





LOCAL MAN, 75 DIES SUDDENLY

Heart Attack Fatal to Louis Rembs This Morning at His Home

A heart attack caused the sudden death this morning of Louis Rembs, 75, a retired Marshfield merchant, who had been engaged in the undertaking and furniture business here for many years.

Mr. Rembs, who had recovered from an operation undergone last fall at the local hospital, had been active up to the time of his death. He transacted business late yesterday afternoon, and last night had visited his sister Louise, Sister M. Grace, who is a nun at St. Joseph's Hospital. leaving there at about 8:45 o'clock.

Shortly before 5:30 o'clock this morning he awakened and spoke to Mrs. Rembs with the intention of attending mass at St. John's Catholic Church. While talking to her he suffered a heart attack and died instantly.

Rites at St. John's

The body will lie in state at the Rembs Funeral Home, owned by his son, John, until the time of the funeral services. Tentative plans are being made for a requiem high mass Tuesday morning See—REMBS—Page 6

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. A. J. Dorrenbach will officiate at the services, and burial will be made in the family lot in the Catholic cemetery at Hillside.

Mr. Rembs, whose home was at 505 W. Blodgett street, was born in Reichenau, Austria, May 30, 1864, the son of Matt and Theresa Rembs. At the conclusion of his school career he assisted on his father's farm until he reached the age of 19 years.

In 1883 Mr. Rembs and one brother and two sisters came to this country, locating in what is now Rothschild, where he worked in Gray's planing mill and lumber yard for 10 years.

Father, Son Partners

In 1920 Mr. Rembs took into partnership with him his son John, who has been in the undertaking business ever since, giving up the furniture business last year. For a time William Baer and Oscar Lange owned part interest in the Rembs Funeral Home.

Mr. Rembs had also operated a funeral home in Santa Barbara, Calif., for about three years. He retired from active business about 15 years ago.

Mr. Rembs was a member of St. Joseph's Society, of St. John's Court. Catholic Order of Foresters, and the Holy Name Society of St. John's. He was formerly affiliated with the Catholic Knights of Wisconsin, Branch No. 72, and John Eisen Council, Knights of Columbus.

Surviving Relatives

His marriage to Miss Barbara Thierolf of Marshfield took place in St. John's Church Oct. 15, 1897, the late Rev. John-Eisen officiating at the nuptials.

Came Here in 1893

He came to Marshfield in 1893, at which time he established himself in the furniture and undertaking business in the building now occuped by the Pritzl Hardware Store on the corner of N. Central avenue and W. Blodgett street. Two years later he admitted Jacob Sturm into partnership with him, following which they purchased the furniture and underbusinesses of Valentine taking Weber and Mrs. Derby, combining their own and the Derby stocks with the stock in the Weber place. where the Wasserberger-Dickof store is now situated.

Three years later, in 1898. Rembs and Sturm purchased the property at S. Central and E. Third street, remodeled and enlarged the building, and moved their business there. Later they sold the old building and erected a new building next to what is now the Citizen's National Bank. About three years after moving to this new location, the partnership was dissolved, Mr. Sturm withdrawing.

Surviving besides his widow are 10 children, John Rembs, Marshfield; Mrs. Clarence (Margaret) Leicht, Stratford; Mrs. Leslie (Louise) Fairchild, South Gate Calif.; Mrs. James (Leona) Geischecker, Evanston, Ill.; Mrs. Lawrence (Marie) Dupre, Evanston, Ill.; Mrs. Al (Barbara) Kane. Los Angeles, Calif.; Mrs. Frank (Agnes) Hooley, Compton, Calif.; and Martin, Edward, and Robert Rembs, all of Los Angeles, Calif. Two daughters, Helen and Gertrude, and a son, Louis, preceded him in death. Another son died in infancy.

"I'm after a divorce, me from her," said Mathew Barth pointing to his wife as they entered the office of Clerk of the Court Glen Morse yesterday morning.

He was told by Mr. Morse that they could not be granted a divorce unless one of them had entered an action for the same.

"What're giving us; we are both willing, we don't want to live together any longer. I haven't lived with her for a year and a half.'

He was told that if he had deserted his wife it was her place to begin an action against him and secure the much coveted document which would make them both free. "But I'm the one that asked for it." insisted the man and it was not until a local lawyer whom the man knew, entered the office that he would be made to understand that a divorce could be granted him by the clerk of the court.

He was under the impression that Mr. Morse was trying to beat him out of the divorce. The lawyer told him what course to pursue and the couple then accompanied the attorney to his office down town where papers were drawn up, beginning action for a divorce.

Both Barth and his wife were very anxious to secure the divorce. Mrs. Barth for over a year and a half, with the assistance of her children, has been working a farm in Bovina. Barth has a position in Milwaukee. The property is all in her name.

