Ninety men were today selected to leave Warren next Wednesday for Camp Lee. They will embark at the P. R. R. station at 12:15 and go via Washington, Richmond and Petersburg. A stop of thirty minutes will be allowed in Kane for luncheon and supper will be served at Williamsport. Carl P. Clark of this city has been designated as captain of the company. Forty per cent of the county's quota would be 79 men, but as many districts in the state are unable to furnish their share upon this call other districts have been asked to furnish as many as they could so that the total of the entire state will equal 40 per cent. TWO FOREST COUNTY LADS AMONG TUSCANIA MISSING; M'KEAN MEN ARE RESCUED

Clea Bagerstok, of Marienville, and Charles L. Thompson, of Endeavor, Among Eight Pennsylvanians Not Reported as Survivors. Cecil Metzgar, of Smethport and W. W. Rinn, Jr., of Port Allegany, Safe.

On the ill-fated transport Tuscania, Forest county was represented by four sons, two of whom "so far have not been reported among the survivors." Though 345 Sammies are reported as missing, 200 are believed to be in hospitals. The men from Forest county still missing, but whose death is not confirmed, are:

Corporal Clea Bagerstok, 20th Engineers, Marienville; mother, Rilla Bagerstok.

Private Charles L. Thompson, Endeavor; father, C. G. Thompson.

The other two Forest county lads aboard the transport and reported among the survivors, are Private Marvin W. Alcock, of Endeavor, and Private Chester H. Jones, of Endeavor.

Corporal Bagerstok is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bagertok, Marienville, Forest county. He is 22 years old and single. He was formerly employed at Endeavor and enlisted with the 20th engineers at American university, Washington, D. C.

Charles Lee Thompson, of Endeavor, formerly employed at the Westinghouse plant in Pittsburg, was also listed among the survivors. He enlisted in Oil City in the foresters' regiment last January 3 and left the same day for Pittsburg enroute to Washington, D. C.

Father Awaits Fate of Son On Board Tuscania

TIONESTA, PA., Feb. 11.—Corp. Clea Bargerstock, a member of the United States Engineer Corps, who was on board the transport Tuscania when it was torpedoed off the coast of Ireland last week, and who has not been reported among the survivors, is a son of Robert Bargerstock, a farmer, of Marienville, near here. Thus far the family has received no official information as to whether their son is among the survivors.

Corp. Bargerstock is aged 22 and is well known in this region. He had worked in the lumber camps on the outskirts of Marienville until he was drafted and sent to Camp Lee, Petersburg, Va. After training there several weeks he was transferred to a camp in Washington, D. C. Three other brothers are at home.

Corporal Clea Bargerstock, Marienville, Son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bargerstock, is Victim.

WAS MEMBER OF ENGINEERS

Official Confirmation That U-boat Had Claimed Soldier From This Section is Cabled.

DEPARTMENT LEARNS OF 82

The first man from this section to be buried on foreign soil—victim of a Hun submarine—is Clea Bargerstock, Marienville, Forest county.

Officials' advices received at the war department last night announce his name as one of the victims of the sinking of the Tuscania.

As announced in the Herald last Monday, it was feared that Bargerstock had lost his life when the boat went down, as he was known to have been aboard and his name had not appeared among the long list of survivors and did appear on the list of more than three hundred unaccounted for.

Receive Official News.

Last night, with the first official report of the identity of those dead aboard, his name appeared.

Corporal Bargerstock was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bargerstock, Marienville, where the father is engaged in farming.

He was just 22 years of age and was single. He was formerly employed at Endenavor, Forest county. He sailed for France on the Tuscania as a member of the 29th engineers, having joined them at the American university, Washington, D. C.

Besides the father and mother, three brothers, at home, survive.

CLEA BARGERSTOCK LOST LIFE ON TUSCANIA

Official List of Dead Includes Marienville Young Man As Victim of Huns.

Corporal Clea Bargerstock, of Marienville, is officially reported to have lost his life in the sinking of the Tuscania. Charles W. Short, of Wellsboro, is also included among the 82 men officially reported as victims of the Hun U-boat. Names of no other Pennsylvanians appear in the list. While 264 men still are unaccounted for in official reports, the navy department announces it has not reason to believe that previous estimate that 113 Sammies lost their lives will be exceeded.

