Texas County Boys Left Thursday Morning

Quite a display of patriotism and loyalty to the home boys was shown Thursday morning when the train carrying the Texas county boys to the training camps came through Texhoma. The train stopped here for one hour during which time hundreds of the loyal friends of the drafted boys shook their hands, wishing them well, spoke encouraging words to them and presented them with many gifts. A specially arranged eight piece brass band furnished music for the occasion, and also specially selected songs were included in the program. 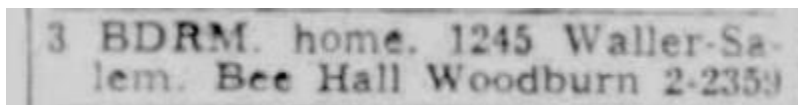

She is the last surviving member of the Lewis gang, which engaged in battles with the police of Colorado Springs and Denver in September, 1918, resulting in the death of John W. Barneycastle, Las Animas county, twenty to thirty years; Tony Bertine, Lake county, nineteen years; Earl F. Blakeley, Chaffee county, twenty to twenty-four years; Benjamin O. Cook, Chaffee county, twenty to twenty-four years; Pedro Valdez, Bent county, fifteen to seventeen years; Alice Ahrendt, Teller county, ten to fifteen years.

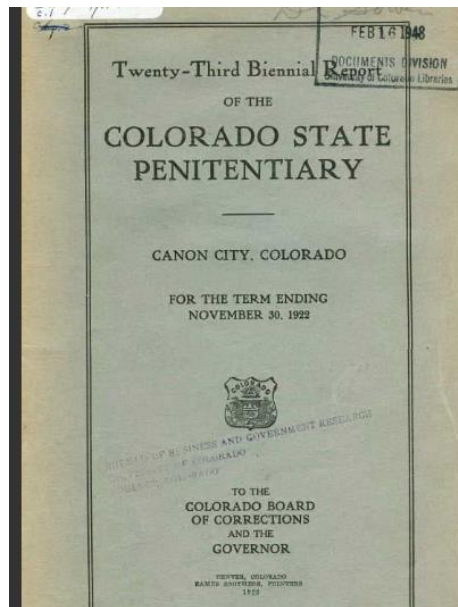


The Custer County school census records are on Colorado State Archives microfilms L1510 (years 1893 – 1945, District 13) and L1511 (years 1945, District 14 - 1964). Up through 1919 the annual report by the district secretary of children of school age residing in the district gives the date, district number, name, and sex. Beginning in 1916, they sometimes listed the parent or guardian and residence town. Beginning in 1920, added to the record was place and date of birth, school grade last attended of each child enumerated; names, address and nativity of parents; names and number of deaf, mutes, blind, illiterates and crippled; and totals. Also on microfilm L1511, are Teacher Registers for various districts and years, mostly 1897, 1900-1927, which was a daily register of a student's school attendance.

On the microfilm, the census is arranged chronologically by year, then by school district numerically within the year and alphabetically by the student's named within the record.

Denmark, was a private chauffeur. He had served in WWI & was 1st married at the age of 28. Elizabeth Schultz, 29 TX, father b. US, mother b. TX, was a dress maker in a tailor shop. In the 1940 census, Arthur & Lizzie resided in Los Angeles, Los Angeles CA at 237 E. 52nd St. Arthur A. Schultz (47 NE) was a truck driver for a truck company. In the household were his wife, Elizabeth (39 TX), a daughter Elizabeth Finch (18 CO, a soda-fountain girl at a drug store) & a granddaughter Anita Finch (3 CA). - Ada Barneycastle Jones, 5 Jan 1911 OK – 27 Jun 1975 CO. Age 9 in 1920 census. Married 15 Sep 1933 in Colorado Springs, El Paso Co. CO to Harold Raymond Jones (1912-1996, F: 43067677). Buried in Imperial Memorial Gardens, Pueblo, Pueblo CO. F: 25840607
- James Tommie Barneycastle, 15 Sep 1913 Kim, Las Animas CO – 23 Mar 2007 Tucson, Pima AZ. Age 7 in 1920 census. Married to Clara Bernice McGee (1925-2012).
- Avant Barneycastle Martin, 4 Feb 1915 Kim, Las Animas CO [CO school records give dates of 15 Feb 1915 & 4 Feb 1917] CO – 15 Jan 2012 Pueblo, Pueblo CO. Age 4 years 10 months in the 1920 census. 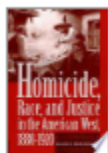

