I., a sergeant in the 213th Aero Squadron; Adolph Bartolomeo, a corporal in the same squadron, whose home is at 64 Willow street, Long Island City, and Joseph G. Maysirick, a private, also attached to the same squadron, who lived at 20 Clark street, Long Island City, all three of whom were on the Tuscania.

### No Word From Astoria Men.

No word has been received by the parents of Joseph G. Maystrick and Adolph Bartolomeo, two Astoria men who were members of the 213th Squadron. Maystrick, of 30 Clark street, is 35 years old, born in Bohemia, and coming here when 2 years old. He is the son of John Maystrick, a real estate agent, and was previously engaged as a vaudeville performer.

Bartolomeo, 32 years old, of 64 Willow street, was born in Italy, coming here with his father, Isaac, when a child.

The young men were chums, and they enlisted together on December 18. The last heard of them was three weeks ago, when their squadrons were stationed at Mineola.

Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo who was also a member of the 213th Aero Squadron was 23 years old, married and lived at 572 Steinway avenue with his young wife at the time he enlisted in last November. Since his entrance into the service his wife has broken up her home and she is now staying with her sister at 169 Edgecomb avenue, The Bronx. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Bartolomeo live at 61 Willow street. He was born in Astoria and was a skilled musician. He has frequently appeared in public entertainments in the Astoria and Steinway sections. The members of Mrs. Bartolomeo's family were compelled to take charge of her yesterday as she was suffering from a collapse as a result of the news of the catastrophe.

# FRIENDS LOST ON TUSCANIA

## Drowning of Bartolomeo and Maystrick Confirmed.

Long Island City, Feb. 19.—The family of Corp. Adolph Bartolomeo, 28, of 572 Tenth avenue, received official notice from Washington yesterday that he was drowned when the Tuscania was sunk by a German submarine on February 8. Bartolomeo was born in Italy but came to this country with his parents when only a small child. He was a piano tuner in the factory of Steinway & Sons, until his enlistment on December 18, when he was assigned to the 213th Aero Squadron, with which unit he was bound for France when drowned.

His chum, Joseph G. Maystrick, 35, of 30 Clark street, who enlisted in the aviation corps with him, was also drowned and his family has been notified that the body was recovered and buried in Scotland.

Only one of the three Long Island boys on the Tuscania with the 213th Squadron survived. He was Archie Tesseyman, of 508 Seventeenth avenue, whose rescue was announced several days after the sinking.

# BARTOLOMEO LOST LIFE ON TUSCANIA

Wise and Dreyer Only L. I. Men  
Unaccounted For.

Mrs. Adolph Bartolomeo of 572 Tenth avenue, Long Island City, has been officially notified by the War Department that her husband, Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo, was one of those who perished with other members of the 213th Aero Squadron, when the Tuscania was sunk by a submarine. Bartolomeo, 28 years old, was born in Italy and brought to this country when a small boy. He was a piano tuner in the factory of Steinway & Sons. He married ten months ago, and since his enlistment his wife has been living with her parents in the Bronx. The soldier was the son of Isaac Bartolomeo of 64 Willow street, Long Island City. There are two brothers and four sisters.

Corporal Bartolomeo is the second Long Island City man whose death has been announced. Last week word was received that his chum, Joseph G. Maystrick, son of John Maystrick, of 30 Clark street, Long Island City, had been buried in Scotland.

Announcement of the death of Bartolomeo leaves only two Long Island men on the Tuscania unaccounted for. No word has been received from Lawrence E. Wise Jr., 98 Eighth avenue, Woodside, L. I., a member of the 158th Aero Squadron, and Richard F. Dreyer, Sea Cliff, L. I., attached to the 213th Aero Squadron. The parents of Dreyer have abandoned hope.

## Services for J. G. Maystrick.

Long Island City Youth, Drowned on  
Tuscania, First Elk to Die  
in Service.

Long Island City, Feb. 25.—A memorial for Joseph G. Maystrick, of 30 Clark street, who was drowned when the Tuscania was sunk, was held by Queens Borough Lodge of Elks at the club house, 226 Nott avenue, last evening. The lodge room was crowded. Maystrick, a member of the 213th Aero Squadron, enlisted on December 18 last, with his chum, Corporal Adolph Bartolomeo, also drowned, when the ship was sunk by the submarine. Maystrick was the first Elk throughout the country to lose his life in the war.

