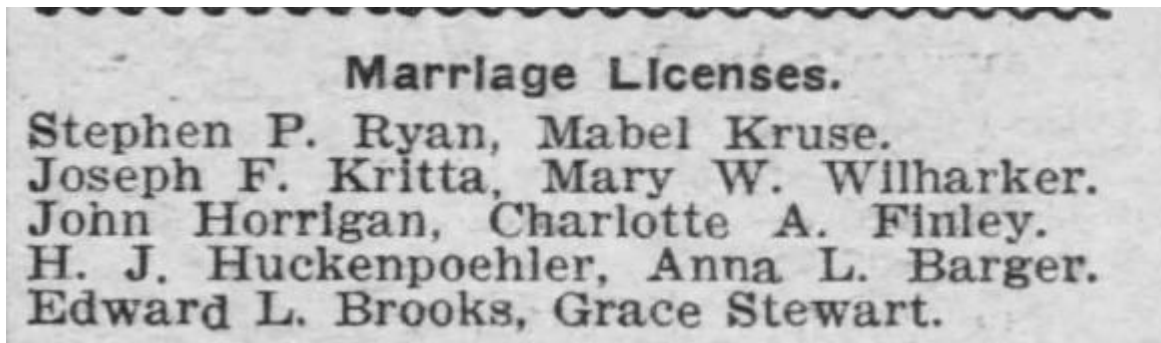

Pistol Is Flashed in Car

Back Platform Men Finally Muster Courage to Disarm and Hold Man.

Passengers on a crowded Como-Harriet street car were thrown into a panic yesterday when Guy Morgan, a strike guard employed by the Minnesota Transfer company, flourished a revolver in the midst of the passengers and threatened to "make mince meat" of the conductor.

Conductor Henry Huckenpoehler and several men on the rear platform grappled with Morgan for possession of the weapon. Had the revolver been discharged in the scuffle it was possible one of the passengers might have received the bullet.

Morgan, in the center of the struggling men, fell through the open gates to the ground, but still retained the revolver. His finger was on the trigger and the gun was in danger of being fired. The struggle occurred at the top of Lowry Hill, at the intersection of Douglas and Hennepin avenues.

Morgan finally was overpowered and disarmed. He was taken aboard the car and held captive at one end. Other passengers kept to the opposite end of the car.

Police headquarters had been notified and an auto patrol wagon with four detectives was speeding to meet the car. The police reached the car at Fourteenth street and Morgan was taken in charge. He is held pending an investigation as to his sanity.

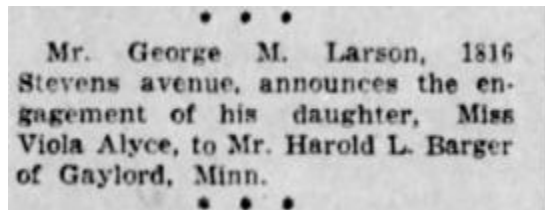

Survived by 1 brother John Barger (Salem OR) & 1 sister in CA (unnamed). – Married 21 Jun 1904 to Matye [Mary Margaret] Donohue (also found as Donahue) (1880-1942, F: 176280407) in New Richmond, St. Croix WI. – Buried in Immaculate Conception Catholic Church Cemetery, New Richmond, St. Croix WI. F: 176280404
- Margaret E. (Maggie) Barger Hurley, 27 Mar 1877 MN – 12 Mar 1915 Minneapolis, Hennepin MN. Age 7 in 1885, age 22 in 1900. Wife of James Sylvester Hurley (1873-1923, F: 183814958) whom she married 27 Nov 1901 in Renville Co. MN. – In the 1910 census for Renville, Renville MN, Margaret HURLY (38 MN, parents b. Germany) lived with her husband James Hurly (38 MN) and their 5 children. They reported having been married 8 years. – Her body was found in the burned-out ruins of the Astoria Hotel, 321 Hennepin Ave., Minneapolis MN. According to her MN death record, she was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery. Is this the cemetery in Arlington, Sibley Co. MN?
- Mary Ann (Molly) Barger Desmond, 10 Jan 1880 Henderson, Sibley MN – 12 Nov 1965 Los Angeles, Los Angeles Co. CA. In the 1880 census (conducted Jun 1880),

her birthdate is given as Jan 1880 & she is 4 months old. Age 5 in 1885, 20 in 1900. Married 10 Nov 1902 in Renville Co. MN to John Joseph Desmond (1878-1958).

- Joseph C. Barger, 19 Mar 1881 Henderson, Sibley MN – 8 Aug 1881 Henderson, Sibley MN. Shares headstone with sister Ellen, who also died in infancy. Buried in St. Thomas Cemetery, Jessenland, Sibley MN. F: 183656925.
- Ellen Barger, 21 Jul 1882 Henderson, Sibley MN – 19 Aug 1882 Henderson, Sibley MN. Shares headstone with brother Joseph C., who also died in infancy. Buried in St. Thomas Cemetery, Jessenland, Sibley MN. F: 183657028.
- Anna E./Annie Barger Huckenpoehler, Jul 1883 MN - Age 1 in 1885, age 16 in 1900. Graduate of Gaylord (MN) High School in 1901. – Married Henry J. (“Huckie”) Huckenpoehler on 16 Feb 1903 in Ramsey Co. MN. In 1910, Anna Huckenpoehler (also indexed as Huckenporkler), age 26, b. MN, father b. PA, mother b. US, lived on University Ave. in St. Paul, Ramsey MN with her husband Henry J. (29 MN) & son Dayton (6 MN). Henry was a conductor for the street railway. – Henry J. Huckenpoehler was born 27 Mar 1881 or ca. 1884 (according to 1910 census) or 1877 (according to his tombstone) & died 12 Jul 1956 in Ramsey Co. MN. His burial in Arlington Public Cemetery, Arlington, Sibley MN gives a birth year of 1877 but the 12 Jul 1956 death date, F: 74754122. He was the son of August Huckenpoehler (1860-1947) & Bertha Paulmann (b. 1859). In the 1930 census for St. Paul, Ramsey MN, Harry J. Huckenpoehler, 49 MN, is divorced & a boarder. - Her records on Ancestry.com are often erroneous, confusing her with her sister Mary Ann. – Married a Martinson according to Ancestry.com. Could not trace.

Myrtle’s tombstone has the surname spelling of McKenzie. She is buried in Oakdale Cemetery, Crookston, Polk MN. F: 42461876
- Viola Barger, 1893 Sibley Co. MN – 1900 Arlington, Sibley MN. Buried in St. Mary’s Catholic Cemetery, Arlington, Sibley MN. F: 74833884.
- Harrold Louis Barger, 19 Nov 1897 Gaylord, Sibley MN – 25 Jun 1969 Montgomery Co. PA. Graduate of Gaylord (MN) High School in 1916. Married Viola Alice Larsen (1898-1980, F: 170468750) in Sibley Co. MN on 9 Sep 1920. She was survived by a wife named Naydene or Nadine; could not trace her. Buried in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Cheltenham township, Montgomery Co. PA. F: 184311746
