STILLWATER, May 18—Funeral services for Charles A. Bartholomew Sr., 64, Stillwater oil broker and insurance man, will be held at 2:30 p. m. Tuesday in the Strode funeral home chapel. Mr. Bartholomew died Saturday night in a Stillwater hospital.

A veteran of World War I, he was one of three survivors of the troopship, Tuscionia, after it was torpedoed en route overseas.

A native of Cedarvale, Kans., he had lived in Stillwater since 1913. After coming here he was affiliated with the Stillwater Building and Loan Assn. until organizing his own oil brokerage and insurance business.

A member of the Methodist church, Mr. Bartholomew was an organizer of the Haner-Sharp American Legion post here.

Somewhere in England

Once more I can take the pleasure of writing you. I am fine and dandy and have had lots of experience in the salty water since I saw you last.

I suppose you heard of the big ship sinking before we landed but I was too light to sink. I was on the soil within three hours after we were attacked and was a happy boy.

Am getting along fine and like it over here.

RED CROSS CAMPAIGN

The annual Christmas Roll Call campaign of the American Red Cross will be continued through this week, according to C. A. Bartholomew, county director, who says he expects Stillwater to fill out its quota of \$600 before the campaign ends.

Although Stillwater is progressing nicely with its campaign other towns in the county are having difficulty in raising their quotas, Director Bartholomew says. At Ripley only \$35 had been subscribed when their last report was made. The Ingalls campaign has just started, delayed by the lack of supplies, and Glencoe and Perkins have made no reports.

Reports of workers Wednesday showed that a total of \$455 has been contributed in Stillwater, with the two largest wards not thoroughly canvassed.

BARTHOLOMEW IS BUSY AS ROLL CALL LEADER

C. A. Bartholomew is a busy man. As director of the annual Roll Call of the American Red Cross in Payne county, he has fifty-four "captains" at work under his supervision.

In addition to giving out supplies, checking in receipts and giving advice when asked, Director Bartholomew has the responsibility of making the campaign a success. Even the captains need occasional words of encouragement, he said.

Starting November 11, the Roll Call will continue until Thanksgiving day, next Thursday.

At noon Thursday, a total of more than \$300 had been reported to Director Bartholomew, although many workers had not reported.

No quota is set for the county, but Director Bartholomew expects the total receipts will reach \$700. Cushing and Yale have their own Red Cross organizations and are not included in the territory under the direction of the Stillwater man.

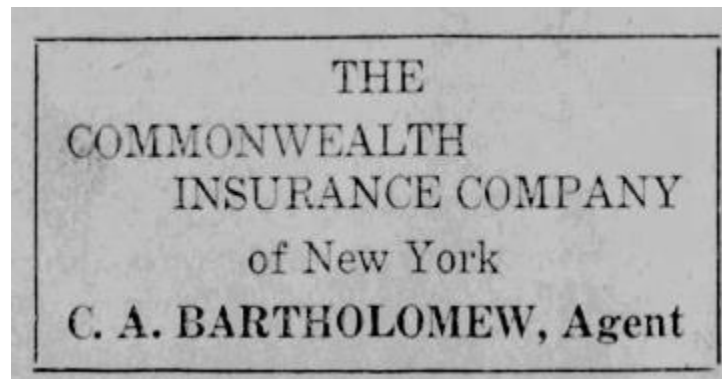
Special solicitors are active this year in Perkins, Ripley, Ingalls and Glencoe, working under the direction of the Stillwater organization. Last year the total contributions (in the form of membership fees) from Stillwater, Perkins and Ripley amounted to \$440. Glencoe and Ingalls were not organized in the 1922 campaign.

Director Bartholomew expects Stillwater to surpass its record of last year, when the city residents paid in \$400. This year \$500 is expected.

Of the fifty-four "captains" at work in the present Roll Call, thirty-two are in Stillwater.

The latest plan of Director Bartholomew is to carry the campaign to some of the larger rural schools.

**FIRST TROUBLES FROM
OIL WELL REACH COURT**

**Bartholomew Claims He Arranged
to Buy Royalty on Property Near
Well; Says Contract Broken**

First difficulties growing out of Stillwater's new oil well came to court Tuesday afternoon when suit was filed against Nels Clausen, owner of some land near the producer, by C. A. Bartholomew, who claims that an agreement for sale of the royalty was broken after the Friedemann came in.

According to the suit Bartholomew offered \$2,000 for the royalty beneath the southwest quarter of Clausen's land, the NW quarter, section 27, township 19, N. range 3, E of the I. M. Clausen's property joins the Friedemann land on the east and is just north of the Cecil Jones' holding.

The agreement was made that the royalty would be transferred after Clausen furnished an abstract of title. On June 17 Bartholomew says he demanded the abstract of title and that it was refused.

Since then Clausen has conveyed one-fourth interest in his royalty to another party, it is alleged, and the court is asked to confirm conveyance of the other three-quarters to Bartholomew.

In a second action, judgment of \$2,000 is asked because of damages allegedly suffered through loss of the one-fourth interest, already conferred.

The suit was filed by Ernest Jenkins, attorney.