Past Exalted Ruler William T. Phillips,\* of New York Lodge, made the address of the evening. The music was supplied by the Opera Quartet. All of the stations for the service were occupied by past exalted rulers of the Queens Lodge as follows: Exalted Ruler, Henry W. Sharkey; leading knight, Dr. Lester G. Brimmer; loyal knight, Bernard M. Timoney; lecturing knight, Curtis Holt; inner guard, Samuel Serena, and esquire, John A. Gray. Herbert C. O'Neill was chaplain.

## Tribute to Scotch Girls Who Made American Flag for Tuscania's Dead

Justice L. B. Mitchell of Hart, Mich., has received word of the receipt in Islay, Scotland, of his tribute to the Scotch lassies who made the American flag for the burial service of the American soldiers who went down with the Tuscania and were buried on the Scottish coast. The day before the funeral these girls discovered that there was no American flag for the services. They instituted a search and finally found a silk handkerchief upon which was a small reproduction of Old Glory. Immediately they set to work and worked all night to make the starry banner. They finished it in time for the burial service and the Stars and Stripes were flaunted on the breeze beside the English flag over the graves of the Tuscania victims at Islay. Four Brooklyn and Long Island boys are buried at Islay. They are Adolph Bartolomeo of 572 Steinway avenue, Long Island City; Joseph G. Maystuck of 30 Clark street, Astoria; Ruben Cohen of 199 Christopher avenue, Brooklyn, and Richard F. Dreyer of Sea Cliff, L. I.

Justice Mitchell's tribute is paid in the following verses to the Girls Who Made the Flag:

As the sea gave up its prey  
To the rock-bound Scotland shore,  
As the dread war's victims lay  
Where the wild wave requiem's  
roar,  
To the villagers near by—  
May be in some little dale—  
Came the stern reality  
Of a grim war's dreadful tale.

And on this distant, barren shore,  
They were buried in the sands,  
Where the cliffs will evermore

Mark their shrines while Scotland  
stands.

Few the coffins timber made,  
But with all that might enshroud,  
These few villagers essayed,  
As to Freedom's call, they bowed.

But there was no flag to show  
In the bleak and dreary scene  
That might o'er the ocean go—  
That one witness that would mean  
That old Scotland's very soul  
Saw the colors in its air,  
That should o'er the dead unfold,  
And sweet tribute to them bear.

And a flag, though e'er so small  
'Mong them all could not be found;  
"O, there must be, to us all  
This is freedom's rite profound;"  
But at last, found 'mong our men  
Was a handkerchief o'erspread  
With the colors, giving them  
That for which their hearts so pled.

And those girls—immortelles  
'Mong the flowers of Scotland's  
pride

Though of those quaint villages  
Where the plainer folks reside,  
All night long their vigils kept  
And with matchless tact and art  
Made the flag while others slept  
That's so dear to freedom's heart.

