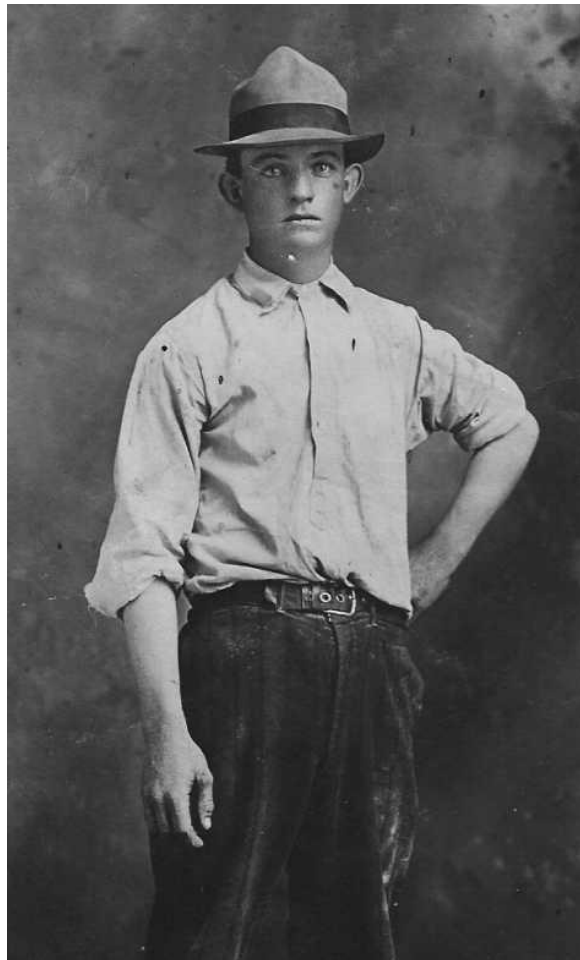

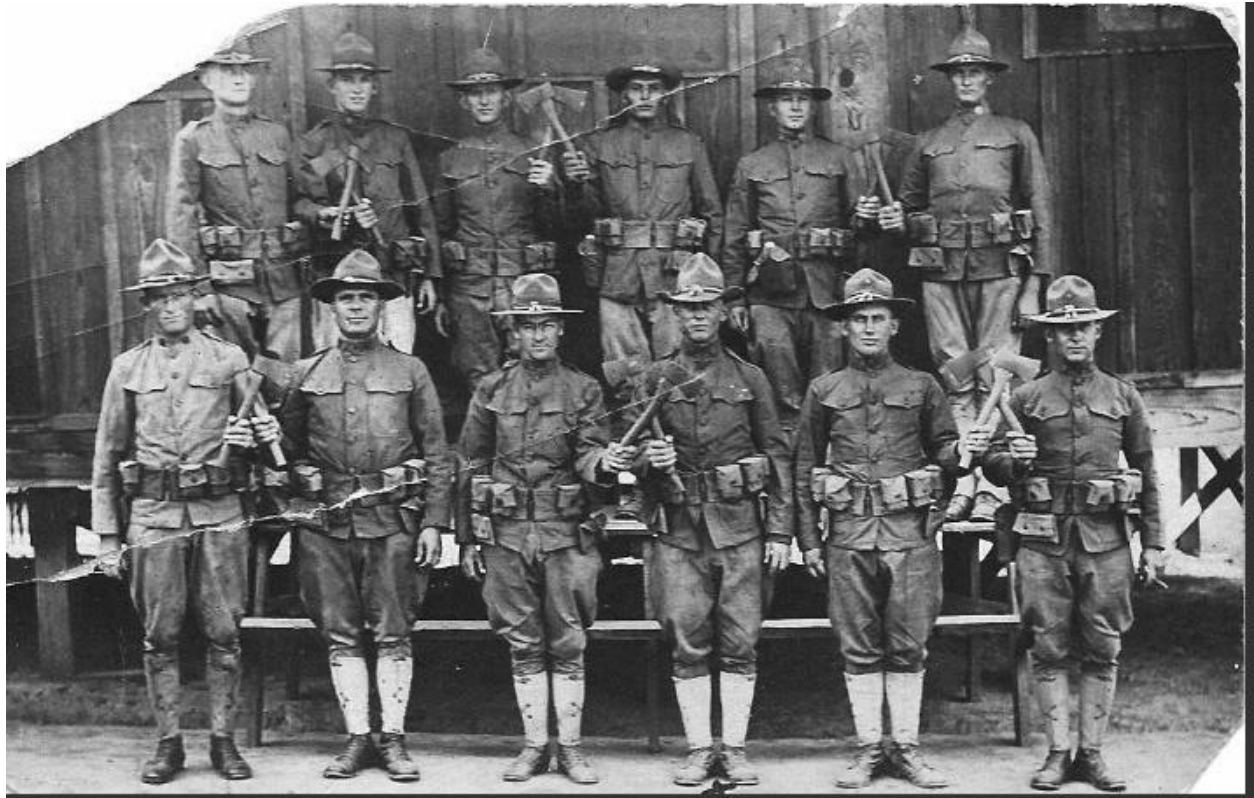

Allen Barnett

Services for Allen W. Barnett, 84, of 211 Barrow Drive will be at 2 p.m. Sunday in the Hubbard-Kelly Funeral Home chapel, with burial in Sunset Memorial Gardens.