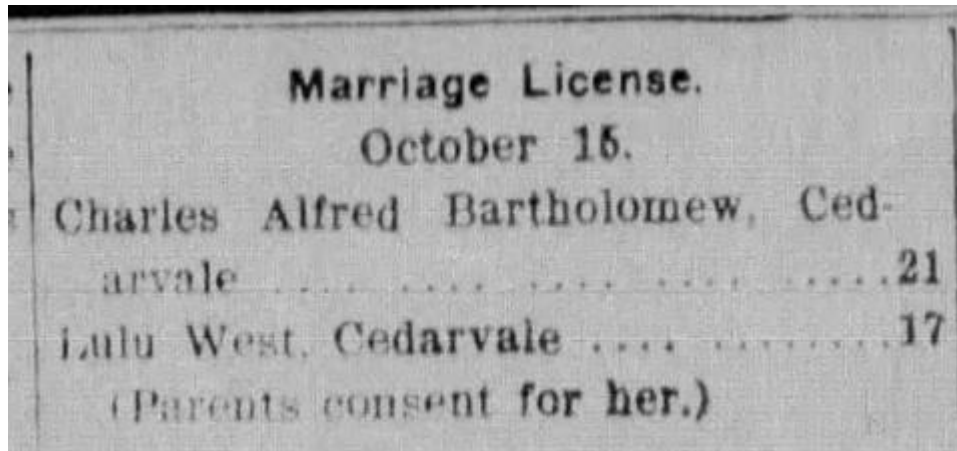

Charles Bartholomew Death is Investigated

The death of a 53-year-old Doyle resident, whose body was found Wednesday in his ransacked home, remains under investigation today by the Lassen County Sheriff's department.

While officers have declined to officially call the death of Charles Alfred Bartholomew a murder, Undersheriff Lino Callegari says the case is being investigated as a homicide.

The body was discovered by Bartholomew's son just after 4 p. m. when the younger man returned from a trip to Reno. Sheriff's deputies reported the house "had been messed up pretty good" and Bartholomew was found dead on the living room floor.

Cause of death was determined to be asphyxiation, according to an autopsy report. Callegari explained the man probably choked on blood in his trachea. The victim had two small skin

cuts near his chin and some bruises in the throat area.

Callegari said a time of death was not immediately available but the man had been dead for at least 12 hours.

No suspects had been arrested as of Friday morning, but officers say they are working several leads.

A 21-year-old hitchhiker was picked up near Ravendale Wednesday evening "because he was seen in Doyle at about 10 a. m." Callegari said.

"We just wanted to talk to him and we probably would have turned him loose right there, but he voluntarily returned to Susanville and said he wanted to cooperate with us," he said. "We were sure he wasn't a suspect."

The man spent the night in the county jail but was never booked, he only spent the night as a "sleeper" Callegari

emphasized. He has since been released.

"As part of our investigation we attempted to contact anyone who was in or near Doyle prior to the death," the undersheriff explained Thursday. "I think we've probably talked to about half the whole town."

No evidence of forced entry was found to the home, but Callegari noted each room had been ransacked. One rifle may have been taken.

Bartholomew, a retired watch repairman from Reno, had lived in the area "between six months and a year" according to the sheriff's office. His wife, Mary, was reportedly in a Bay Area hospital at the time of the death. Investigators from the California Department of Justice are assisting sheriff's officers with the investigation.

William R. Bartholomew died at St. Joseph's hospital in Denver, Sunday, January 11, where he had been for several weeks. He underwent four different operations for internal ulcers and grew rapidly weaker until the end came. His body was brought to Steamboat Springs on the train Monday.

Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist church in Steamboat Springs Wednesday afternoon with the full Masonic ritual. The Knights Templar were present in uniform. Rev. G. E. Kitchen was in charge of the church service. A mound of flowers covered the casket and floral pieces were placed on tables and along the chancel rail. Mrs. Clay Shaw, Mrs. Sam Stevens, Mrs. Claude Beverly, Mrs. H. O. Martin, Howard Saunders and J. M. Kellogg sang "Lead Kindly Light" at the opening of the service and "Rock of Ages" at the conclusion. Mrs. C. R. Towne played the piano accompaniment for the choir. A solo, "Above Blue Skies," was sung by B. G. Bradley with Mrs. Bradley at the piano. The solo was the favorite hymn of W. R. Bartholomew.

In his sermon Rev. Kitchen said that there were two outstanding factors in the life of Mr. Bartholomew, that he had made the decision to live the life of a Christian at an early age and that he always had a song in his heart. When a parent can leave to children a religious background of life he has left something more worth while than millions in gold, a heritage that will reach into eternity. W. R. Bartholomew had the spirit of song in his life, he was always singing when about his tasks, and when he was not singing he was whistling, bringing into his life cheerfulness and strength. He had melody in his soul. He had honesty and integrity in his dealing with others, elements in his character which entitled him to say that he had fought the good fight and kept the faith, said Mr. Kitchen.

The church was not large enough to accommodate the many people who came to pay the last tribute to the friend. They came from Oak Creek and all down the valley as far

as Hayden. Only a limited number could go to the cemetery because teams and sleds were used. But they came from all directions in cars to Steamboat Springs.

The pallbearers were Elmer Combs, Russell R. Baer, Charles Harwig, Dr. F. J. Blackmer, Claude Beverly and Jesse Mulkey. Interment was in the Steamboat cemetery where the final Masonic rites concluded the ceremony. The Steamboat stores were closed during the funeral service.

William Robert Bartholomew was born near Cedarville, Kan., August 21, 1875. He was the oldest son of C. P. T. and Lizzie A. Bartholomew.

His education was received in the schools of Kansas. He joined the Methodist Episcopal church when but a boy and remained a faithful member and an active worker in the church during his life. Especially did he enjoy the singing and for many years was a member of the choir. His love for music was evident throughout his life and he went about his daily tasks with a song on his lips. He sang because there was a song in his heart always.

His life was dedicated to the high principles of honesty and integrity, always square in his dealings and in his treatment of others.