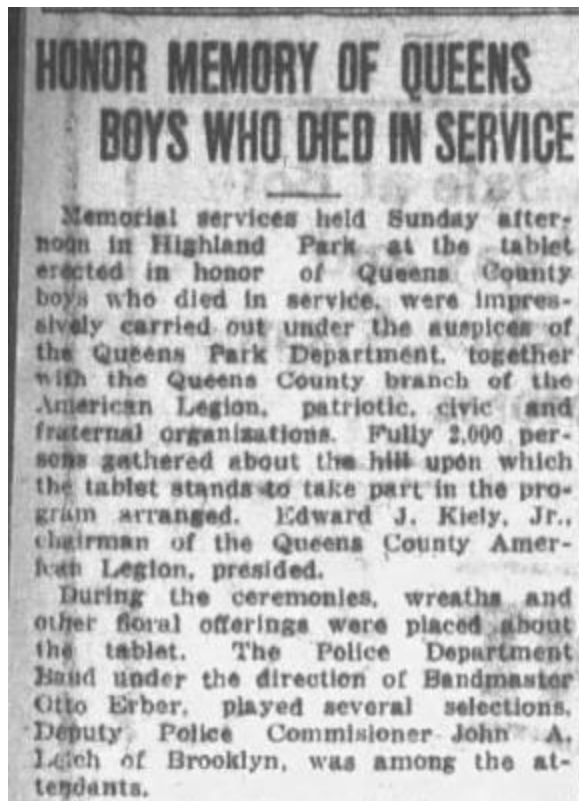
And on that rocky Scotland shore



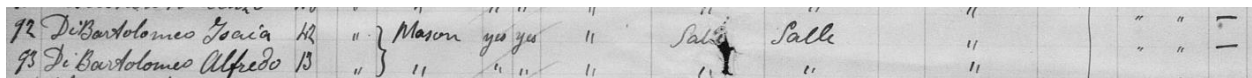

Her mother was born 21 Apr 1859 in Italy & died 13 Mar 1945 in Bronx NY. She is buried in Evergreen Cemetery, but there are several to choose from.

Marie was age 18 when she married Adolph.

Nine months after Adolph's death, Marie married Russell Philip Treible, son of Austin Treible & Louise Ruster, on 19 Nov 1918 in Manhattan NY. Her husband was born 24 Oct 1893 PA & died 13 Jan 1985, F: 153078414.

In the 1900 census for Manhattan NY, residing at 402 W. 44<sup>th</sup> St., was Angelo CAMMARATA (indexed as Cammarak), age 47, b. Jun 1852 in Italy, a shoe maker. He said he had

emigrated in 1883 & was in the US for 17 years. He & his wife had been married 23 years. With Angelo were his wife Vincenzia (42 Italy, b. Jan 1857, parents b. Italy, in the US for 17 years, an alien), who had given birth to 8 children, 5 of whom were living. In the household were Michael (18 Italy, Jun 1881, a barber), Chas. (9 NY, Sep 1890, at school), Mary (9 NY, Feb 1890, at school), Nellie (4 NY, May 1896) & Rosie (2 NY, May 1898). "Rosie" appears to be Marie Agnes.

In the 1910 census of Manhattan NY, Angelo COMMARATA (55 Italy, a laborer) lived on 44<sup>th</sup> St. with wife Francis (50 Italy) & children Mary V. or N. (18 NY, a dressmaker), Natalie (14 NY) & Mary A. (11 NY). The couple had been married 29 years, the 1<sup>st</sup> marriage for both. Francis had given birth to 9 children, 4 of whom were living. This census was conducted 27 Apr 1910; her father died 27 Sep 1910.

In the 1915 NY state census, residing at 365 W. 50<sup>th</sup> in NY, NY were Frances COMERATA (57 Italy, in the US for 35 years, an alien, doing housework) & her 2 daughters: Natlie (19 US, a citizen, stenographer) & Marie A. (17 US, a citizen, stenographer).

In the 1920 census for Dover, Morris NJ, Russell "Tieble" (26 PA, parents b. PA, a carpenter) lived with wife Marie (21 NY, parents b. Italy). This census was conducted 29 Jan 1920. They had 2 children, Frances Dorothy Treible (1920-1999) & Russell E. Treible (1922-2008). Frances became the wife of Hamilton Albert Bowker (1915-1981).

In the 1930 census for Mine Hill, Morris NJ, Russell P. Treible (36 PA, parents b. PA, a carpenter, building) lived at 93 Hillside Ave. with wife Marie A. (31 NY, parents b. Italy), daughter Frances D. (9 NJ) & son Russell E. (8 NJ). He reported his 1<sup>st</sup> marriage occurred when he was 25 years old; Marie said her 1<sup>st</sup> marriage occurred when she was age 18.

In the 1940 census for Morris township, Morris Co. NJ, Russell "Trieble" (46 PA, employed in weather stripping in building construction) lived at 90 Fairchild Ave. with wife Marie (41 NY) & daughter Frances (20 NJ, treasurer for a textile store) & son Russell (18 NJ, a new worker).

In the 1950 census for Morris Plains, Morris NJ, Russell P. Treible (57 PA, a weather stripper at a weather stripping company) lived at 22 Jazin Ave. with wife Marie A. Treible (51 NY, parents b. Italy) who was keeping house & son Russell E. Treible, 28 NJ, never married, who was a fabric salesman at a retail department store.

Listed with the maiden name of Commarta, Mary Agnes Treible is buried in Restland Memorial Park, East Hanover, Morris NJ.