Clea Bargerstock was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bargerstock, of Marienville, and was known throughout Forest county as result of employment in various wood camps. He left for Camp Lee with the first contingent of drafted men and previous to embarkation on the Tuscania was transferred to the 20th engineers, forestry division, at Washington barracks.

NOW REPORTED LOST

Clea Bargerstock, of Marienville, Reported Saved from Tuscania
Now Thought Lost

According to the list of men lost on the Tuscania now given out by the war department, Clea Bargerstock, of Marienville, has been lost. The first published lists carried the information that he had been saved. He was well known in this city, having been employed at the Knabb Baniel works on the East Side for several months, during which time he made his home with his brother, C. R. Bargerstock, on Pennsylvania avenue, east. He was 22 years of age and unmarried and made his home at Endeavor while his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Bargerstock, resided at Marienville. He enlisted in Company D, 6th Battalion of the 20th Engineers Regiment, and was with that company on the Tuscania when it was sunk by a German submarine.

TWO SOLDIERS NOT REPORTED.

*Charles L. Thompson and Clea R.
Bargerstock May Be Lost.*

OIL CITY, PA., Feb. 12.—The names of two men from this section have

not been recorded in any list of the survivors of the Tuscania so far announced. One is Charles L. Thompson of Endeavor, who enlisted in the Twentieth Engineers in Oil City on January 3. Mr. Thompson is a graduate of the Endeavor High School and studied for a time in the engineering school of Cornell University. He was a member of the Tionesta baseball team and was well known as an athlete throughout Northwestern Pennsylvania.

The other man is Corporal Clea R. Bargerstock, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bargerstock of Marionville. He was aged 22 and single. He enlisted with the Twentieth Regiment of Engineers at the American University, Washington, D. C.

LOOKS INTO JAWS OF DEATH

Lawrence Brewster Survives Tuscania a Changed Man.

No soldier's letter which has come home to this section has carried the heart message to everyone, friend and stranger, which is borne by the first letter of Lawrence E. Brewster to his mother, Mrs. W. W. Brewster, Leeper, after the Tuscania was sunk. Mrs. Brewster sent the letter to her cousin, Mrs. W. L. McCracken, Brookville, in which she speaks of the great number of letters she and Mr. Brewster have received from all directions, many from persons unknown to them. Mrs. Brewster says that when the Tuscania was sunk she and her husband first heard of it from Brookville, a message saying Lawrence had gone down; thirty minutes later came a contradiction from Brookville; they were in suspense for days until word came from Washington that Lawrence was safe. His letter follows:

In England, Feb. 11, 1918.
Dear Mother and Father:

I arrived this far all O. K. I am well and have surely seen some of this side of the world and I have seen what I pray God I may never see again or hope that no other person may ever see. Oh! I can never forget it. You will, of course, read it in the newspapers of Pennsylvania, but you cannot get any idea of the awfulness of it. No one can unless they have gone through it as I have done—The Tuscania shipwreck.

When I landed in Ireland all I had was the clothes on my back, and I thank God that I am alive. I thought my time had surely come, so I trusted in Him and asked Him to put me safe on land, which He did. I shall never forget to thank Him.

All my friends and chums are gone. Poor Clea Bargerstock, of Marienville, had his life crushed out on the rocky shores of Scotland; was dashed to death by the waves on the shore.

Ireland is a very beautiful country; just as beautiful as the songs they sing of it.

All I have of my writing outfit you sent me for Christmas is my fountain pen which I had in my pocket, the rest of it is in the Irish Coast Sea.

I am very nervous and cannot write much. Will write at length when my nerves get settled. I hope you and Daddy are both well and don't worry about me. I am living a new life now and always shall do so. Remember me in all your prayers.

FOREST COUNTY WAR VICTIM TO BE BURIED

**Ray Bargerstock, Who Lost Life
Aboard Tuscania, to Rest in
Redclyffe Cemetery.**

Private Ray Bargerstock, of Red-Clyffe, Forest county, who lost his life when the *Tuscania* sank as the result of torpedoing by a German submarine, will rest in the cemetery in his home town. The United States government has taken up the bodies of the men, who were buried on the west coast of Ireland, and has shipped them homeward. The cemetery in Ireland was finely cared for by the Irish people in that section of the country and a fine monument has been reared there to the memory of the men.

It is expected that before the week is out all of the bodies will have been removed to Liverpool, from the Island of Islay, where they were buried, and will be prepared for shipment home. The victims of the Huns number about 300.

