I., a sergeant in the 213th Aero Squadron; Adolph Bartolomeo, a corporal in the same squadron, whose home is at 64 Willow street, Long Island City, and Joseph G. Maystrick, a private, also attached to the same squadron, who lived at 20 Clark street, Long Island City, all three of whom were on the Tuscania.



No Word From Astoria Men.

No word has been received by the parents of Joseph G. Maystrick and Adolph Bartolomeo, two Astoria men who were members of the 213th Squadron. Maystrick, of 30 Clark street, is 35 years old, born in Bohemia, and coming here when 2 years old. He is the son of John Maystrick, a real estate agent, and was previously engaged as a vaudeville performer.

Bartolomeo, 32 years old, of 64 Willow street, was born in Italy, coming here with his father, Isaac, when a child.

The young men were chums, and they enlisted together on December 18. The last heard of them was three weeks ago, when their squadrons were stationed at Mineola.

Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo who was also a member of the 213th Aero Squadron was 23 years old, married and lived at 572 Steinway avenue with his young wife at the time he enlisted in last November. Since his entrance into the service his wife has broken up her home and she is now staying with her sister at 169 Edgecomb avenue. The His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Bartolomeo live at 61 Willow street. He was born in Astoria and was a skilled musician. He has frequently appeared in public entertainments in the Astoria and Steinway The members of Mrs. Barsections. tolomeo's family were compelled to take charge of her yesterday as she was suffering from a collapse as a result of the news of the catastrophe.

FRIENDS LOST ON TUSCANIA

Drowning of Bartolomeo and Maystrick Confirmed.

Long Island City, Feb. 19.—The family of Corp. Adolph Bartolomeo, 28, of 572 Tenth avenue, received official notice from Washington yesterday that he was drowned when the Tuscania was sunk by a German submarine on February 8. Bartolomeo was born in Italy but came to this country with his parents when only a small child. He was a piano tuner in the factory of Steinway & Sons, until his enlistment on December 18, when he was assigned to the 213th Aero Squadron, with which unit he was bound for France when drowned.

His chum, Joseph G. Maystrick, 35, of 30 Clark street, who enlisted in the aviation corps with him, was also drowned and his family has been notified that the body was recovered and buried in Scotland.

Only one of the three Long Island boys on the Tuscania with the 213th Squadron survived. He was Archie Tesseyman, of 508 Seventeenth avenue, whose rescue was announced several days after the sinking.

BARTOLOMEO LOST LIFE ON TUSC

Wise and Dreyer Only L. I. Men Unaccounted For.

Mrs. Adolph Bartolomeo of 572 Tenth avenue, Long Island City, has been officially notified by the War Department that her husband, Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo, was one of those who perished with other members of the 213th Aero Squadron, when the Tuscania was sunk by a submarine. Bartolomeo, 28 years old, was born in Italy and brought to this country when a small boy. He was a piano tuner in the factory of Steinway & Sons. He married ten months ago, and since his calistment his wife has been living with her parents in the Bronx. The soldier was the son of Isaac Bartolomeo of 64 Willow street, Long Island City. There are two brothers and four sisters.

Corporal Bartolomeo is the second Long Island City man whose death has been announced. Last week word was received that his chum, Joseph G. Maystrick, son of John Maystrick, of 30 Clark street Long Island City. had been buried in Scotland.

Announcement of the death of Bartolomeo leaves only two Long Island men on the Tuscania unaccounted for. No word has been received from Lawrence E. Wise Jr., 98 Eighth avenue, Woodside, L. I. a member of the 158th Aero Squadron, and Richard F. Dreyer, Sea Cliff, L. I., attached to the 213th Aero Squadron. The parents of Dreyer have abandoned hope.

Long Island City Youth, Drowned on Tuscania, First Elk to Die in Service.

City. Long Island Feb. memorial for Joseph G. Maystrick, of 30 Clark street, who was drowned when the Tuscania was sunk, was held by Queens Borough Lodge of Elks at the club house, 226 Nott avenue, last eve-The lodge room was crowded. Maystrick, a member of the 213th Aero Squadron, enlisted on December 18 last. with his chum, Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo, also drowned, when the ship was sunk by the submarine. Maystrick was the first Elk throughout the country to lose his life in the war.

Tribute to Scotch Girls Who Made American Flag for Tuscania's Dead

Justice L. B. Mitchell of Hart, Mich., has received word of the receipt in Islay, Scotland, of his tribute to the Scotch lassies who made the American flag for the burial service of the American soldiers who went down with the Tuscania and were buried on the Scottish coast. The day before the funeral these girls discovered that there was no American flag for the services. They instituted a search and finally found a silk handkerchief upon which was a small reproduction of Old Glory. Immediately they set to work and worked all night to make the starry banner. They finished it in time for the burial service and the Stars and Stripes were flaunted on the breeze beside the English flag over the graves of the Tuscania victims at Islay. Four Brooklyn and Long Island boys are buried at Islay. They are Adolph Bartolomeo of 572 Steinway avenue, Long Island City; Joseph G. Maystuck of 36 Clark street, Astoria; Ruben Cohen of 198 Christopher avenue, Brooklyn, and Richard P. Dreyer of Sea Cliff, L. L. Justice Mitchell's tribute is paid in