Barnett died in Medical Center Hospital Thursday after a long illness.

He was born in Randolph Nov. 18, 1894, and was a retired operator for the carbon black plant. He was married to Ruth Lee Dunn March 3, 1920, in Duncan Okla., and came to Odessa Aug. 1, 1945, from Lubbock. Barnett was a Baptist, and had served in World War I in the U.S. Army. He was a member of the American Legion World War I Barracks.

Survivors include four daughters, Rena Mae Jones of Comanche, Okla., Victoria Brown, Bernice Wyson and Durlene Morris, all of Odessa; two sons, Alton Barnett and Ray Barnett, both of Odessa; one sister, Anna Mae Beatty of Lamesa; 22 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren.

MEN ACCEPTED BY BOARD FOR NEW NATIONAL ARMY

**Quite a Number of These Have Filed Exemption Claims
With District Board—Second Call
Exams Are Made.**

Out of the total of 434 men called in the first draft, 179 were accepted by the local board, and certification made last Saturday. A number of these had filed claims for exemption, which claims were not allowed by the board. These will appeal their case to the district board, but it is not likely that very many of the appeals will be sustained.

The local board examined about 415 of the original call, the others having already joined the colors or were transferred. Physical exemptions numbered 124, which leaves 112 whose exemption claims were allowed.

The second call, to fill the quota of this county was made last week, and examinations were made Tuesday and Wednesday. The board is now busily engaged in compiling these examination blanks but they will not be ready to give out for two or three days.

Following are those who have been accepted, and will be ordered to report to the adjutant general in a few days.

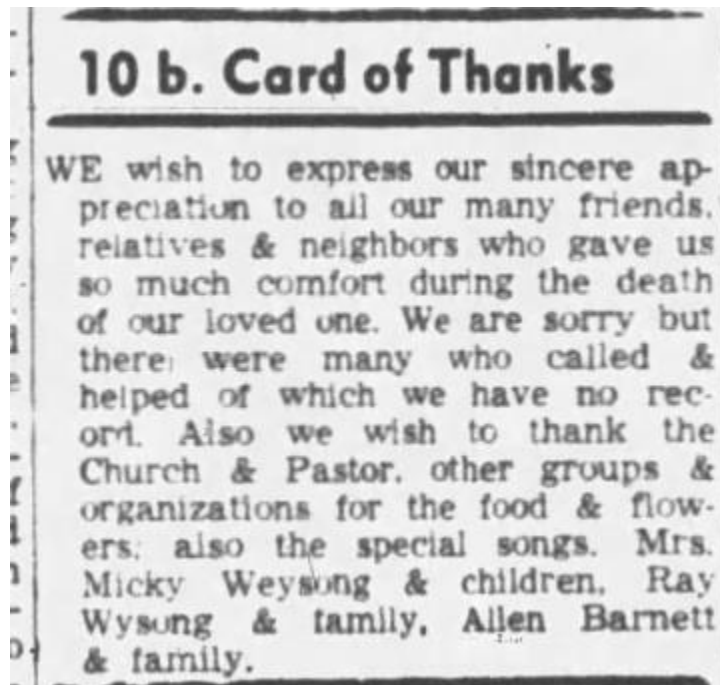

The mystery “sister” –

Minnie Barnett Dunn. Listed as Allen’s next-of-kin when he sailed home from WWI aboard “Princess Matoika” in Jul 1919, a resident of Comanche OK. The name Mrs. W.M. Dunn is crossed off on the passenger list of the “Princess Matoika” - and “Minnie” is written in. The maiden name of Allen’s wife is Dunn. In the 1910 census, Allen’s parents had 3 children, he being the oldest at age 15. His siblings were Cecil Estell & Annie Mae. In 1900, his mother Maggie said she had given birth to 2 children: her sons Allen & Estell. One Ancestry.com links her to the family, but then indicates that Minnie Lee Barnett (1892-1964) was the daughter of John Lewis Barnett & Nannie Sudee C. Storms & married Aaron Elsworth Faulkner.