Most of the men who were drowned in the sinking of the ship were members of the Forestry Division, which was sent to France and England to aid in getting buildings ready for the army. Several from this section enlisted, and Ray Bargerstock, who was an expert in wood work, was a member of the Division.

Fatal Crash At Limestone; Four Injured

Natrona Couple Are in Serious Condition; Eddyville Man Dies

One man was killed and four other persons injured, two dangerously, Sunday afternoon when the automobile in which they were riding left the road on a curve near Limestone, Clarion county, and crashed into a concrete culvert. Reports of the accident say that the culvert was moved a distance of four feet by the force of the impact.

The dead:
Orion Weaver, 52, a farmer of Eddyville, died in the Brookville hospital about midnight of punctured lung and other injuries.

The injured:
Roy Bargerstock, 50, of 5 Gibson avenue, Natrona, driver of the car, in hospital with crushed chest and compound fracture of the right leg; condition serious.
His wife, Olive Bargerstock, 50, in hospital with both arms broken, comminuted fracture of left leg above and below the knee, and left ankle broken; condition serious.

Lottie Weaver, 45, wife of Orion Weaver, in hospital with right ankle fractured, cuts and bruises; condition not serious.
The Weavers' 16-year old son, Loyal, sustained cuts and bruises of the body and a sprained ankle but was able to leave the hospital late Monday afternoon.
The accident occurred on the Clarion-Limestone road between four and 5 p. m. as the party was on its way back to Eddyville where the Bargerstocks had been on a visit.
The car, unable to make a sharp curve in the road, crashed into the culvert with terrific force. Passing motorists called Dr. J. E. Keeling of Clarion, who rendered first aid to the victims, using splints from the floor boards of the car to bind up the various fractured limbs. They were rushed to the Brookville hospital in two ambulances, arriving here in a badly shocked condition.
Every effort was made to save the life of Orion Weaver but he died about six hours after being admitted to the hospital.
The accident was investigated by Highway Patrolman Thiel and Dr. G. H. Walker, Clarion county coroner, with the result that an inquest was not deemed necessary.
Physicians said yesterday that Mr. and Mrs. Bargerstock were resting comfortably but that their condition is serious.

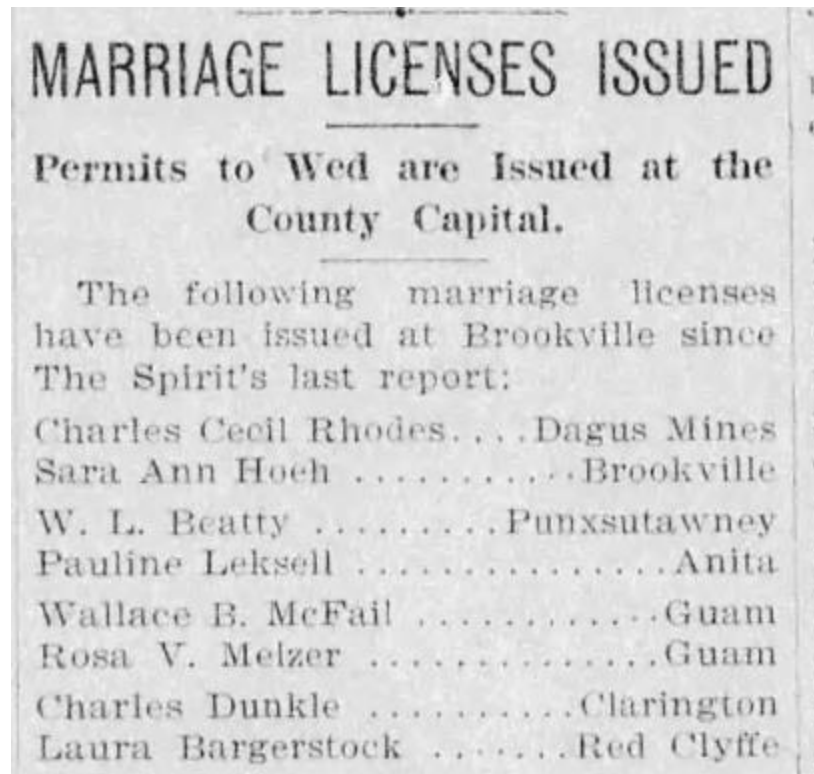