Yellow Cab Man Suggests Merger of Madison's Two Taxi Concerns

Charles Ossmann Gives Sketch of Year's Schedule

By ELWYN DARBO

A SSERTING that the duplication of services between the two rival taxi companies is responsible for losses to both firms and to the public, Charles Ossmann, president of the Yellow Taxicab Co., of Madison, has announced that his company would not be averse to a consolidation.

"Tax.cabe should be classified as public utilities." he declared. "The frequent use of these companies in emergencies and hospital calls warrants a utility li-

Mr. Ossmann termed fallacious the popular contention that, "competition is a boon to business," asserting that rathèr it is a formidable handicap.

"The duplication of services between the two local taxi companies is lamentable, because each company loses money without giving additional services to the public," he asserted. "Chains have been formed by bankers, retailers, and other firms, for the purpose of lending a hand to a failing or unfortunate member. We must do the same.

- Avoid Duplication

"Madisonians would reap the profit of the local consolidation in additional services gained from the removal of this wasteful duplication of services."

Taxicab utilities are now operated in Connecticut, Pennsylvania, Washington, and New Jersey, Mr. Ossmann pointed out, declaring that these firms are more stabilized than the independent con-

Marlatt, and Pres. Glenn Frank of the university, are among the cab driver's greatest assets. They present a box of candy to the local employes each year. More than half of the company's business is west of the capitol square.

Drivers Responsible

A possible explanation for the fact that the past year has seen a decrease in the arrests of drivers for speeding, is seen in the new policy which makes each driver responsible for his own fine. Mr. Ossmann revealed.

"We refuse to saying necessity and driving."

The Yellow Taxicab Co. of Madison has 17 cabs which traveled 350,000 miles in the aggregate, during the past year, and had only one serious accident. This occurred at the dangerous intersection of Mifflin and Broom sts., and the cab driver was exonerated from liability in the accident.

About 75,000 gallons of gasoline were used in the cabs during the year, 6,000 of which were used in the record month of January, About 5,000 gallons represents the average monthly consumption. There figures are for cabe in passenger use only, excluding luggage pieces hauled by trucks for that purpose.

15,000 Baggage Pieces

The local Yellow Cab Co. hauled 15,-000 luggage pieces on the regular twotruck fleet, which is augmented during rush seasons by two additional trucks which are reserved for "can't wait" calls.

The longest truck trip made during the year was to Red Granite. The longest cab trip was to Chicago.

Victor Hugo is the oldest employe of the local cab firm. Among the cab men are five university students, one of whom is driving cab this semester to pay his way in school the next. The record wage for part-time student drivers is \$23 per week, earned consistently by a driver last year. The average part time wage ranges from \$15 to \$25 a week, while that of the full time man is from \$20 to \$35 a week, exclusive of tips.

"We don't care how many students crowd into a cab," Mr. Ossmann stated. "It doesn't doet us any more and it helps the students out. If the cab proceeds at a rate below 6 miles per hour, the occupant of the cab is charged by the hour. Ordinarily, of course, the charge is made by the mile."

We refuse to assist nocturnal 'drunks' whose carousals often expose our drivers to bribes," Mr. Osemann asserted. "Such demands as 'get us a drink, buddy,' or 'let's have some fun in this taxi' are ignored by our drivers.

All services to the cabs are taken care of in the regular Yellow cab garage. This work is done by Fay Gibson, chief mechanic, and Sam Leamonson, night superintendent. All of the work is done by them except wheel straight-

"We carried a half million passengers, many of whom were children, last year," Mr. Ossmann said, "Although business men use the cabs frequently, the women are not far behind. Newspaper reporters call cabs in emergencies and often use them every day for business routine. Bue drivers use them going to and from the station."

Average 57 Cents

Passengers paid an average of 57 cents per trip last year. The fares ranged from 25 cents to \$2. Many use the cab service to meet trains at distant points after the buses have left, and a great part of the company's business is obtained by meeting the local incoming and outgoing trains. Cab connections are made with about 55 of these daily.

In 20,000 trips, the company's cabs drove more than 46,527 miles in January, 1929, without an accident. This is a record, Mr. Osmann points out. considering the inclement weather and hazardous street conditions.

The busiest time of day for the cab company is during the two-hour noon period, when the calls greatly exceed the supply of cabs. The busiest period in the year is from October to April, when many car owners have put away their muchines for the winter and walking is bad. In September the loss of regular passenger trade is compensated Dean P. Louise Nardin, Miss A. L. by the extra business made possible by

the student baggage transport requirements.

Although weather conditions were more severe, the general upkeep expense did not increase during 1929, Mr. Ossmann pointed out, Broken springs are the most common winter troubles, More cars will be added to the flect after Jan. 1.

\$3,000 Taxes

The company paid \$3,000 a year in taxes from a \$50,000 payroll. Ben Lathrop is night manager of the firm, and R. B. Mayville is day mechanic

Due to a recent affiliation with the Yellow Truck Lines, Inc., which operates two trips daily between Milwaukee and Madison, the officers of the Yellow Cab Co, are now common with the truck line.