 WHITE HOMICIDES

Trinidad had its share of sensational homicides. The *Trinidad Chronicle-News* reported the death of a leading Trinidad citizen: "The most awful tragedy that has ever occurred in the city of Trinidad was the killing of John H. Fox, ex-county treasurer . . . this afternoon at one-forty-five, the murderer being Joe Johnson, an ex-deputy sheriff."¹⁰¹ Johnson had entered the U.S. Post Office, walked up behind Fox, drawn his revolver, shouted "You son-of-a bitch," and shot him as he stood reading a newspaper.¹⁰² A crowd quickly gathered and began to shout "Hang him" and "Lynch him." Despite the presence of the sheriff, his deputies, and the Trinidad police force, all of whom were armed with rifles and shotguns, the crowd continued to grow and refused to disperse as ordered. The sheriff "informed the mob that the first man who stepped his foot upon the steps approaching the court house or jail would be given a dose of lead."¹⁰³ Apparently the crowd believed him and began to disperse. To be safe, the sheriff and five deputies transported their prisoner to Pueblo by train that night. A jury found Johnson guilty of first-degree murder and the judge sentenced him to death.

Another celebrated case, which occurred on Sunday, March 10, 1918, involved incest. W. Tom Barneycastle had been carrying on an incestuous relationship with his daughter Lizzie that had begun six years previously in Oklahoma. In 1914 Lizzie had given birth to a son by this relationship, and the family had kept the matter secret by claiming that the baby was Lizzie's elder sister's.¹⁰⁴ Lizzie subsequently married one Laymond D. Williams. Her father later wrote in a statement, "Now she struck a sucker that was crasey [*sic*] and has left me."¹⁰⁵ In revenge, he, his wife, and their twelve-year-old daughter plotted to kill Williams. The two females, disguised as male farm workers, approached the Williams ranch near Dalrose on Sun-

day night and shot him to death. A jury found all three Barneycastles guilty. Tom himself served only four years in prison before he escaped on October 6, 1922.¹⁰⁶

The murder of Laymond Dedford Williams on 10 March 1918 – W. Tom Barneycastle had begun an incestuous relationship with his daughter Lizzie six years earlier in Oklahoma. In 1914 Lizzie gave birth to her father's son, Aaron, but the family kept his parentage a secret by claiming Aaron was the son of Lizzie's sister. Later Lizzie married Laymond D. Williams. Tom Barneycastle wrote: "Now she struck a sucker that was crasey [sic/crazy] and left me." Tom, his wife [Emily] and daughter Sallie plotted to kill Laymond. The two women disguised themselves as male farm workers, and approached the Williams ranch near Dalrose on Sunday, 10 March 1918, and shot Laymond to death. The jury found all three Barneycastles guilty. Tom served four years in prison (inmate 10557) before escaping 6 October 1922. He had applied for a pardon in 1920.

Note: A family genealogy says he served out his life term, but there are no census records after 1920 for "Thomas Barneycastle," then an inmate of the Colorado State Penitentiary, and apparently no records after his escape. Erroneous Ancestry.com family trees indicate he died between 1916 & 1920, but although he's not at home with his wife & children, he is alive in prison.

Note: Although Emily and Lizzie were supposedly the actual murderers, who shot the gun, by the 1920 census they are not living in prison.
